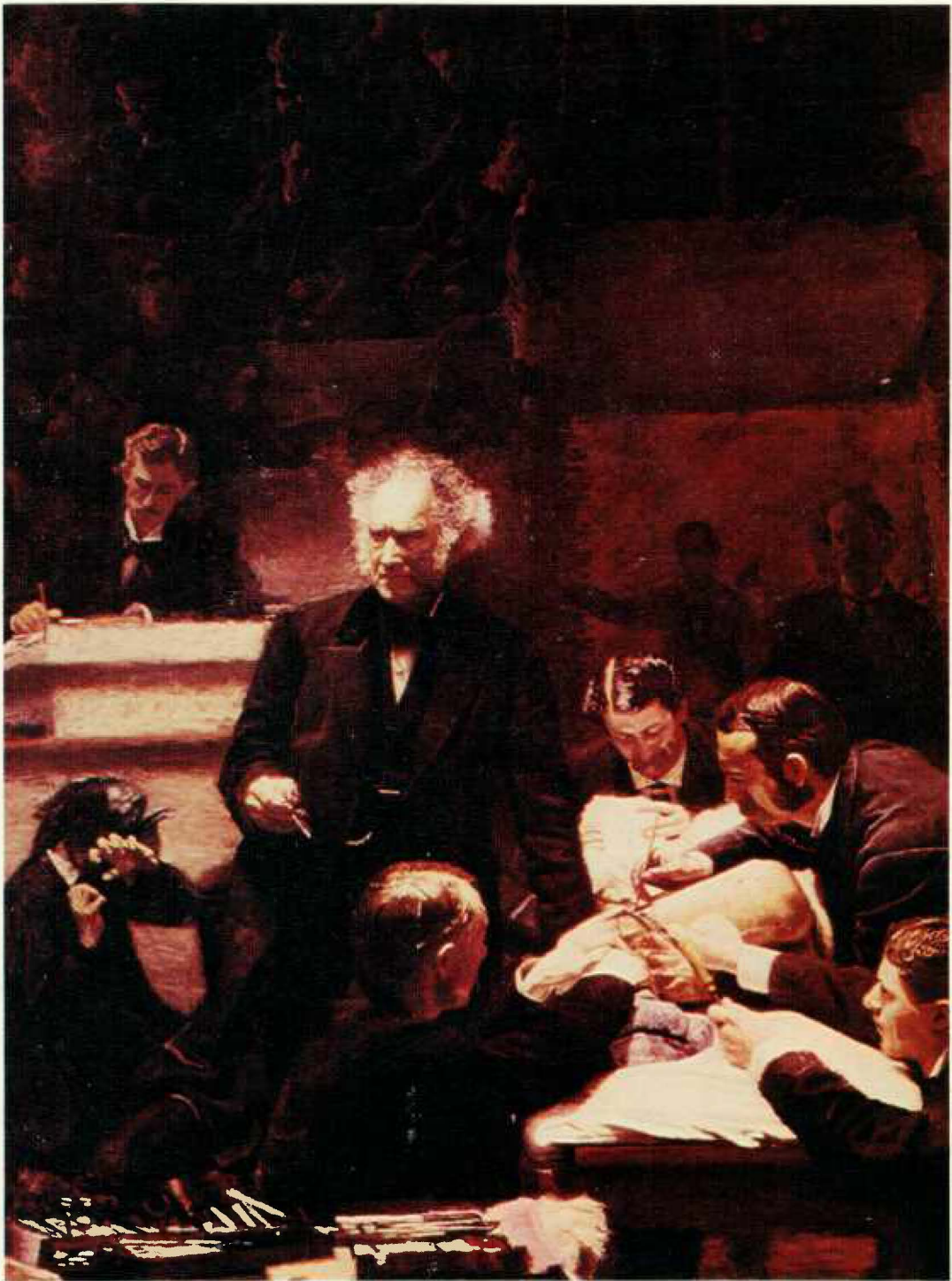

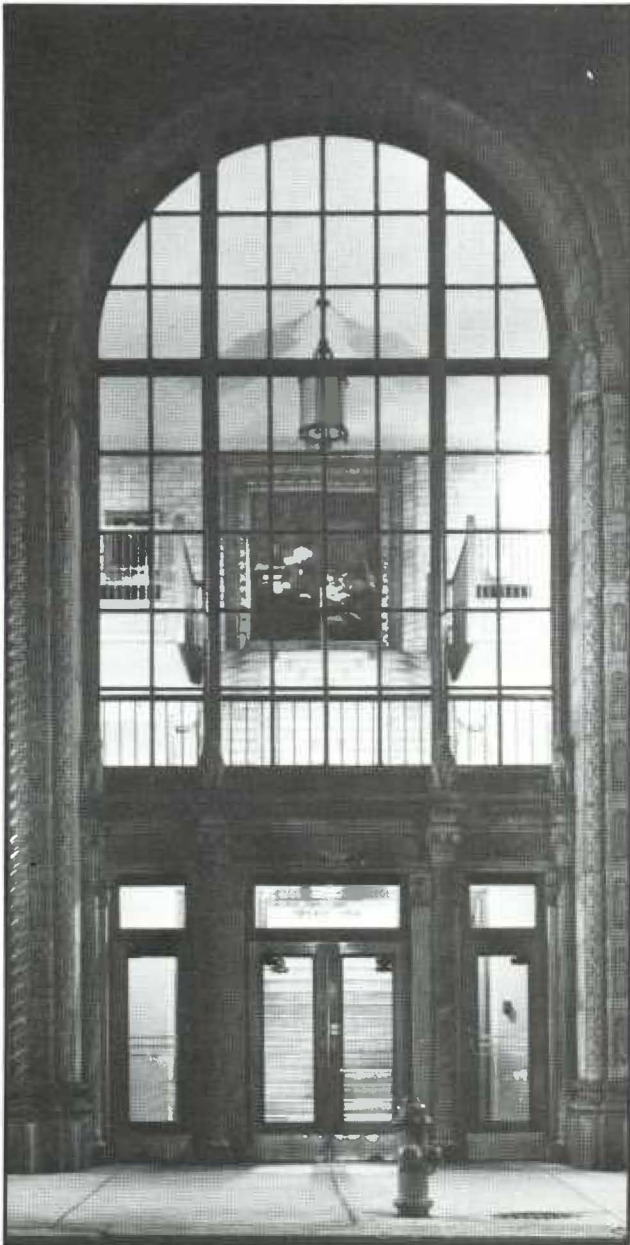

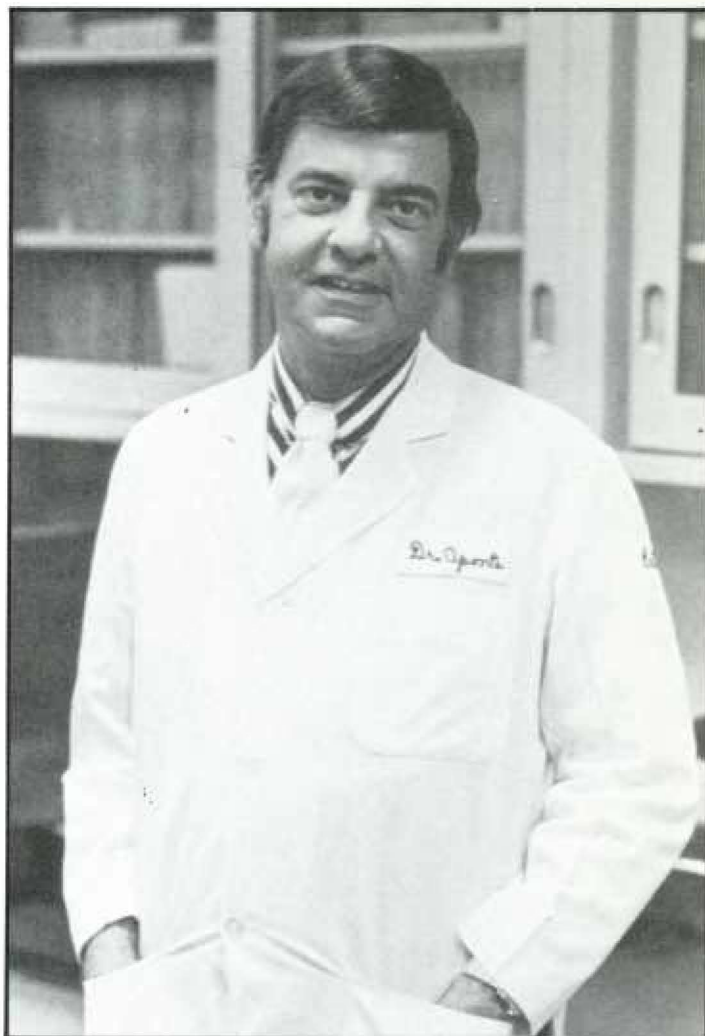

Gonzalo E. Aponte, M.D. (1929-1979)

At Jefferson there is a tradition of applauding the professor when he completes a particularly fine lecture. Although Dr. Aponte gave his last lecture eleven months ago, the applause is continuing, but it is no longer in the form of clapping hands. It is students remembering his excellent lectures, colleagues recalling his mastery over the vast expanses of medicine, and alumni creating the Gonzalo E. Aponte Chair in Pathology.

From his first days at Jefferson, thirty-one years ago, he distinguished himself as a superior student and at graduation he received eight prizes for academic achievement. After serving his internship and residency at Jefferson Medical College Hospital in Pathology, he spent two years in the U.S. Navy.

He returned to Jefferson in 1959, and rose quickly from



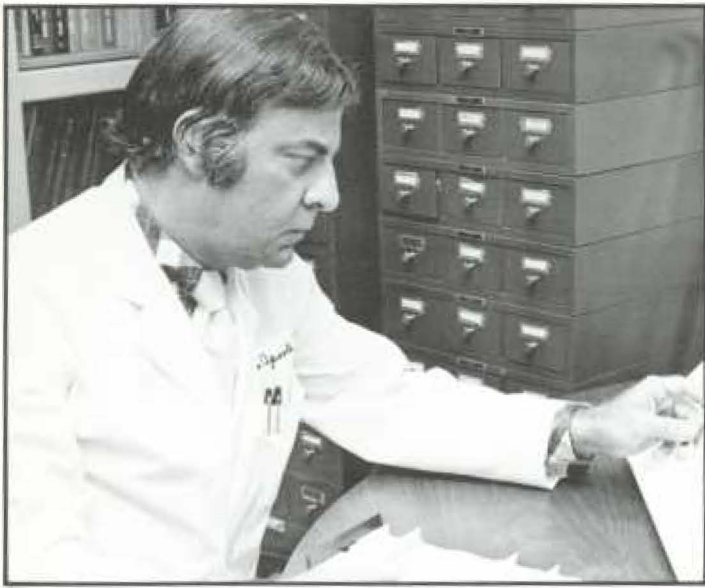
Assistant to Associate Professor of Pathology. In 1967 he was named Professor and Chairman of the Department of Pathology. During this time he was named a Markle Scholar in Medical Science from 1960 to 1965 and Clinical Scientist of the Year by the Association of Clinical Scientists in 1967. He was honored by the students at Jefferson in 1962 by receiving the Christian R. and Mary F. Lindback Award for Distinguished Teaching, and the Jefferson Class of 1971 presented his portrait to the school.

