PubChem

This database is provided by the National Library of Medicine and the National Center for Biotechnology Information.

PubChem provides information on the biological activities of small molecules. It is a component of NIH's Molecular Libraries Roadmap Initiative and includes substance information, compound structures, and bioactivity data in three primary databases: PCSubstance, PCCompound, and PCBioAssay. PCSubstance contains more than 15 million substance records; PCCompound contains more than 10 million unique structures; and PCBioAssay contains more than 300 bioassays.

PubMed®

Thursday, January 18, 2007 8:30am to 5:00pm

This full-day class is designed to teach students how to use PubMed, which includes MEDLINE citations. The class also includes an overview of the Medical Subject Headings (MeSH) and its importance as a tool to both searchers and indexers. Class attendees are awarded 7.5 MLA continuing education credits.

TOXNET®

Friday, January 19, 2007 9:00am to 4:00pm

This full-day class is designed to convey the basics of searching the NLM's TOXNET, a Web-based system of databases in the areas of toxicology, environmental health, and related subjects. Students learn the content and structure of files covering toxicology data, toxicology literature, toxic releases, and chemical searching and nomenclature. Among the databases highlighted will be TOXLINE, the Hazardous Substances Data Bank, the Integrated Risk Information System, the Toxic Release Inventory, and ChemIDplus.

Class attendees are awarded 6 MLA continuing education credits.
