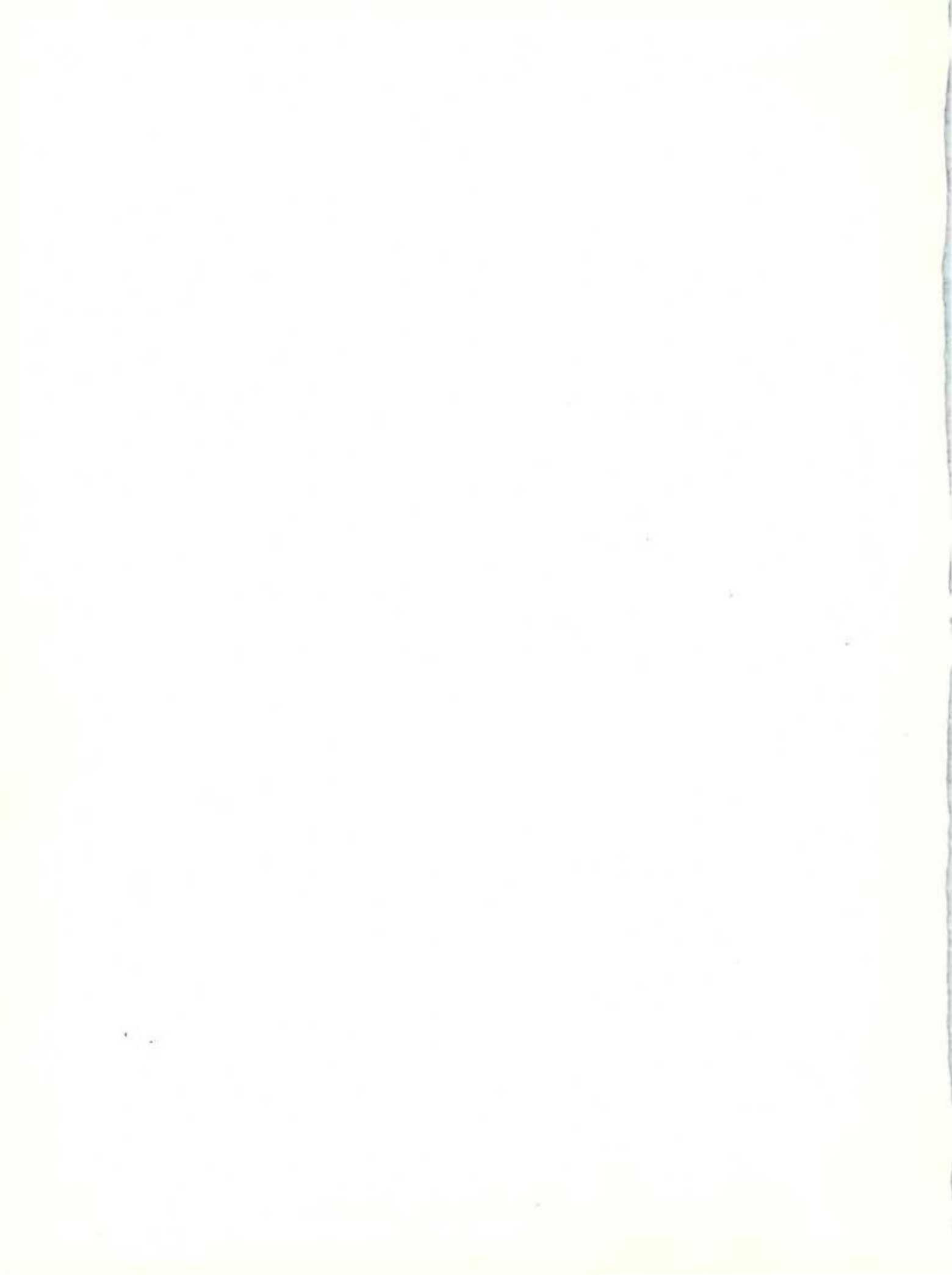

### Herbert E. Cohn, M.D.

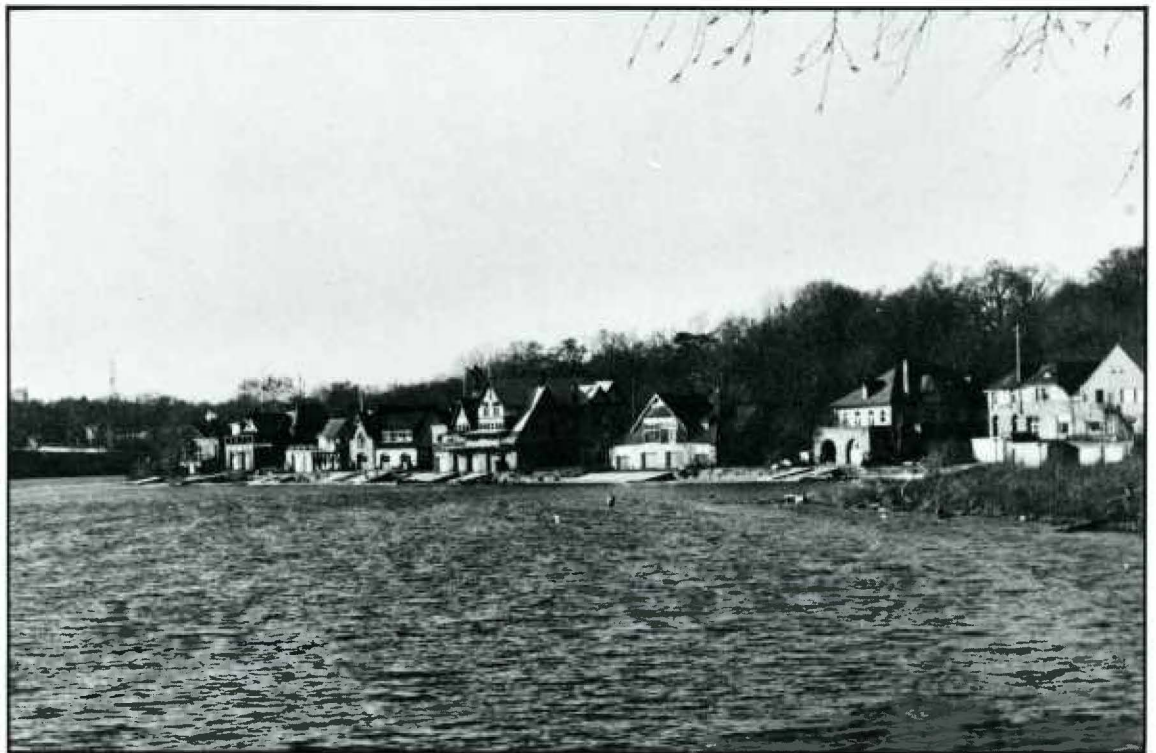
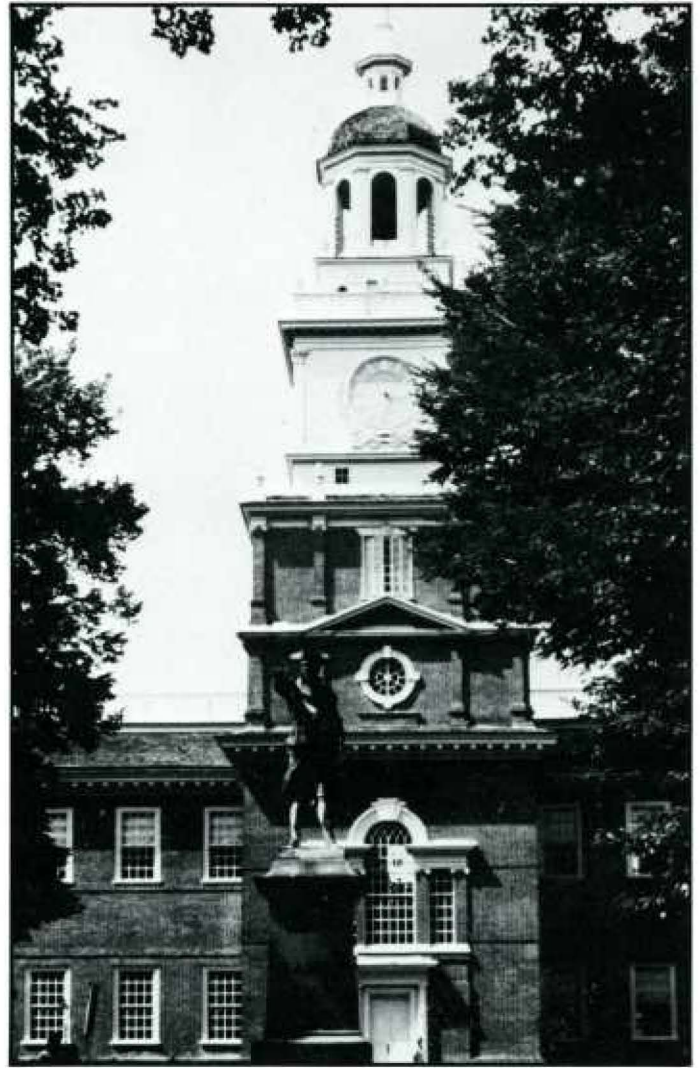

## **CARLA ELISABETH GOEPP, M.D. SENIOR CLASS PORTRAIT**

As a reflection of the class's respect and admiration, Dr. Carla Elisabeth Goepp has been selected as the subject for this year's senior class portrait. Wanting to know more about the person who had introduced us to clinical medicine, we met with her over roast beef sandwiches in the atrium of the New Hospital. What follows is a transcript of our most enjoyable and enlightening conversation.

Dr. Goepp was born in Philadelphia on October 6, 1939. In 1960, she graduated from the College of New Rochelle with an A.B. and received her M.D. in 1964 from Georgetown University Medical School. She proceeded to Jefferson to do a straight medical internship and internal medicine residency, but sandwiched a two-year fellowship in Oncology and Cytogenetics at the National Cancer Institute in between. Returning to Philadelphia, Dr. Goepp was Chief Medical Resident of the Jefferson Medical Service at PGH. She currently holds the titles of Coordinator of Introduction to Clinical Medicine in the freshman and sophomore years, and Clinical Associate Professor of Medicine in the Department of Medicine, Divisions of Oncology and Genetics at Jefferson. She is certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine and is a diplomate in the subspecialty of Oncology, as well as a fellow of the American College of Physicians. Dr. Goepp has authored or co-authored several papers in the fields of oncology and genetics. This is actually the second time Dr. Goepp has been recognized as an outstanding professor and indi-

vidual by the students of Jefferson. In 1976 Dr. Goepp received the Christian R. and Mary F. Lindback Award for Distinguished Teaching at Jefferson.

YB: Dr. Goepp, congratulations on being selected by the class of 1981 to have your portrait painted. How does that feel?

