**TITLE:** A SOCIOLOGICAL EVALUATION ON E-GOVERNMENT AND CITIZENSHIP RELATION: IN AYDIN

### **ABSTRACT**

Communication technologies have become an inseparable part of daily life advancing expeditious especially after the last quarter of the 20th century. In consequence of development and spreading widely of computer networks and technologies, boundaries of time and place have been highly compelled and communication of people with each other has become easier going beyond the global dimension.