His career also included serving as President of the Alumni Association of Jefferson Medical College, President of the Pathology Society of Philadelphia, a member of the Editorial Board of the Annals of Clinical and Laboratory Science, and a member of the Board of Directors of Alpha Omega Alpha.

He was the author of more than fifty articles in the medical literature, but his finest written contributions were his pathology handouts for medical students. They were both a learning and a reference source and served as the true introduction to the field of clinical medicine. He was an equally gifted teacher and an eloquent speaker. The graduating classes continually asked him to administer the Oath of Hippocrates at the commencement exercises.

Dr. Aponte: instructor, scholar, scientist, Jeffersonian, the 1980 Clinic is dedicated to his memory.

Preface

A theme is something no yearbook should be without. That was our first thought when we became editors of the 1980 Clinic. So thinking, we devoted our second thought, and a great many subsequent ones, to finding a theme. Schubert's 9th? No. A bestiary? The history of medicine? No, no. Delta-aminolevulonic acid prophylaxis in idiopathic thrombocytopenic purpura? No, no. No. What were we doing at Jefferson? What was Jefferson doing to us? We couldn't think. Four years ago we came here. And now, having worked here and played here, we are leaving.



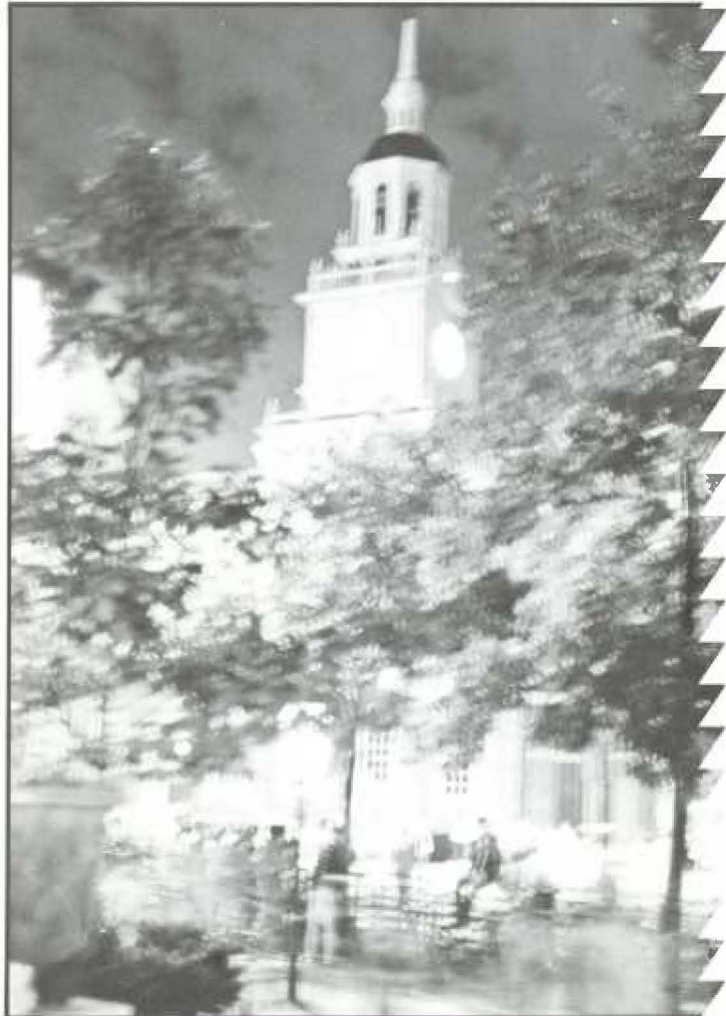
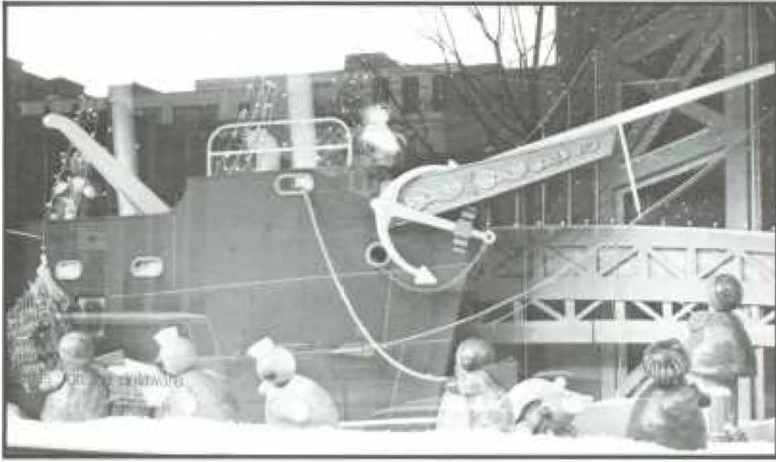
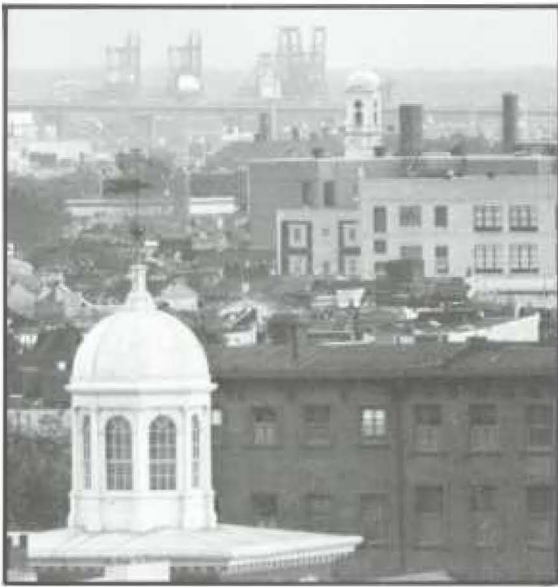








