CONTINUING RESOURCES

Serials are a continuing resource whose core concept is that the title is published at various intervals over a indeterminate period of time with each issue assigned enumeration at publisher's discretion.

A serial can be represented by either one or multiple bibliographic records

MULTIPLE BIBLIOGRAPHIC RECORDS?!

Yes, you will create a new bibliographic record each time the following occurs:

- **Title change**
- **Main entry change**
- **Translated title undergoes change in original title**
- **Change in corporate body used as a preferred title qualifier**
- **Changes in media type**
- **Edition statement**

MULTIPLE BIBLIOGRAPHIC RECORDS?!

... unless the change is one of these, then you just need to note the oddity in the record:

- Small title changes in grammar, hyphenation, articles, prepositions, conjunctions, etc. (can be either addition to or subtraction of)**
- Changes in enumeration, frequency, captions**

- *The Vista* is UCO's student newspaper that was established in 1903. It also happens to be the longest, continually published student newspaper in Oklahoma.
- *The Vista* is an important archival resource about its parent institution. Along with other local archival resources, UCO's catalogers have been responsible for ensuring this title's discoverability.

HOW TO CATALOG?

Multiple Records

- **Each record represents publisher name iteration with records linked together**
- **Holdings and items are easier to navigate on patron display side**

Single Record

- **All publisher name iterations listed in multiple 264 fields**
- **Century's worth of holdings and items complicate patron display**



The Latin Department at Central had the honor and pleasure of having Miss Newby of the Latin Department of the High School of Oklahoma City visit on the afternoon of March 17th. Miss Newby is a sister of Mr. Ernest Newby who was registrar of the University of Oklahoma for many years. At present she is rendering excellent service as teacher of Latin in Oklahoma City and came to Central hoping to get some new ideas to help her in her work. We trust she was not disappointed in her visit and we hope she will come again. At the meeting of the Classical Teachers of Oklahoma recently, Miss Newby was elected Secretary. At the same meeting the head of the Latin Department at Central was honored by being given an opportunity to deliver an address. We wondered at the time whether any good would come from our effort. Our wonder ceases now, however, for that address resulted in giving us a chance to entertain for a short time this wide awake, energetic teacher. May her visit result in good!

Or, as he phrased it recently in Assembly: "We have more requests for good teachers than we can supply at this time. There is a position at a good salary for every candidate who is prepared to hold such a position."

So then read requests from a large number of requests for Central trained teachers. One Superintendent wrote: "I already have ten of your teachers, and I am filling every vacancy this year with Central teachers."

All this sounds not only good, but true! Central is a college for the TRAINING OF TEACHERS NOW TO TEACH SCHOOLS WELL.

THE VALUE OF EDUCATION

[From the Indianapolis News.]
Figures presented by the Indianapolis bank show that of 5,000,000 children with no schooling their new state districts. Of 25,000,000 with an elementary schooling the number to gain education is 900. Two million with a high school education show a \$10,000,000 gained by 1,245. Out of 1,000,000 who go through college, 3,700 become distinguished in some walk of life.

Less than one per cent. of the men in America are college bred, yet this small percentage has furnished 55 per cent. of American Presidents, 54 per cent. of the Vice Presidents, 62 per cent. of the Secretaries of State, 50 per cent. of the Secretaries of Treasury, 42 per cent. of the attorneys General, 47 per cent. of the Speakers of the House, and 48 per cent. of the Supreme Court Justices.

With a college education the child has an average in life, with a high school education a chance in 1,000, with an elementary schooling a chance in 40,000, and with no schooling, one chance in 241,200.

Robert Frost, America's No. 1 Contemporary Poet

Although known as the chief interpreter of New England, Robert Frost was born in San Francisco, California, March 1873.

After graduating from high school at Lawrence, Massachusetts in 1891, Frost entered Dartmouth College, but stayed only a few months.

Robert was the son of seven children and his mother was a native of New Hampshire.

After leaving school, he began writing poetry, some of which appeared in "The Independent" but he mostly wrote to his family.

Because of the poems and general quality of his writings, many editors of magazines, newspapers, and books.

In 1907, his poems about the sea were published in "The Atlantic" and in 1912, his poem "The Road Not Taken" was published in "The Atlantic".

