Results of Sustainability Planning Process

- Articulated vision of what sustainability means and what Macalester wants to accomplish in the next 2-3 years
- Articulated short and long term priorities
- Increase support and buy-in from the Macalester community
- Increased capacity of Macalester staff and student volunteers to design and facilitate participatory processes
- Alignment of student and other projects with important sustainability efforts at Macalester
- Climate neutrality planning and commitments integrated into other sustainability plans and efforts
- Satisfy planning requirements for Presidents Climate Commitment.

Senior Administration Team:

The main role of the Senior Administration Team is to help position the project for success. This team helps develop opportunities and resources to support the process. It helps align the process with strategic efforts and priorities within Macalester. The Senior Administration Team represents the multiple critical perspectives needed to lead the process into successful implementation. This Team helps craft a process they have confidence in and can champion, to allow the Planning Team the opportunity to do its work. In addition, this team is the primary liaison to the Board of Trustees.

Planning Team:

The Planning Team is responsible for implementing the planning processes. While the Senior Administration Team focuses on the process ensuring that it aligns with other efforts at the college, the Planning Team's focus is on the content of planning. The Planning Team is composed of many of the same people who will actually implement the plan.

As the Planning Team enters the Implementation Phase, the Office of Sustainability **Advisory Committee** emerges to coordinate and lead Implementation. In the beginning of the process the Advisory Committee meets to constitute itself and to prepare to host the planning process. The Advisory Committee are the internal and long-term champions of the work.