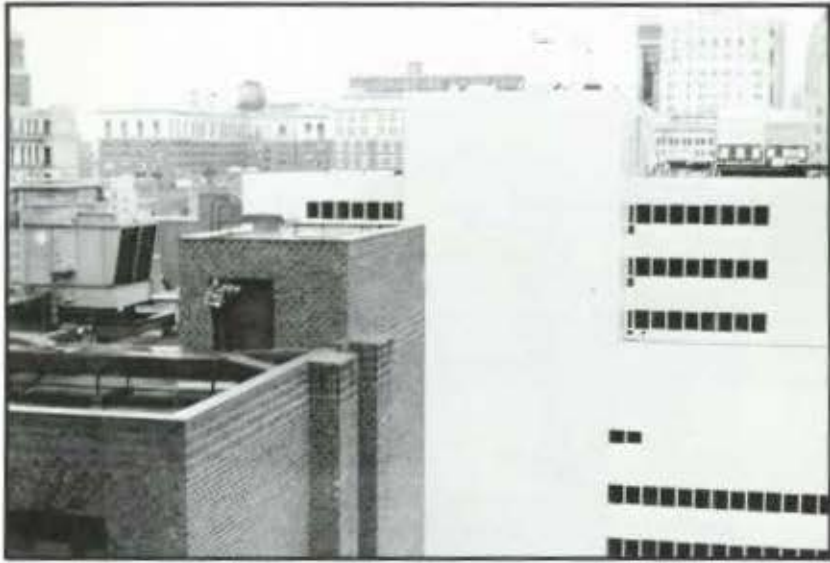


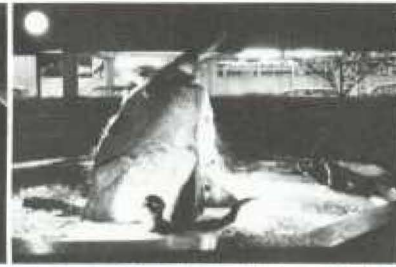

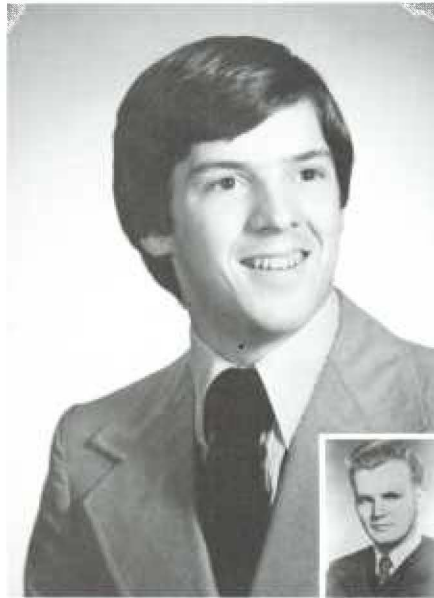
WE

C L A S S P O R T R A I T

We paid a call on Dean Mackowiak on a very cold afternoon in January. The class of 1980 had decided to paint his portrait; we wanted a portrait of our own.

We sat for a few minutes outside his office, shaking off the cold. We watched as he ushered out a medical student who was wearing a short white coat, and we overheard their parting small talk.

The medical student told Dr. Mackowiak that he played the organ at church. Dr. Mackowiak said that playing the organ was a hobby of his. He cited statistics which revealed that many physicians play Bach. He explained that most of Bach requires only technical proficiency, and mentioned a piece that he played.

"That's very complicated Bach," the student said.

"I can barely get through it," Dr. Mackowiak said.

We were invited into his office. Dr. Mackowiak was wearing a dark blue suit over a dark blue sweater with wood buttons. He wore a nametag which read "Robert Mackowiak, M.D." on one line and "Department of Medicine" on the second. To the left appeared the Jefferson insignia, which was printed in neutral blue. His desk was also neutral blue, as was some of the cabinet-work. The rug was off-blue; the sky that day was bright blue, we remember.

Dr. Mackowiak sat in his rocking chair, which he uses to favor his back. It resembled very much the rocking chair that the late President Kennedy used to favor his back. The President's had the great seal of the President on the back. Dr. Mackowiak's chair read "Jefferson Medical College".

Dr. Mackowiak complained of a difficult day. He had been told that a member of the clinical faculty had released a test to some of his students. Some other students had

failed that test. "A decision will have to be made, and it will have to be equitable," he said. "Most of all, it will have to be equitable."

Dr. Mackowiak's hair was a little longer this day than when we had first met him, so now it lay down neatly in front. It used to stand up at times. Dr. Mackowiak once explained to us that at one time his hairstyle had been fashionable, but that the fashion had changed. He had found it comfortable, and had stayed with it. He had told us this to explain that his hair was not a political statement.

We asked Dr. Mackowiak to talk to us about old times. When had he first come to Jefferson?

"I came to Jefferson in 1960. I had zero money, and I had some family in Philadelphia who would give me an occasional meal, so I decided on a Philadelphia medical school. Jefferson accepted me before Penn, and I had to put some money down, so I came here.

"We had anatomy at DBI, the old Daniel Baugh Institute at 11th and Clinton. I remember the first day there was a terrible thunderstorm. We trudged up to the third floor and Dr. Michaels, who was in charge of gross anatomy and a very *Sturm und Drang* type. He told us how difficult the course would be, and there was thunder and lightning and these men in black coats. And the cadavers. We were terrified. Day one.