His first book of poems, "A Boy's Will", was published in 1913 and was well received as one of the best books of modern poetry.

His second book of poems, "North Haven", was published in 1917 and was also well received.

His third book of poems, "The Waste Land", was published in 1923 and was also well received.

New faculty posts created in budget

TAMLEQUAH, Okla. (AP)—Twenty Oklahoma colleges will receive 117 new faculty members in the \$718.6 million budget approved Friday by the State Regents for Higher Education.

Regents Chair George Kaiser said the new faculty positions will help reduce class sizes, improve academic counseling and quiet a common complaint that too many classes are taught by graduate students.

Also included are merit-based faculty salary increases, which average 5.1 percent and are as high as 15 percent.

AIDS vaccine to be tried by Salk

SAN DIEGO (AP)—Polio vaccine pioneer Jonas Salk said he will be the first uninfected person to be injected with his experimental AIDS vaccine.

Salk plans to inject himself before the end of the year, and said he hopes to show that the vaccine is safe for the next group of uninfected volunteers: celibate nuns and priests.

Instead of only preventing an initial infection from occurring, Salk's vaccine should boost the body's immune defenses after the AIDS virus has already been established.

The 76-year-old pioneer said he injected himself with a 1942 influenza vaccine as well as his 1952 polio vaccine.

Observance marks sixth change in university history

It's now official. Central State University became the University of Central Oklahoma in ceremonies at 9 a.m. Monday when President Bill Lillard and three students raised a UCO flag at Centennial Square.

Over 200 dignitaries, administrators, professors, staff and students gathered to witness the sixth name change for the university.

Student Association's Todd Dealy served as master of ceremonies and introduced Lillard as the first speaker. Lillard said this would mark the first time ever Oklahoma would be included in the name of the university.

Then he said it was about time to have Oklahoma in the name, the crowd responded with applause.

Governor George Nigh was the next speaker and he said the name change was important for UCO's future.

Nigh said his high school students used to ask him why they had to study Oklahoma history. He said it was important for people to know where they have been as they move into the future.

Although Governor David Walters was listed on the program, he did not attend. He sent a representative to read a document proclaiming July 1, 1991 as the University of Central Oklahoma Day.

Other congratulatory messages were added from Higher Education Chancellor Dr. Hans Brisch, Board of Regents of Oklahoma Colleges Past President Belva Howard, Oklahoma State Representative Ray Vaughn, Edmond Mayor Randall Shadd and Edmond Chamber of Commerce President Ruth Ross.

After the CSU flag had been taken down and the UCO flag raised, the crowd joined in singing the school's alma mater, which had been rewritten to reflect the name change. V

Summer enrollment hits all-time high

Summer enrollment at the University of Central Oklahoma is at an all-time high with 6,398 students enrolling, an increase of 366 over last summer's figure.

"I see that we're up, particularly at the sophomore, junior, senior and graduate level," said Darrell E. Gilliland, admissions and records director.

The number of students enrolled in all classifications has increased. Enrollment of graduate students has risen 5.7 percent, senior enrollment 8.3 percent, junior enrollment 7.1 percent, sophomore enrollment

6.8 percent and freshman enrollment 8 percent, Gilliland said.

"We seem to have more continuing students this year than we've had in other semesters. I'm talking about those that went in the spring semester and just go ahead and enroll in the summer term," he said.

Another possible reason for the increase, Gilliland said, is students who live in the Edmond area, but attend other institutions, return home for summer and take classes at UCO to transfer back to their schools.

The number of hours taken by students is used to calculate UCO's full-time equivalency (FTE), which is also the highest ever. FTE is the average hour load of all stu-

dents. For undergraduates the FTE is calculated by adding the total number of hours students are enrolled and dividing that number by 7.5. For graduate students the number of hours students are enrolled is divided by six. Graduate and undergraduate totals are then added to get the FTE figures.

"Essentially, that (FTE) will take all of your students, both part-time and full-time and give them a full-time equivalency," said Laura Tyrer, institutional research and planning assistant.

FTE figures can be used to determine the number of faculty needed, program budgeting, faculty/student ratios and the number of courses needed, Tyrer said. V