Dr. G: I'm honored, and to be quite honest, flattered, to have been chosen by your class. It's very meaningful to me, especially in light of the fact that (and you probably don't know this) my grandfather also taught here at Jefferson. It's especially gratifying to have been selected after the many hours we all spent in ICM. As you know, that's a course where there is not only teaching on the didactic level, but also teaching of attitudes. Although it may be possible to teach some of the essentials of a patient interview by interviewing a patient in front of 200 plus people, it is difficult to convey the proper attitudes in the same manner. I knew it was frustrating for the class at times. There were many criticisms which I think I took honestly as criticisms.

YB: But there were also times that those criticisms came directly from an emotional level rather than a well-reasoned one.

Dr. G: That was good, because it showed me that you were all human beings. I know it was difficult at times from the student vantage point. I had the big picture in front of me; in the overall process, it made sense. Sometimes your class

was exposed to little vignettes here and there. If one thing did not seem to fit, there would be some criticism. I'm glad you could trust me with that criticism. Yet overall, I got the feeling from your class that you could understand that there was a larger scale into which everything fit. One of my greatest joys is that your class is the first to go through the entire course as it was ideally planned.

YB: Is this honor any more special because you're the first woman to have a portrait?

Dr. G: Perhaps. It shouldn't be, but it is. As you know, Jefferson was the last school to admit women. As a matter of fact, I could not have been accepted to Jefferson. By the time I graduated from my medical school, Jefferson had not yet graduated any women. I was the first woman to go through Jefferson's medical residency from a straight medical internship. It was difficult at times because of the scrutiny throughout residency and fellowship training. It has become better, however; now many more women are here to extend the physician image. There are still times, though, when I'll go into a patient's room and he or she will say, "Oh, are you the social worker?" or "Nurse, will you reach under the bed and get my slippers." It doesn't bother me — I still reach for those slippers. I feel that I'm a doctor who happens to be a woman, rather than a woman who is a doctor.

YB: What are some of the things you like to do when you're not doing medicine?



Dr. G: Well, I like to fish, especially for rainbow trout and small-mouth bass.

YB: You do!

