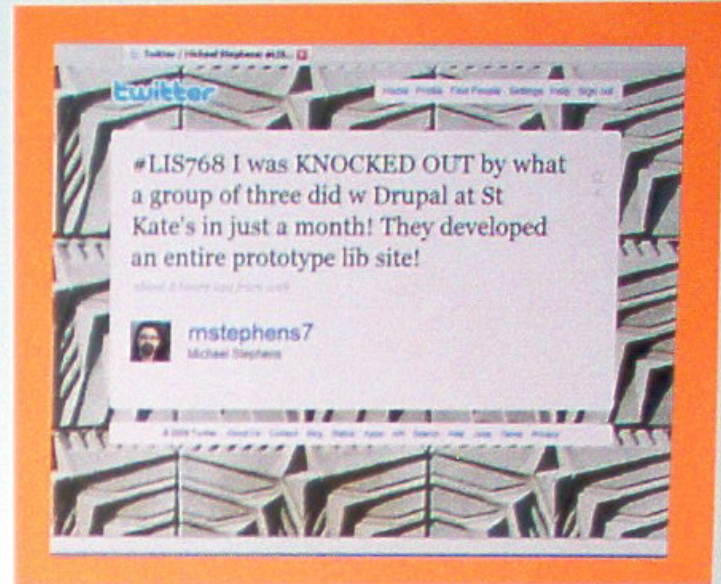

So, umm, you guys? Drupal is awesome, and I should not run my mouth about what can and cannot be done before exploring.

Guess what! Users can create their own blogs! They just need to have accounts. So now when anyone is signed in (admin or not) they'll get options in the top left to see their blogs (which I'm calling their book reviews), and I enabled a block that displays recent blog posts (again, labeled book reviews). Check it out, it's total sweetness. This IS a social library website.

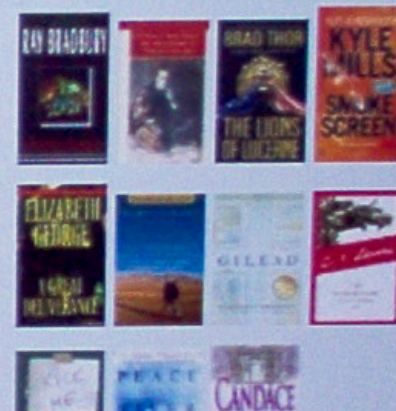