"It was a very difficult course. I think we started at eight every morning and we'd work until about six. We had lab every day, and quizzes all the time, osteology quizzes and the like. At the end of the semester we had a block of neuroanatomy.

"No note service then. My roommate and I had a deal in neuroanatomy. I'd write down the words and he'd draw the

pictures, and we'd share our notes at night. He's a neurosurgeon now.

"We had to make this big chart. Did you have to draw that? It was this big chart, all cross-sections from the sacral cord to the cerebral cortex, and you'd fold it up like an accordion. And that was the big achievement of neuroanatomy.

"That was the first test I flunked in medical school, the neuroanatomy practical. I couldn't tell where all those toothpicks were stuck in the brains. Later I flunked the parasitology practical, the one with the microscopes. Did you have that? I couldn't tell all those different worms apart.

"Of course, it was different in another way. Ours was the last class with no women. The last class of male chauvinists. '61 was the first class with women.

"The second semester was the worst, not physically but psychologically. The second we had biochemistry and physiology, and it was hard because you knew people were going to fail. We had classes until noon or one o'clock on Saturdays.

"We started with 175 or 176 people. I think the attrition that year was nearly twenty. Repeating the year was hardly ever heard of. It wasn't just Jefferson. I remember hearing horror stories from other medical schools in the early sixties.

"When I was a sophomore, Dr. Aponte had just come back from the Navy. He had been stationed in Guam where he described *bangungut*, which you'll find in the textbooks under 'sudden death'. He was in charge of one pathology section, and McCloskey had another. Dr. Lewis was very much present, too.



"Pathology used to last the whole year then. It was always pathology versus microbiology, competing for time.

"The first members of the clinical faculty we ran across were Dr. Rupp and Dr. Rakoff, in physiology. They gave an excellent series of lectures in endocrinology, talking about hypo-this and hyper-that.

"The clinical years were very much the same then as now, except that the senior year was much more like the third year. Senior clerkships in medicine, surgery, pediatrics, and ob-gyn were required. Somehow we worked in the subspecialties too, with some ophthalmology and a very good ENT clinic.

"I took my internship at Methodist. We had a very good internship there back then. It was very popular with Jefferson students.

"A few months after I was married my father had a very bad stroke. I still had zero money, and after that I had new obligations.

"So after my internship I took a job here as instructor in physiology. I taught here for a few years.

"In 1968, after my dad died, I started my residency in internal medicine and cardiology at Mercy Catholic. In 1972, I rejoined the faculty. Later that year I came to the dean's office. Where I remain."

We asked Dr. Mackowiak to tell us what he thought of the class of 1980. We mentioned the National Boards.

"I think that the Boards for the class of 1980 were a happening of obscure etiology that should remain obscure, like sarcoidosis.

"The transition from the second to the third year is always a difficult one, but I think your class as a whole made it better than most. Many members of your class have a vigor and a tenacity that suits them very well in adapting to clinical situations. Perhaps it did not suit them so well in the first two years.

"I think your class had really blossomed. I predict your class will get some very good residencies.

"The interpersonal interview situation is very important in residency selection, and from what I hear your class is handling it very well."

We asked Dr. Mackowiak if he had started sitting for his portrait.

"No. Dr. Mandle just gave me a list of names. I guess my wife and I will go through them this week or next. I like the portraits of Drs. Rupp, Aponte, and Wise. They were done by Skemp, so I guess that's who I should have mine done by."

We gathered our things to go, ending our interview rather hesitantly.

"If you have any more questions just holler," Dr. Mackowiak said. "I'll be around at the same old stand."

Affiliates



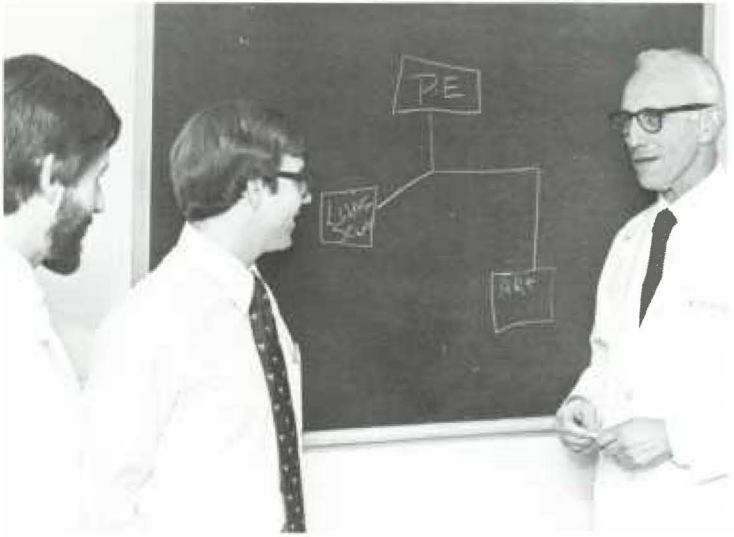
The key to the education of a medical student is clinical training. Jefferson Medical College is fortunate in having many hospitals in affiliation that can provide students with this important clinical experience.

The Thomas Jefferson University Hospital is the principle center, and trains the largest number of students in all areas of medicine. With the large number of students in each class at Jefferson however, the affiliates afford students more individualized learning experiences. The atmosphere is usually that of a community type hospital and exposes students to a different style of medicine.

Currently seventeen hospitals have major affiliations with Jefferson. These ties are as old as 30 years with the Methodist Hospital, to just 3 years with Franklin Hospital. Eleven affiliates are located in Philadelphia or its nearby suburbs. There are 3 in Delaware, 1 in New Jersey, and 2 in Western Pennsylvania. They range from centers that treat one field of medical patient to hospitals that provide as many different areas of medicine as the University hospital.

The students of Jefferson thank the affiliated hospitals for the fine teaching and hope for many more years of cooperation and friendship.