Dr. G: Yes. I enjoy fishing. I had an uncle whose son died of leukemia at an early age. After that I became a replacement for his son, and he would take me fishing. As a matter of fact, if you read anything in the history of angling, you'll find that many of the early fishermen were women, prioresses of abbeys who learned about fishing from necessity. I enjoy being a "fisher-person". I also was a ballet dancer when I was younger. Now I just appreciate it. I do needlepoint as well, and really enjoy that, too.

YB: Well, then, you certainly fit in with the other women in the class!

Dr. G: There were many times I was tempted to bring my needlepoint to classes. As you know, I would try to be at all lectures, and many times I would sit there and wish I'd brought along my needlepoint because I really could have gotten a lot done. I also like to sew, and I really enjoy baking. Medicine is a very time-consuming field, as you all have learned. One of the obvious joys your class shares is the appreciation of many varied interests in the group. You all try very, very hard to pursue a life outside of medicine. I think that's very important because it makes you so much better rounded and able to communicate with patients. I've seen people who come in, concentrate on medicine alone, and end up with a very myopic view of the world. This is a loss for them as individuals. Physicians especially need a broad appreciation of life because this allows the opportunity to be well-balanced and stay healthy.

YB: What do you think of the class of 1981?

Dr. G: It is a very special class. It is remarkable to me that this group of individuals has come together so well and functions as a real unit. I've relished the good humor of your class. I must admit that I was very surprised and amused at the way I was depicted during your freshman show. I had expected to see someone do a take-off on me as the wicked witch of the North; but what you did as Charlie was done well, full of humor and excellently thought out.

YB: I remember that the day we saw you after the Follies, you did something quite funny, also.

Dr. G: Well, I felt I had to acknowledge the marvelous performance that you all did. It's good to be funny, but it's nice for creative performances to be noticed, too. I felt I had to let the class know that I had noticed, appreciated and enjoyed the special Charlie skit. I first learned to write my name backwards in a physics class in college. I had quite a charming, but boring, professor. In order to keep myself occupied, I would try to write things backwards or upside down. I finally got a chance to use that talent!

YB: When our class gets together for the 20th reunion, and we're all standing around looking at your portrait, how would you like to be remembered?

Dr. G: That's very difficult to say. How would I like to be remembered? . . . I think I would like to be remembered as a caring someone who was there as a part of your lives throughout your years here. I don't want to be someone who just walked into your life at one moment, your freshman year, and then was gone the next, or someone you just happened to meet on an elective your senior year. I'd like to be remembered as an everyday part of your lives.

YB: Any advice for the class of 1981?

Dr. G: Hopefully each and every one of you is going to be the best doctor you can be. You all are. Just remember to keep your minds open. I remember when I was in training, many doctors would treat angina by crushing up nitroglycerin tablets and placing the paste on a patient's chest. Whenever we would get one of these patients in the ER, we'd say, "Tee Hee, Ha Ha, another LMD from the sticks". And now placing nitropaste on the skin is one of the mainstays in the treatment of angina. A lot of what I've told you may be wrong someday. Be tolerant of criticism and new ideas. The facts you have been given must be kept in a flexible perspective. Your education remains fluid and continues daily. Remember also to keep and nurture your good humor. It will sustain the joy of your daily lives and permit the incongruities of life to enrich your clinical judgment.

