After the discussion motions were made that the following changes be made —

1 - To change the wording of the membership clause to read as follows —
"The membership of this club shall consist of history majors and minors whose names the membership committee

may have approved after a conference with the head of the history department and such others as the head of the history department may invite to become members.

- 2- To change sentence regarding special committees to read thus - "Committees for a special purpose may be appointed at any time.
3. To change wording of initiation clause to allow members to become active as soon as they are accepted by the membership committee and the head of the department.
- 4- To Strike out Clause 2, Section I of by-laws dealing with a special time for initiation and insert one saying that the time of initiation shall be left to the discretion of the club but that all members shall be initiated at some-time.
5. To insert a clause concerning dues saying that the amount stated may be changed by a majority vote of members present after notice has been served at preceding meeting.

A motion was then made to accept the constitution. It carried with only two dissenting votes - those of John Thomas and Arwin Upton Jr.

Mr. Thomas Rinnick was accepted as a member of the club.

There followed a short discussion of the program to be given by the History Club in Chapel Feb. 22. No definite action was taken.
