We are pleased to arrounce that the Houston Academy of Medicine—Texas Medical Center (HAM—TMC) Library has retained the Regional Medical Library designation in the National Network of Libraries of Medicine for the South Central Region (NN/IM SCR). The five year contract was awarded on May 1, 2001 and will end on April 30, 2006. The program consists of 5 basic areas: Network development and document delivery, outreach to health professionals and special populations, consumer health,

technology, and education. Evaluation of the NN/IM SCR programs and services, as well as those developed and provided by subcontractors, will be an integral component in this contract.

An additional outreach coordinator position has been added to this contract, which will focus on outreach to special populations to include, but not limited to, Hispanics, African — Americans, Native American/American Indians and the HIV/AIDS community. Outreach to special populations will be a major focus of the contract. Many of the publications produced by the NN/IM SCR and its outreach subcontractors will be translated by a team of Spanish-speaking translators and placed on the NN/IM SCR web site to meet the growing need for Spanish-language health information resources. Outreach will also target specified health professional groups each year, to include public health professionals, specific allied health groups, nurses, veterinarians, dentists, and alternative medicine practitioners.

A number of awards and equipment opportunities will be made available to Network members. These include access to electronic consumer health information, access to information for the public health community, technology awareness conferences, library improvement projects, and Internet correctivity projects.

The NN/IM SCR has a Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) that serves in an advisory capacity to the staff in identifying regional needs, populations, and existing programs throughout the region, and in providing feedback and evaluating programs and services. Kathy Hoffman, MLS, Director, UT MD Anderson Cancer Center Research Medical Library, Houston TX, will serve as the NN/IM SCR RAC Chair, 2001 – 2003.

About half the titles were requested by faculty, physicians, staff and students from within the Texas Medical Center. Whenever possible we have sought to honor these requests, deciding against requests only when they were clearly outside the scope of our collection. Likewise, we also turned down requests for titles already held by one of the members of the Texas Health Science Libraries Consortium, which include the libraries of the UT Medical Branch in Calveston, the UT MD Anderson Cancer Center, the UT Houston School of Public Health, the UT Houston Psychiatry Branch, and the UT Houston Dental Branch.

The other titles were suggested by members of the HAW-TMC Library staff based on information we have received regarding new titles, as well as our day to day interactions with clients at the reference desk and in the Interlibrary Loan of fice. All titles were reviewed by members of the Library's professional staff, who nated each title regarding its perceived relevance / usefulness. Only highly rated staff suppostions were included.

Whenever possible we will be purchasing electronic access along with the print title. For the most part we will be purchasing volumes for the current year forward. At this point we do not intend to purchase back volumes for titles unless the titles have started within the past two years.

The HAM-TMC Library receives purchase requests for books and journals on a regular basis. In most cases book purchase requests are processed right away, provided that the requested title is within the scope of the Library's collections.

Journal titles are different, in that unlike book purchases they tend to be significantly more expensive. Likewise, they represent an angoing commitment of Library funds, whereas most book requests are one-time purchases. Consequently, requests for journal titles need to be evaluated *en masse* once or twice a year. The titles currently being ordered are the first to have been subjected to a comprehensive review by Library staff. We will be reviewing titles again at the end of the current calendar year and every six months thereafter.