# Chestnut Hill Hospital

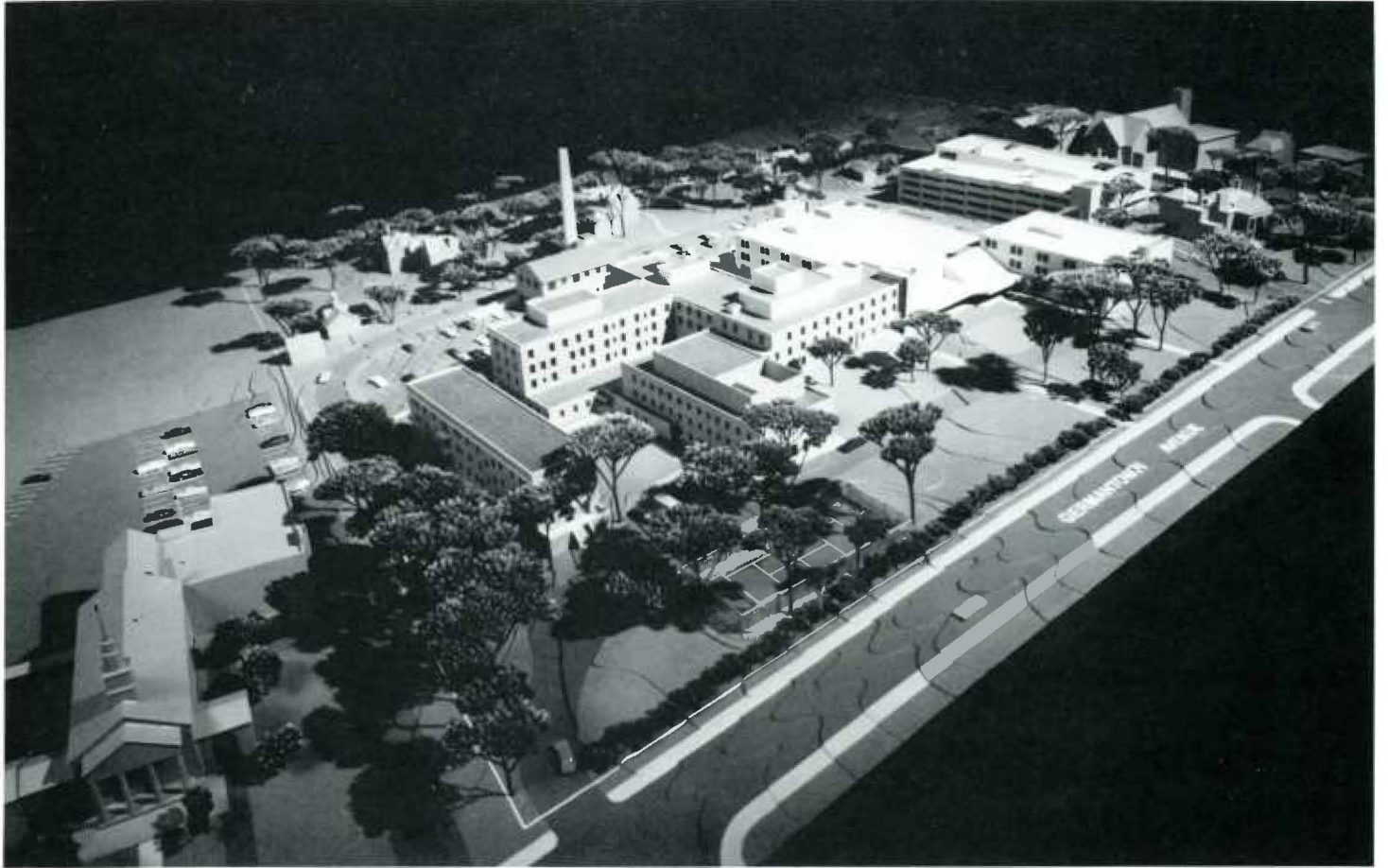
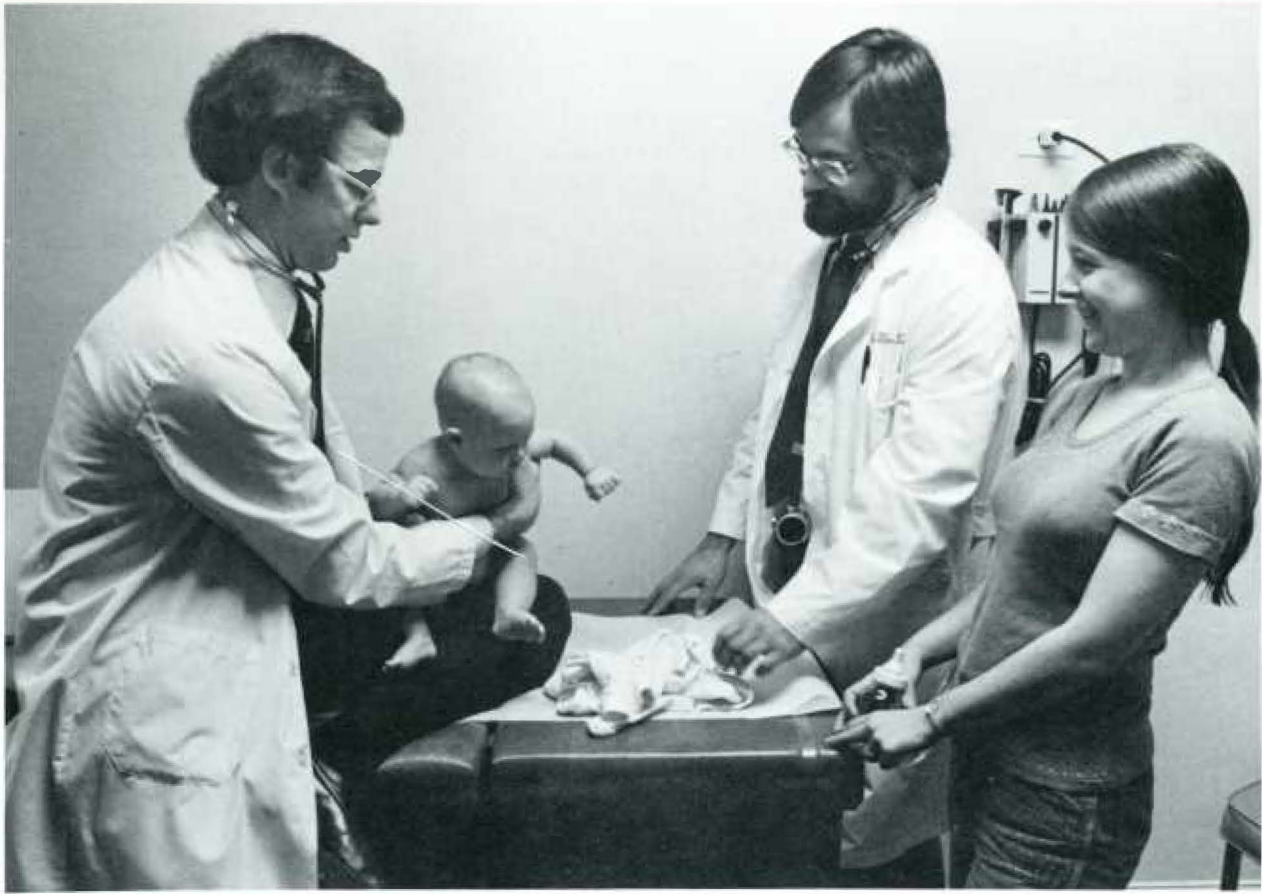
Chestnut Hill Hospital is proud of its affiliation with Jefferson Medical College. This affiliation began twenty years ago in the field of surgery, beginning as a rotation for students for their surgical training. The affiliation was subsequently approved by the Joint Commission for Residency Training. Since its inception, more than one hundred surgical residents and over five hundred students have received surgical training at Chestnut Hill Hospital.

In addition to the surgical affiliation, student rotations in Family Medicine were initiated in 1974 as part of the affiliation with the Family Medicine Residency Program. Currently, the Family Medicine Program at Chestnut Hill Hospital provides rotation for 32 junior and 8 senior medical students from Jefferson Medical College each year. Chestnut Hill Hospital also has an approved three year residency in Family Medicine. There are a total of 12 residents with 4 first-year residents appointed each year. Five appointments are made each year in the flexible first-year's graduate program which is sponsored by the Family Medicine Residency at Chestnut Hill Hospital and the Ophthalmologic Residency at Jefferson.

Although Chestnut Hill Hospital is within the city limits, it serves both northwest Philadelphia and the adjacent Montgomery County suburbs. It is uniquely able to provide an opportunity for the medical student and the resident to participate in the practice of medicine and surgery at the community hospital level.

The hospital's modernization program consists of a new nursing wing with 68 replacement beds; an Outpatient and Ancillary Services Center; a new Medical Office Building; a 421 car parking garage; and extensive renovations to the existing building. Chestnut Hill is taking every possible step to guarantee it will continue to be a hospital where the physicians and staff can provide the finest health care and can support outstanding medical education programs.





