Camille Loccisano, "Frankie's Mission"

This is a profile piece (right) I created for an Honors Independent Research project. Pace's Pforzheimer Honors College granted me \$1,000 to conduct research in my field of study.

Between fall 2010 and spring 2011, I interned with CNN Heroes, a program which creates profile pieces on "everyday people changing the world." During my internship I conducted a ton of research and third party interviews. I was able to help in all facets of the production process from pre-production to post-production. After my internship, I wanted to see if I could create my own profile

I spent the summer of 2011 researching New York local hometown heroes. I came across some stories that would work and others that would not. I finally found Camille Loccisano, founder of "Frankie's Mission," a non-profit based in Brooklyn which gives grants to families with children battling pediatric cancer. I loved the story and pursued it with success.

The six-month project ensued with great results. The foundation was granted a donation bar on YouTube and was awarded \$5,000 from Toyota for a fundraising event.