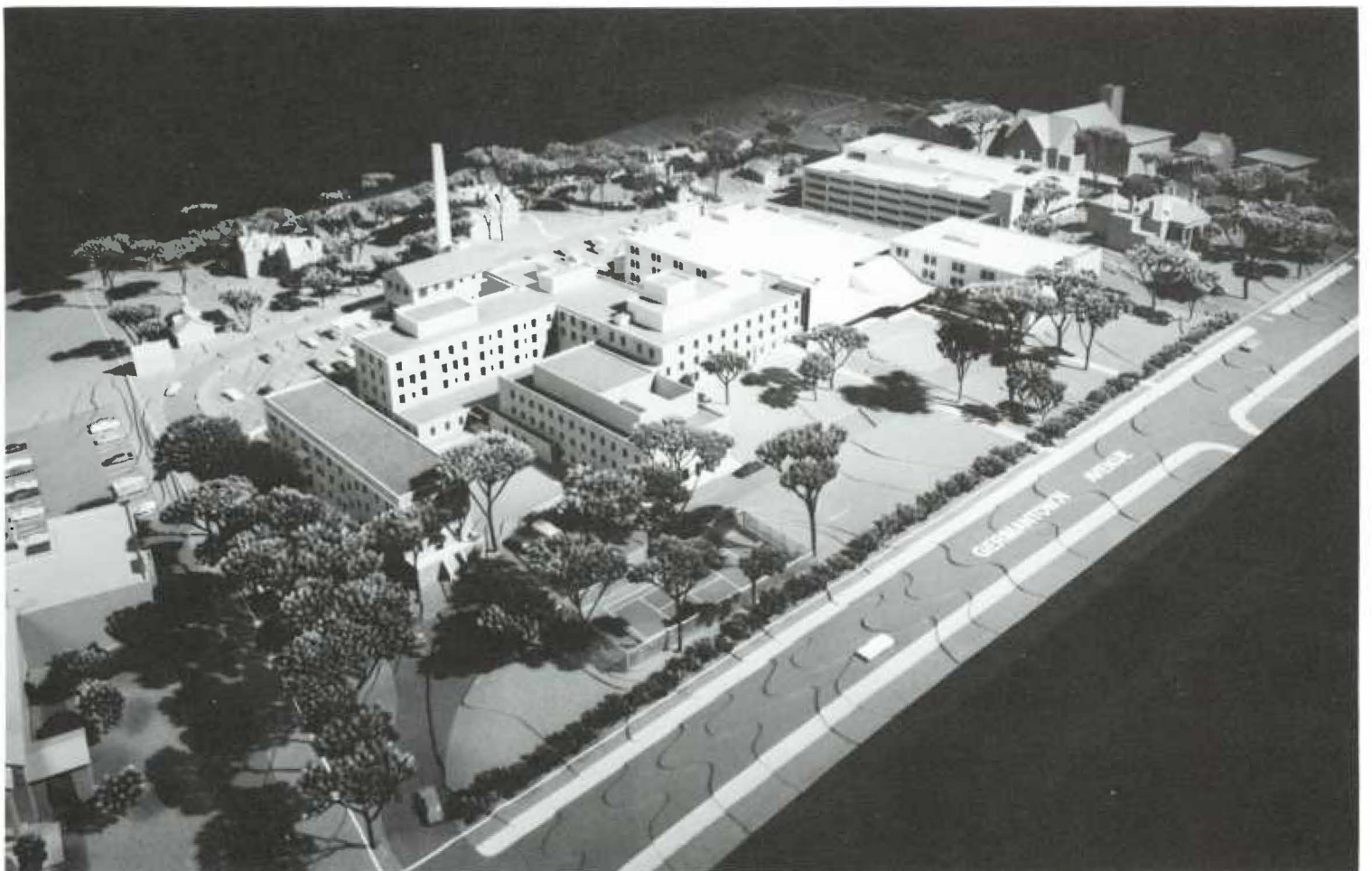
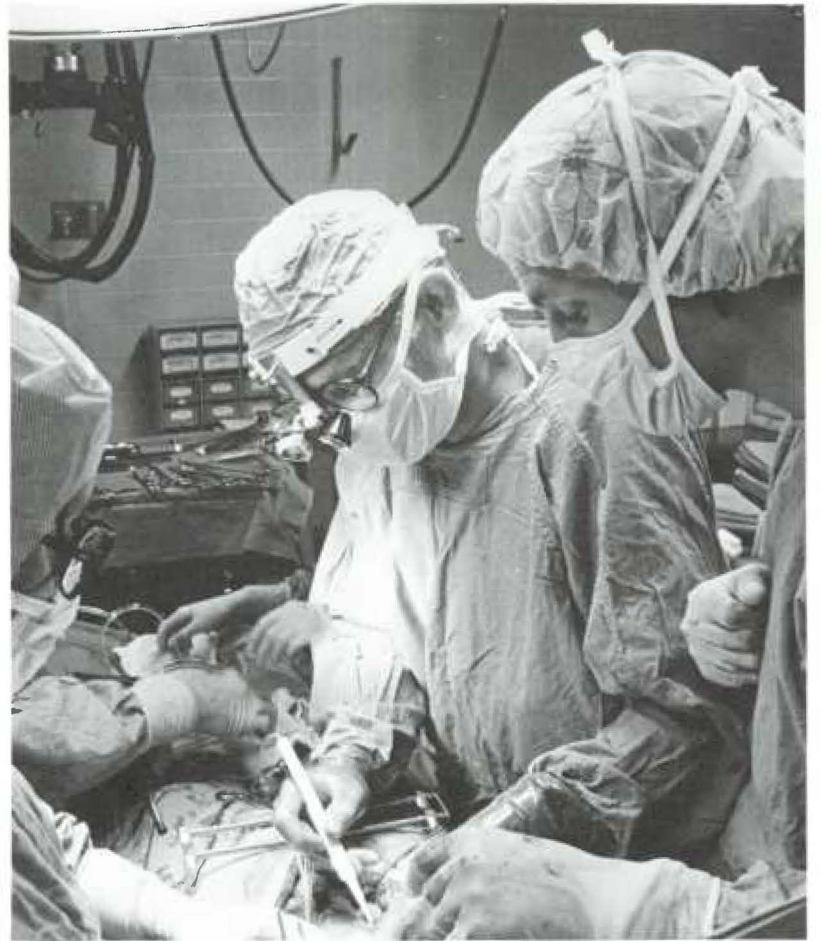

Chestnut Hill Hospital is proud of its Jefferson Medical College Affiliation which was started by Dr. Joseph W. Stayman, Jr., Director of Surgery at Chestnut Hill Hospital, and Dr. John H. Gibbon, Jr., Professor of Surgery at Jefferson. The program, now in its nineteenth year, progressed rapidly from a rotation of senior students throughout the hospital, to the approval by the Joint Commission for residency training and the resulting addition of residents to rotation at Chestnut Hill.

Chestnut Hill is a community hospital where surgical students and residents gain greater experience with patients requiring primary and secondary care than they would at a university hospital which provides mostly tertiary or highly specialized care. As a result of the Jefferson affiliation, 100 surgical residents and more than 500 students on surgical rotations have received training at Chestnut Hill Hospital.

In 1974, as part of the affiliation with the Family Medicine Residency Program, student rotations in Family Medicine were initiated. Currently, the Family Medicine Residency Program at Chestnut Hill Hospital provides rotations for 32 junior and 8 senior medical students from Jefferson Medical College each year. Chestnut Hill also has an approved three year residency in Family Medicine. There are a total of twelve residents with four first year residents appointed each year.

Five appointments are made each year in the Flexible First Year Graduate program which is sponsored by the Family Medicine Residency at Chestnut Hill and the Ophthalmology Residency at Jefferson.

The hospital's modernization program consists of a new nursing wing with 68 replacement beds; an Outpatient and Ancillary Services Center; a new Medical Office Building; a 421 car parking garage; and extensive renovations to the existing building. Chestnut Hill is taking every possible step to guarantee it will continue to be a hospital where the physicians and staff can provide the finest health care and can support outstanding medical education programs.





Coatesville

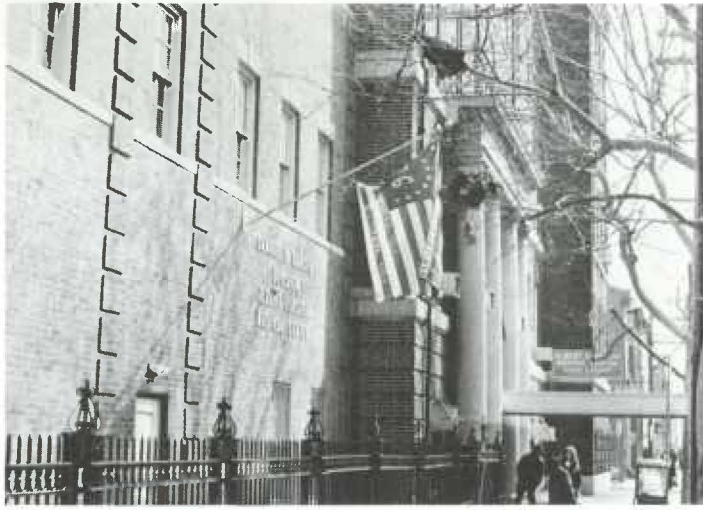

Overnight accommodations and a college campus atmosphere provide a unique learning opportunity.