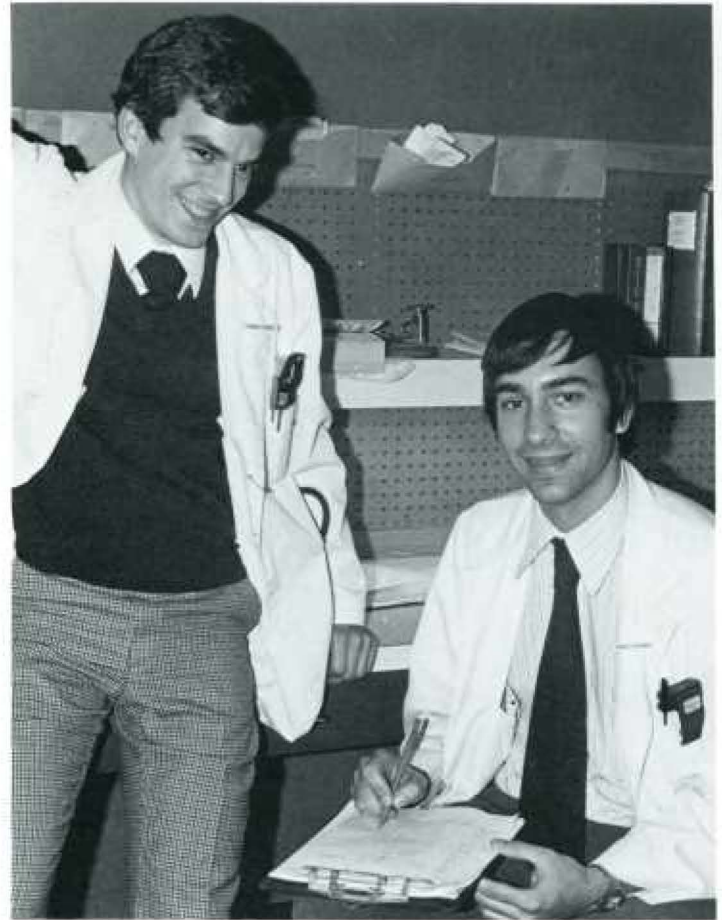


# The Lankenau Hospital

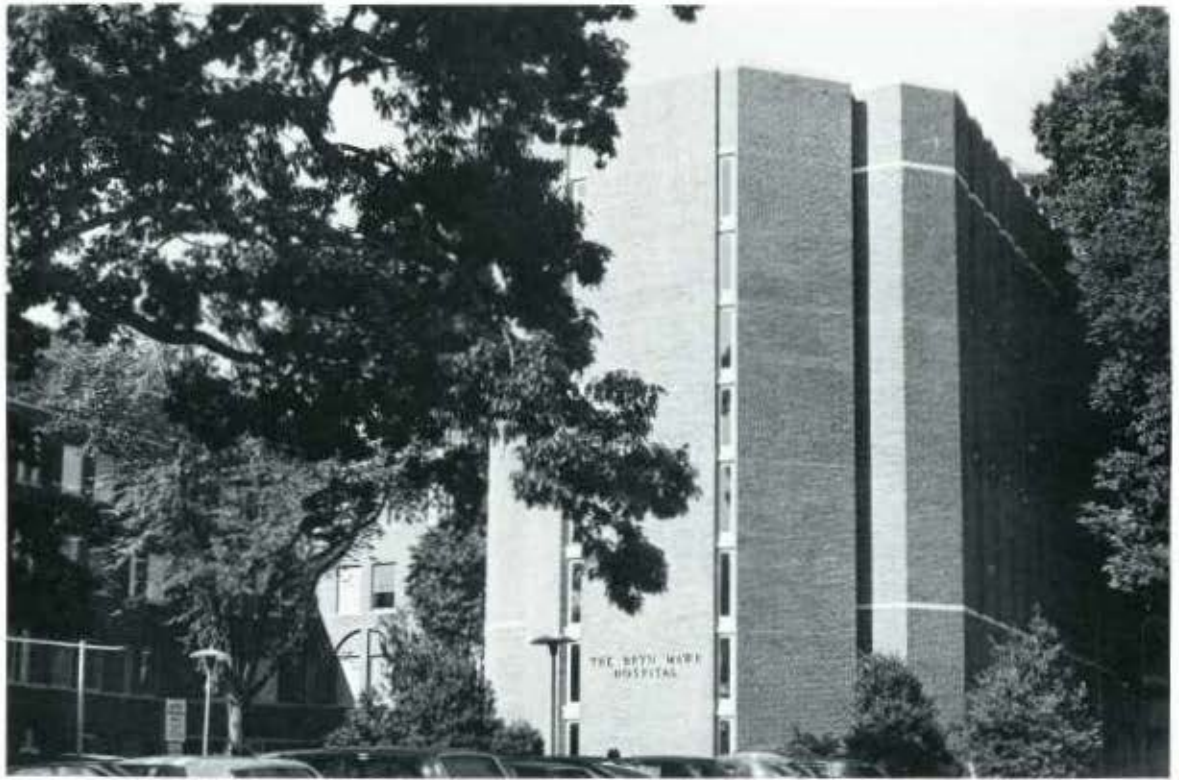
During the past year, Lankenau Hospital continued renovation of existing areas, including the emergency department, obstetrics unit, and patient rooms. The 455 bed hospital also opened a new ambulatory surgery unit and instituted a hospice service to provide support for terminally ill patients, both at home and in the hospital.

Lankenau has been affiliated with Jefferson since 1949. This year, 160 Jefferson students rotated through Lankenau as part of their core curriculum, and over 125 students came here on electives from Jefferson and other medical schools.

Lankenau offers postdoctoral residencies in medicine, surgery, ob/gyn, and pathology. The hospital also has affiliated residents from Thomas Jefferson University Hospital in orthopedics, otolaryngology, and ophthalmology, and from the University of Pennsylvania in infectious diseases, nephrology, gastroenterology, hematology-oncology, and cardiology.









