

Adolescent and Young Adult Oncology Patient and Provider Perspectives in Philadelphia (AYA-4P)

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Intro

- There were 89,500 new cancer diagnoses in adolescents and young adults (AYA) in 2020
- The SKCC does not have a formal AYA oncology program
- Many programs are designed without patient input

Methods

- One-time survey of AYA patients who have received cancer care within the SKCC catchment area
- One-time survey of oncology physicians and advanced care providers at the SKCC

Primary Objectives

- To assess the current perspective of AYA patients regarding medical services and psychosocial support delivered to AYAs in Philadelphia
- To assess the current knowledge and perspective of healthcare providers at the SKCC about the care and services needed by AYA patients



We have developed a unique needs assessment survey for patients and providers. The results will be used to inform the development of a patient-centered AYA cancer program at the SKCC









Patient Survey