Einstein Medical Center Daroff Division

Medical education is a tradition at the Daroff Division Albert Einstein Medical Center. Known as Mount Sinai Hospital when its doors first opened in 1899, the Hospital began teaching programs for interns and residents in 1909, programs which have continued to this day.

Programs for Jefferson students at Daroff include Junior Medicine and Psychiatry and Senior Medicine. Sophomores learn the art of history taking and physical examination, and freshman spend time in the Emergency Unit. Many elective courses are also available.



Delaware State Hospital

The program consists of four years of basic residency training in psychiatry, constructed to prepare trainees for certification as psychiatrists. A four month block of the first year is spent in primary care training. Methods of training are in two main categories: 1) clinical assignments, and 2) teaching sessions. Clinical assignments of residents are controlled by the Director of Research and Education, designed to permit best development of the individual resident. Individual supervision is provided for the residents. Teaching sessions include subjects in basic and clinical psychiatry, basic and clinical neurology, reading seminars, and research seminars. Explicit emphasis is placed upon the trainee status of residents and their service to the hospital is subordinate to this requirement.



Franklin Hospital

Franklin Hospital, located in the northwestern Pennsylvania county of Venango, is continuing to develop from a community hospital to a rural, referral center. This transition is largely due to a vigorous and successful physician recruitment program which has attracted a large number of young, board-certified physicians to this rural community.

Since the formal affiliation between Jefferson and Franklin was signed in 1977, junior and senior medical students have been completing their family practice rotations here.

The hospital expects its family practice residency program to begin in July, 1980. The model family practice office has been in full operation for one year.

Presently the Hospital is undergoing an extensive building project. One of the major considerations in the construction is the development of more out-patient facilities.

Some recent additions to the 183-bed Hospital have been cardiac rehabilitation, community and patient education programs and CAT scanning.





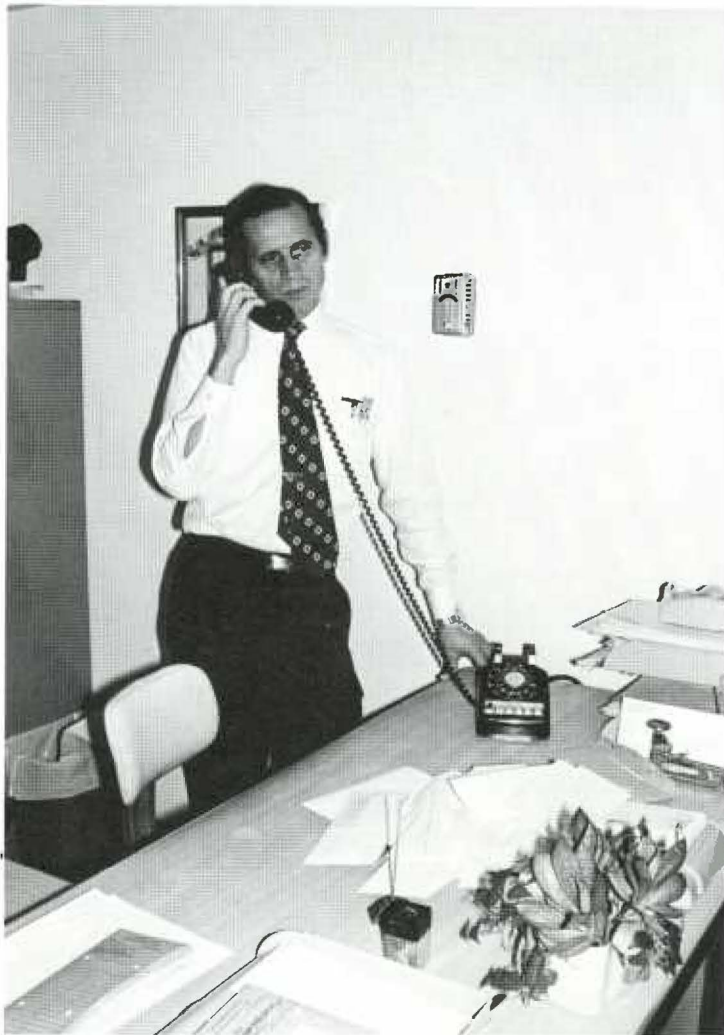
Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital

Founded in 1950, Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital helps meet the health-care needs of southern New Jersey through a diversity of clinical and educational programs. It is the regional referral center for acute and chronic renal dialysis, renal transplantation, and extensive maternity and child-care programs. The Hospital has also achieved recognition for its expertise in cardiovascular surgery, cardiac catheterization, and the treatment of pulmonary disorders, including cystic fibrosis.

The main building contains 334 patient beds and most administrative and business offices. A five-story addition, completed in 1976, is site for a 50-bed regional rehabilitation center offering physical therapy, occupational therapy, and speech and hearing therapy. The operating suites, 24-hour emergency room, social services, and ambulatory care are also located in this new addition. Peripheral buildings house the hemodialysis unit and the Osborn Family Health Center.

Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital shares a professional affiliation with Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia, and participates in undergraduate, post-graduate, and continuing medical education programs with the University. The Hospital also sponsors a School of Nursing that prepares graduates for licensure as RN's. The Hospital is owned and operated by the Franciscan Sisters of Allegany, NY, with all services available without regard to race, creed, color, or national origin.

The Lankenau Hospital



The past year was the most important one for the Lankenau Hospital since its move to its present location over 25 years ago.

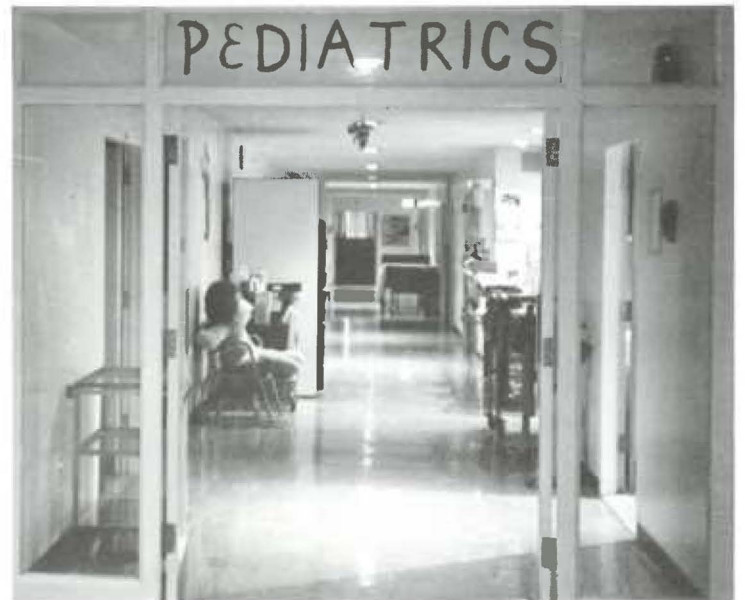
The last several years — from the time we introduced our major building project until the completion of our two new buildings — have been significant, eventful years, shaping the course of Lankenau's future.