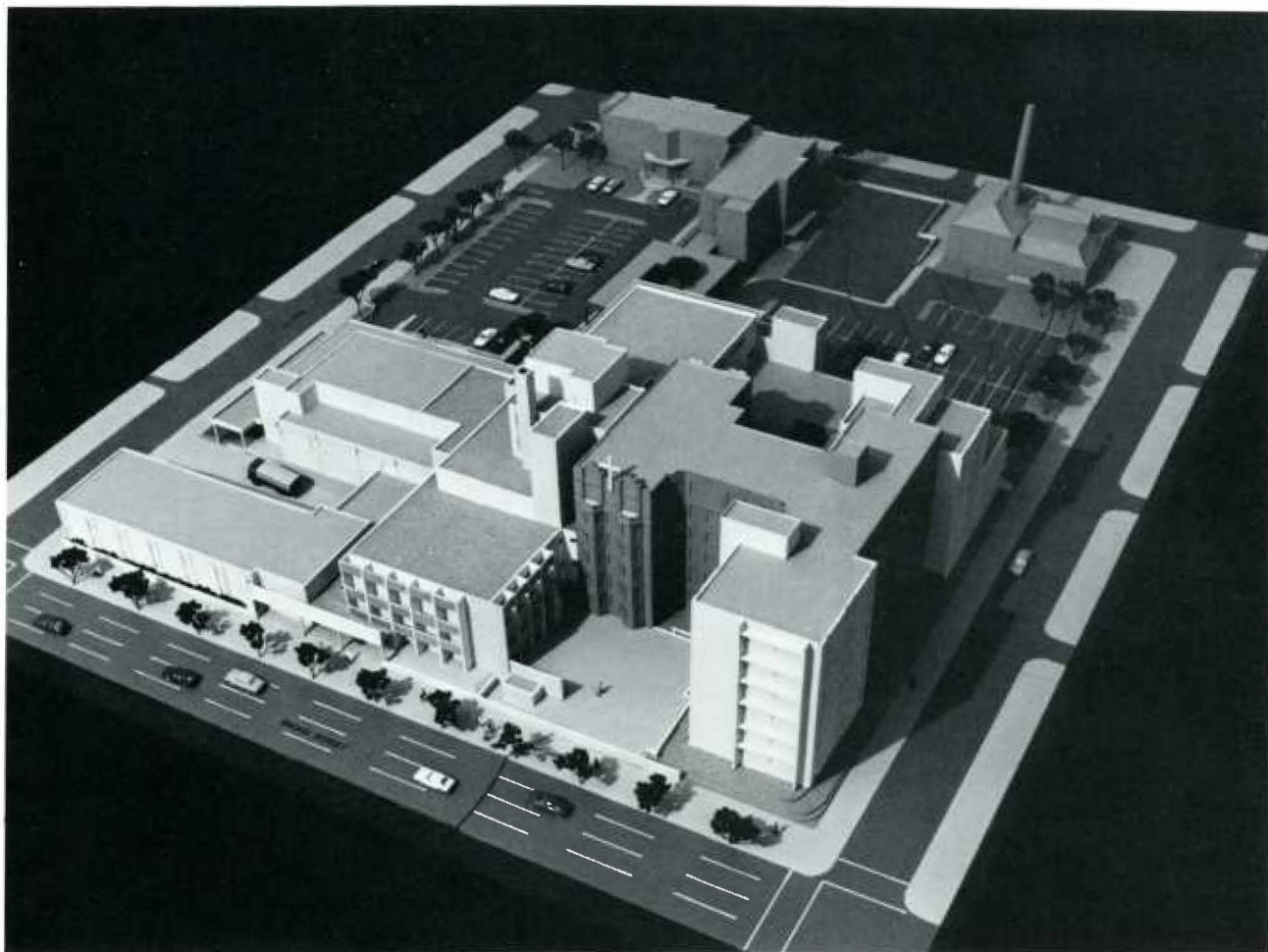
## The Bryn Mawr Hospital



The principle objective of the Bryn Mawr Hospital is to make the best possible health care available to the people of the community it serves. To do that effectively, a strong commitment has been made to medical education. Our involvement in training future practitioners of medicine enhances the quality of patient care we deliver. Through our teaching affiliation with Jefferson Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University, the number of medical students who have had clinical clerkships or elective rotation at Bryn Mawr has almost doubled in the past three years. Bedside experience in patient problem solving is provided under the guidance of highly qualified volunteer faculty from our Medical Staff, including many physicians who hold faculty appointments at Jefferson Medical College.

This coming year, Phase I of the Hospital's long-range Improvement Program will be started, which includes construction of new critical care units containing the most modern and up-to-date equipment. To keep pace with medicine's new technology and rapid advancement of factual knowledge, over 100 regularly scheduled educational conferences are held each month within the Hospital to provide the forum and impart information for members of the Medical Staff, House Staff, and students.

# Methodist Hospital





Methodist Hospital has had a teaching affiliation with Jefferson Medical College dating back to the 1950's when medical students participated in clinical clerkships in Medicine, Surgery, and Obstetrics and Gynecology at this South Philadelphia landmark. The association between the two institutions continued into the 60's with more students obtaining portions of their clinical training at this 249 bed community hospital.

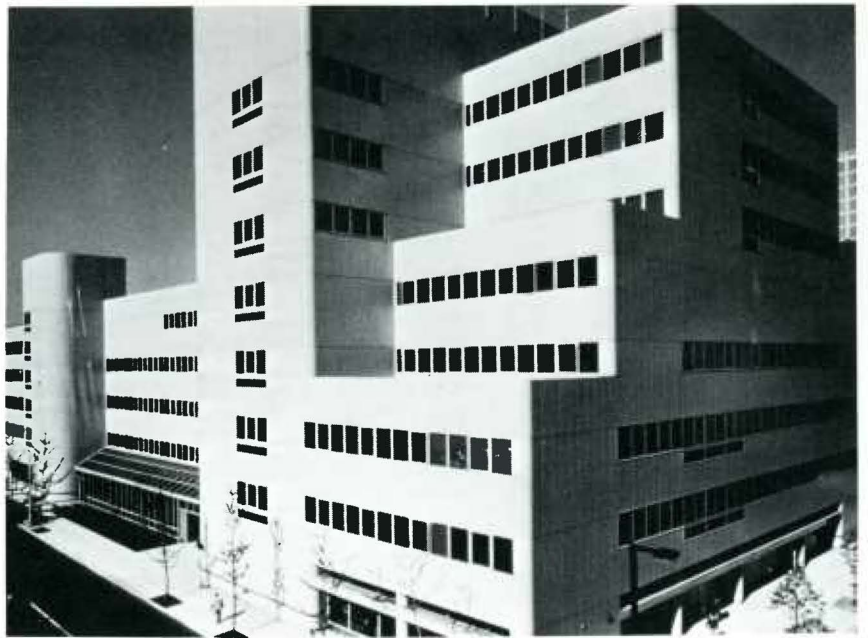
As Jefferson Medical College expanded its enrollment, the need for well defined affiliate teaching facilities was evident, and the Methodist Hospital signed a formal agreement with Jefferson in 1970, which has opened a broad range of clinical facilities to medical students in their clinical years.

The community hospital atmosphere at Methodist affords medical students, interns, and residents the opportunity to see the clinical side of the practice and art of medicine in contradistinction to "the ivory tower" atmosphere that pervades the medical centers to which they are exposed. It allows the house staff to feel they are a part of the medical team treating an individual patient rather than just another strange face.

In the past few years, as part of the Hospital's continued service to the community, Methodist announced the opening of two new birthing units, a new ambulatory care service, and a short procedure unit.



