


Set up an OpenURL resolver... Concordia uses SFX (ExLibris) and 360 Linker (ProQuest) Process to set up OpenURL resolver for communication: • Locate item (collection, package, journal, etc.) • Identify provider / vendor • Turn on access to the package or collection • Make sure content within the collection