The major thrust of our building project was the construction of two new buildings. Our Outpatient Center, containing more than 25 specialized clinics and other ancillary services, was completed in September 1978. Programs there continue to expand, including a new Family Planning Service and outpatient education programs. The Mary Ethel Pew Wing, housing 271 patient beds and a combined 30-bed medical-surgical intensive care unit, opened in early 1979. We are now in the midst of major renovations, the last segment of this building program. When they are completed we will have consolidated our inpatient and outpatient services, and all our facilities will meet the highest standards for patient care and comfort and efficiency for our staff.

This year, we added two significant services. These include a two-second whole body CT scanner, perhaps the most sophisticated in our area. In September 1979, we opened a 23-bed acute care psychiatric unit, thereby relieving the shortage of such beds in general hospitals in our area. We also continued to enhance and expand our program for care of the cardiac patient, particularly in regard to open heart surgery.

Among those who will be sharing the benefits of the building and renovation project are the 160 Jefferson medical students who rotate through Lankenau as part of their core curriculum, and the more than 125 students who come here on electives from Jefferson and other medical schools.

Lankenau's affiliation with Jefferson dates back to 1949 when students began receiving a portion of the medical and surgical training here. Today Lankenau offers postdoctoral residencies in medicine, surgery, ob/gyn and pathology. The hospital also has affiliated residents from Thomas Jefferson University Hospital in orthopedics, otolaryngology and ophthalmology, and from the University of Pennsylvania in plastic surgery. Clinical fellowships are offered in infectious diseases, nephrology, gastroenterology, hematology-oncology and cardiology.





Latrobe Area Hospital is located 35 miles east of Pittsburgh nestled in the foothills of the beautiful Laurel Highlands. The 352 bed hospital serves 125,000 persons in its continually expanding facility offering full emergency, medical, surgical, pediatric, obstetric, orthopedic, intensive-coronary care, restorative, extended, mental health, ambulatory and preventive care services along with all ancillary services such as physical therapy, occupational therapy, respiratory therapy, audiology and speech pathology, etc. The local communities are serviced by the hospital based Latrobe Area Hospital Ambulance Service and the Ligonier Ambulance Service on a 24-hour basis. Over 80 physicians offer full diagnostic and therapeutic services at the full accredited institution.

The Latrobe Area Hospital — Jefferson Medical School affiliation started in 1974. Four residents a year are appointed to the three year Family Practice Residency program; also junior and senior medical students are assigned to the Family practice rotation.

The main Family Practice Unit is located in the Ambulatory Care Center, a separate building, connected by an enclosed walkway to the hospital. Three satellite offices are now open in the communities of Saltsburg, Pleasant Unity, and Blairsville. The units are directed by Joseph R. Govi, M.D. Junior and senior students are assigned to the units for a six-week period, and are provided a broad range of experience in community medicine, supplemented by an organized continuing education program, provided through the cooperation of the Department of Family Practice at Jefferson Medical College.

The Laurel Highlands Recreational Area offers 11 scenic ski centers, many fishing streams and hunting in abundance. Historical settings located nearby are Fort Ligonier



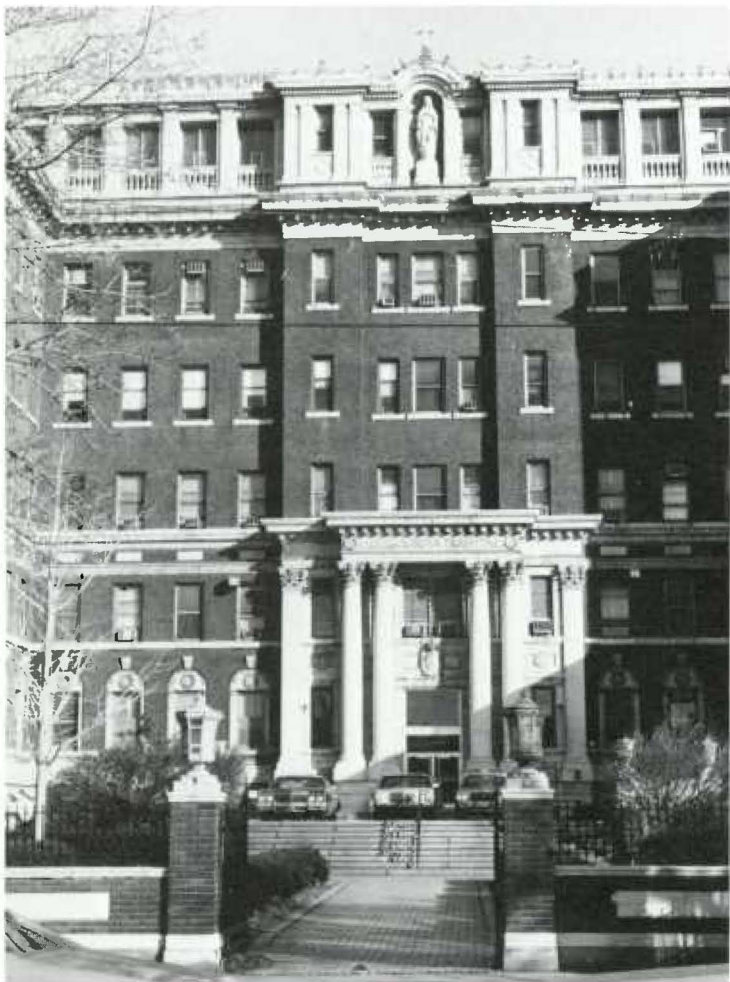
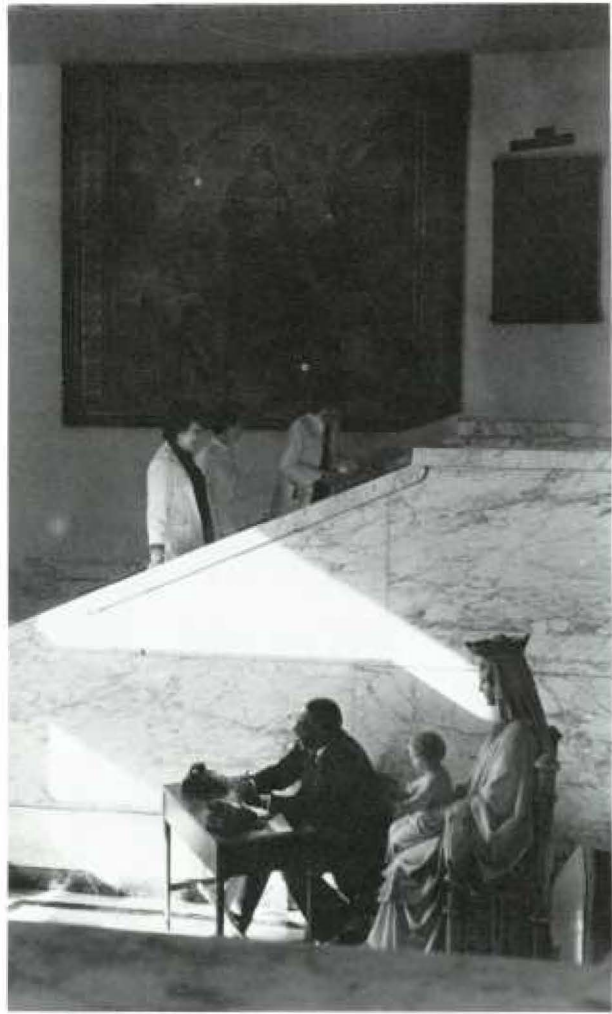
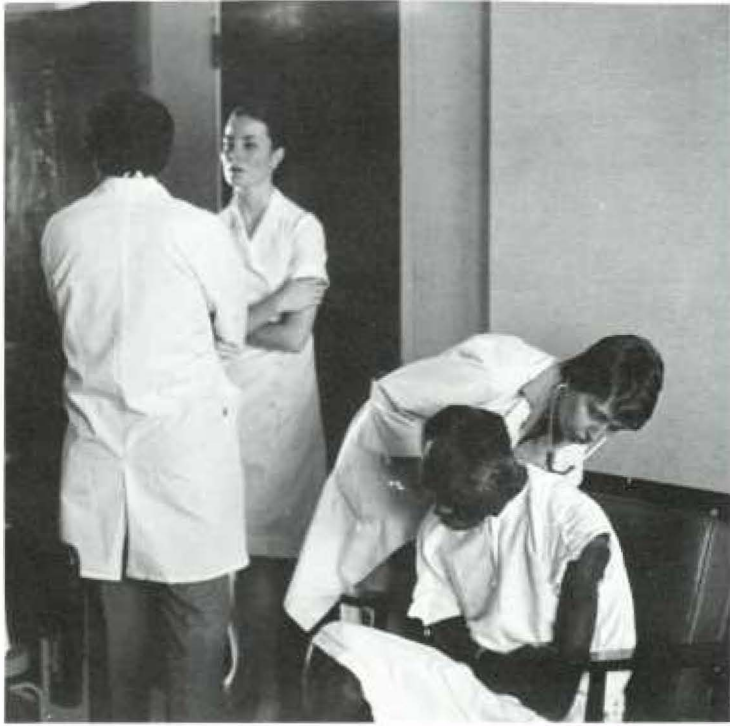
which offers colonial lore and tradition, Bushy Run Park of French fame and Fort Necessity, built by George Washington. Events, such as the Rolling Rock Steeplechase, P.G.A. golf tournaments and Ryder Cup Tournament at Laurel Valley Golf Club, St. Vincent College Summer Theatre and the Latrobe Air Show attract thousands yearly to the area. The Westmoreland and Pittsburgh Symphonies, Heinz Hall, Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre and Civic Light Opera offer a full complement of cultural activities. The sport fan can enjoy the World Champion Steelers, World Champion Pirates, or Penguin Hockey.