# Wills Eye Hospital





The past year proved to be a milestone year in the 149 year history of Wills Eye Hospital. In March, the Hospital moved from its Spring Garden Street location of nearly 50 years to an architecturally award-winning building in center city Philadelphia. The new 120 bed building nearly doubles the space of the Hospital's previous facility and better accommodates the over 120,000 outpatients and 7,000 inpatients who come to Wills each year.

Founded in 1832 through a bequest by Philadelphia Quaker merchant James Wills, Jr., Wills ranks as the nation's oldest and largest hospital devoted solely to eye care. From its inception, it has been a world leader in eye care, teaching, and research. Medical and surgical care is offered through the General Ophthalmology Service, the Emergency Room, and the Hospital's seven subspecialty services. The General Ophthalmology Service, hub of the Hospital, deals in basic eye examinations, refractions, and cataract surgery. The Emergency Room, open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, is the largest center in the region for the treatment of emergency eye problems.

Founded before ophthalmology was considered a separate medical specialty, Wills maintains its front-runner position today. Its seven subspecialty services offer the most sophisticated diagnosis and treatment for the most complicated eye disorders. Problems rarely seen in other institutions are treated frequently here. The subspecialties now comprise Cornea, Retina, Glaucoma, Pediatric Ophthalmology, Neuro-ophthalmology, Oculoplastics, and Oncology.

The Hospital's ultramodern equipment such as the ultrasound machines, diagnostic photography modalities, the Octopus visual fields tester, and the Ultracrano-T X-ray help to assure the best possible diagnosis of patients' problems. Wills is also at the forefront in researching and implementing the most advanced medical and surgical treatments such as laser photocoagulation, cobalt plaque irradiation, and intraocular lens implants to prevent and to better treat such eye disorders as diabetic retinopathy, ocular tumors, and cataracts.

The Hospital plays a vital role in ophthalmic teaching. Wills became affiliated with Jefferson Medical College and Thomas Jefferson University Hospital in 1972. Wills' move to Ninth and Walnut Streets in center city places it in close proximity to Jefferson, furthering the cooperation between the two institutions. Wills now handles clinical and surgical eye care for Thomas Jefferson University Hospital and the ophthalmic training for Jefferson Medical College; Wills in turn has the back-up of Jefferson's non-ophthalmic specialists, equipment, and laboratory services. Many Jefferson medical students as well as residents in such specialties as family practice and emergency medicine rotate through Wills where they receive basic training in ophthalmology.

# Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital

Founded in 1950, Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital helps meet the health-care needs of southern New Jersey through a diversity of clinical and educational programs.

It is the regional referral center for acute and chronic renal dialysis and transplantation, high-risk maternity and child-care programs and physical rehabilitation. The Hospital has also achieved recognition for its expertise in cardiovascular surgery, cardiac catheterization, and the treatment of pulmonary disorders.

The main building contains 334 beds and most administrative and business offices. 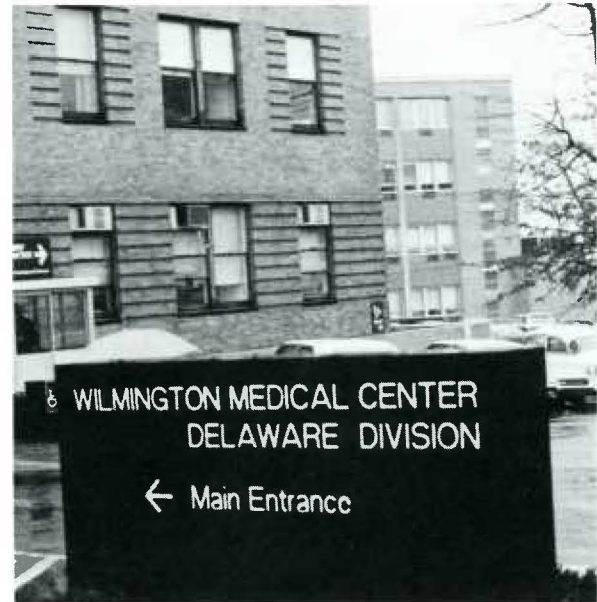
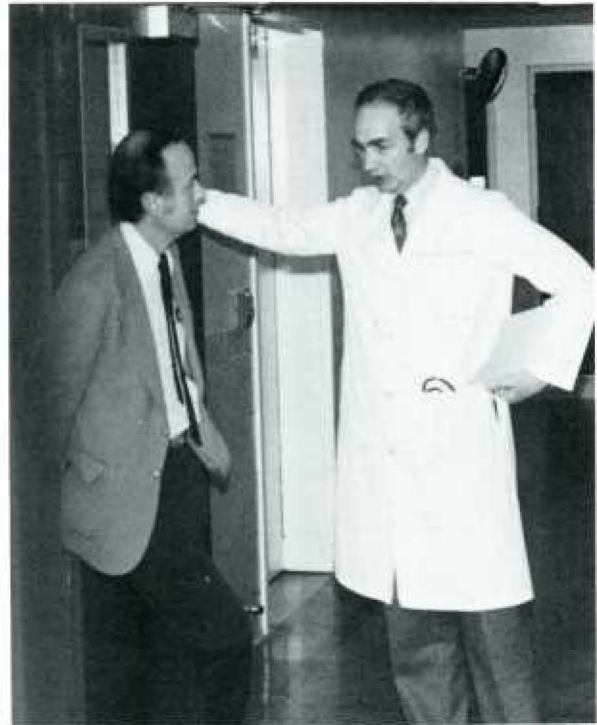
# Coatesville

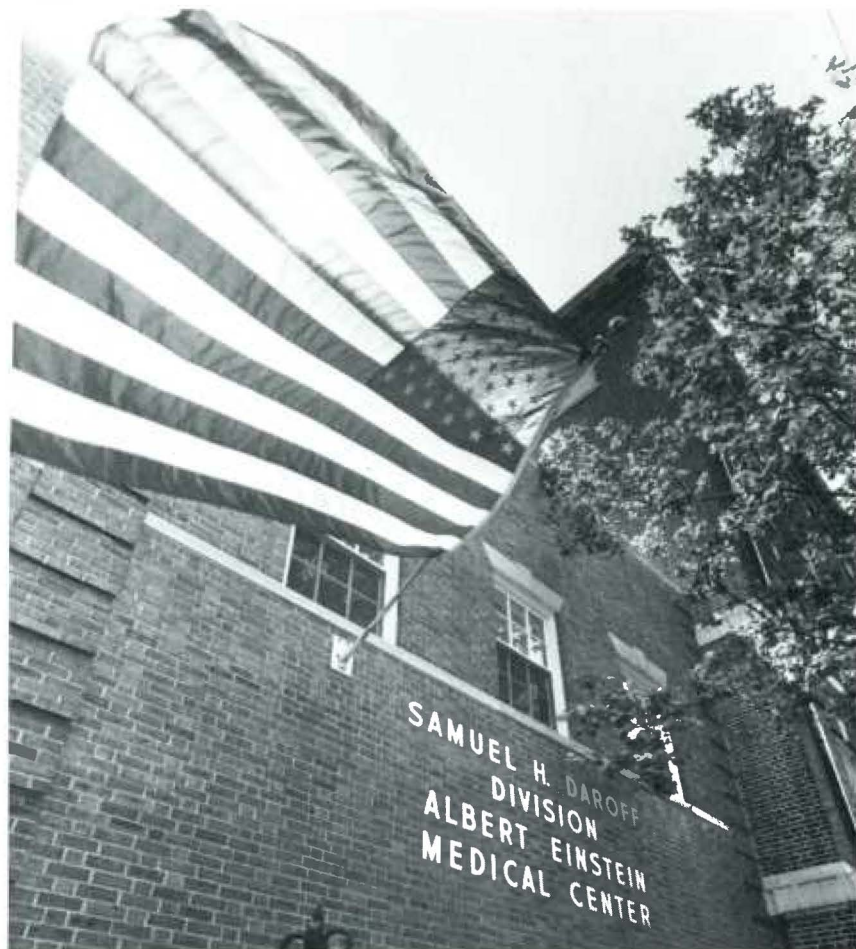

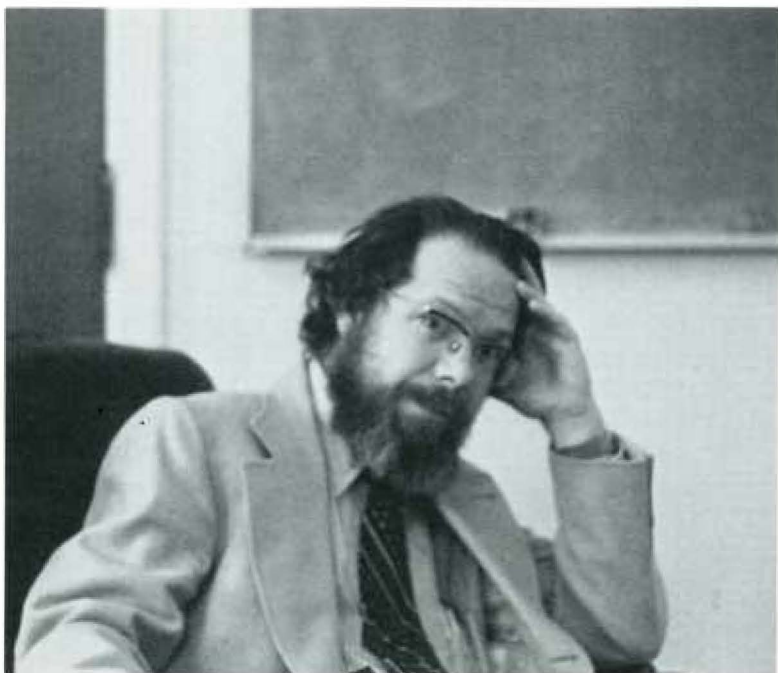
# Albert Einstein Medical Center Daroff Division

## Latrobe Area Hospital

Latrobe Area Hospital is located 35 miles east of Pittsburgh, nestled in the foothills of the beautiful Laurel Highlands. The 352 bed hospital serves 125,000 persons in its continually expanding facility offering full emergency, medical, surgical, pediatric, obstetric, orthopedic, intensive-coronary care, restorative, extended, mental health, ambulatory, and preventive care services, along with all ancillary services such as physical therapy, occupational therapy, respiratory therapy, audiology, and speech pathology. A 72,000 square foot addition, completed in early 1981, houses new Emergency/Outpatient and Radiology services, as well as a patient elevator tower, admitting and social services offices, a reception/lobby area, etc. Over 80 physicians offer full diagnostic and therapeutic services at the fully accredited institution.

The Latrobe Area Hospital — Jefferson Medical School affiliation started in 1974. Four residents a year are appointed to the three year Family Practice Residency program; also junior and senior medical students are assigned to the Family Practice rotation.

The main Family Practice Unit is located in the Ambulatory Care Center, a separate building, connected by an enclosed walkway to the hospital. Three satellite offices are now open in the communities of Saltsburg, Pleasant Unity, and Blairsville. The units are directed by Joseph R. Govi, M.D. Junior and senior students are assigned to the units for a six week period and are provided a broad range of experience in community medicine, supplemented by an organized continuing education program provided through the cooperation of the Department of Family Practice at Jefferson Medical College.

The Laurel Highlands Recreational Area offers 11 scenic ski centers, many fishing streams, and hunting in abundance. Historical settings located nearby are Fort Ligonier, which offers colonial lore and tradition, Bushy Run Park of French fame, and Fort Necessity, built by George Washington. Events such as the Rolling Rock Steeplechase, PGA golf tournaments and Ryder Cup Tournaments at Laurel Valley Golf Club, St. Vincent College Summer Theatre, and the Latrobe Air Show attract thousands yearly to the area. The Westmoreland and Pittsburgh Symphonies, Heinz Hall, Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre and Civic Light Opera offer a full complement of cultural activities. The sport fan can enjoy the Pittsburgh Steelers, Pittsburgh Pirates or Penguin Hockey.



## Franklin Hospital

Franklin Hospital is a 193 bed hospital in the Allegheny River Valley in Northwestern Pennsylvania. It's fast becoming recognized as a rural referral center, largely due to the reputation of the medical staff which is 95% board certified. Nearly every surgical and medical specialty is represented. The physicians exercise a team approach when treating patients with each other and with other health professionals and paraprofessionals.

A growing concern for rural health has led to the establishment of an additional satellite facility in the community of Emlenton, some 20 miles away. This is the second satellite the Hospital established, the first one established in Clintonville three years ago.

This year, the Hospital is completing a three year extensive expansion and renovation project which is giving every patient, public, and office area a totally new look.

Completed this year was an expanded intensive-cardiac care unit which is newly equipped with hemodynamic monitoring. An expanded emergency department is nearing completion. Entirely new radiology and laboratory departments will be completed this year.

The Hospital is looking forward to developing a family practice residency program in the near future.