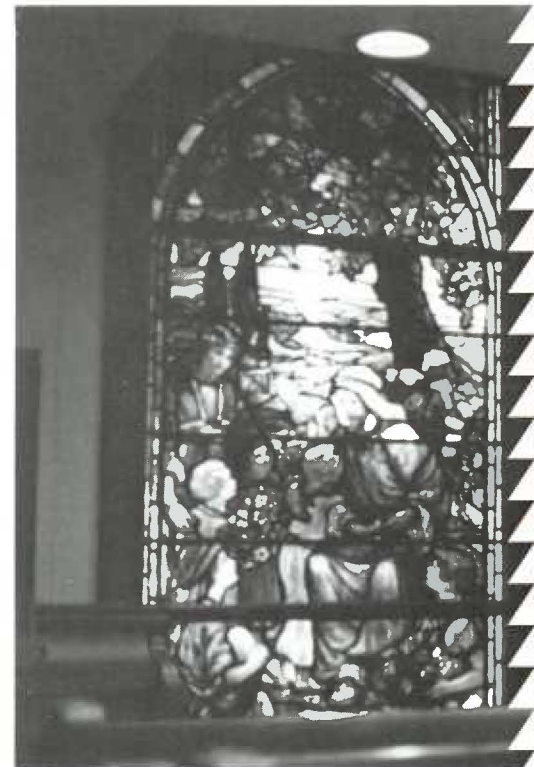


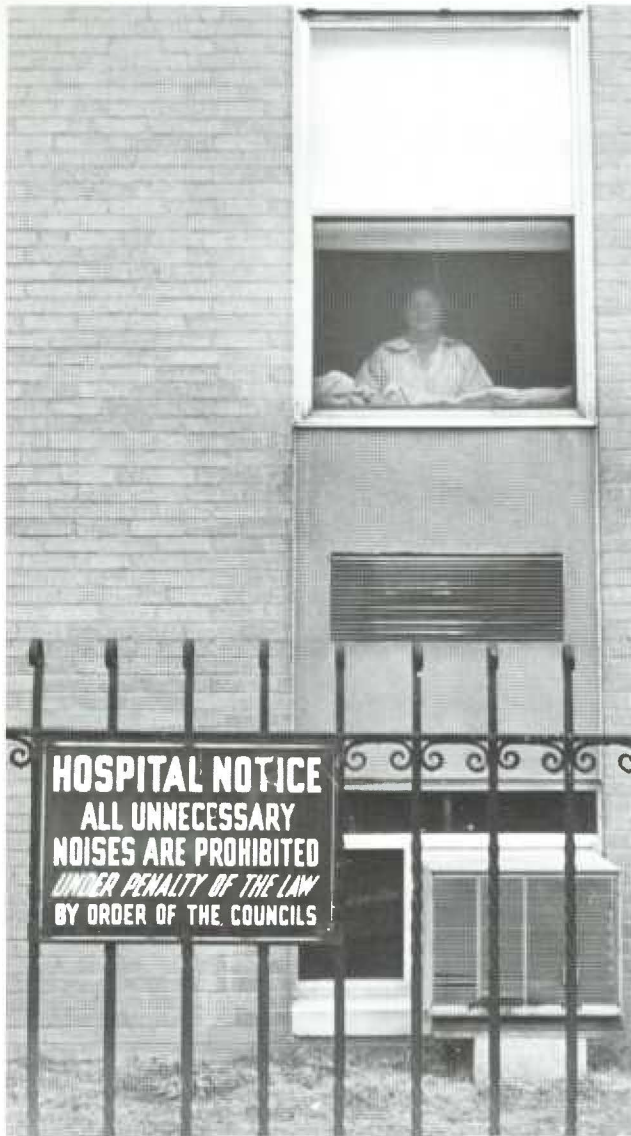

Methodist Hospital





Methodist Hospital has had a teaching affiliation with Jefferson Medical College dating back to the 1950's when medical students participated in clinical clerkships in Medicine, Surgery and Obstetrics and Gynecology at this South Philadelphia landmark. The association between the two institutions continued into the 60's with more students obtaining portions of their clinical training at this 249 bed community hospital.

As Jefferson Medical College expanded its enrollment, the need for well defined affiliate teaching facilities was evident and the Methodist Hospital signed a formal agreement with Jefferson in 1970, which has opened a broad range of clinical facilities to medical students in their clinical years.

The community hospital atmosphere at Methodist affords medical students, interns and residents the opportunity to see the clinical side of the practice and art of medicine in contradistinction to "the ivory tower" atmosphere that pervades the Medical centers to which they are exposed. It allows the house staff to feel they are a part of the medical team treating an individual patient rather than just another strange face.

As part of Methodist Hospital's continued service to the community, in the early part of 1979 Anthony J. Sattilaro, M.D., president, announced the opening of two new birthing units (one of which is pictured above), a new ambulatory care service, and a short procedure unit.



Eighty-seven years have passed since the doors of The Bryn Mawr Hospital opened in 1893. Medical techniques have changed over the years as hospitals suitably equipped for this new age of medicine have grown larger and more complex. With this growth has come an interdependence with other medical institutions. In 1972 an affiliation agreement was signed by The Bryn Mawr Hospital and Jefferson Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University. This agreement is an extension of The Bryn Mawr Hospital's commitment to medical education and has successfully strengthened effective teamwork. It has also provided for medical students and members of the House Staff a blending of the academic atmosphere of Thomas Jefferson University and the community hospital environment offered at The Bryn Mawr Hospital.
