#### **OUR MEMBERSHIP**

Membership of SJSU's SAA student chapter grew significantly in the 2020-2021 academic year. At the start of the Fall 2020 semester, the chapter had 198 registered members in Canvas, the SJSU iSchool's online learning portal.

Membership grew to 242 students at the start of the Spring semester. As of May 2021, SAASC is one of the largest iSchool student groups with 253 registered student members, second only to the ALASC Canvas group at 305\*.







The following is a list of the 97 SAASC full members for the 2020-2021 academic year. Full members are those who are also individuals of the Society of American Archivists in addition to the student chapter. This is also an increase from the 20 full members from the 2019-2020 academic year. The ratio of student chapter members also belonging to SAA increased from 10% to 38%.

#### **CHAPTER EVENTS**

The closure of physical locations due to the COVID-19 pandemic prevented SAASC from organizing in-person visits to archives and special collections during the 2020-2021 academic year. This did not prevent the chapter from arranging a variety of virtual presentations. SAASC provided students the opportunity to learn about and speak with professionals representing a range of archival interests. There were several benefits to pivoting to 100% virtual events: the number of events increased from the prior academic year; the geographic locations of presenters/archives expanded beyond California; more students were able to participate by logging into the live event or watching a recording later.

In addition to participating in SJSU iSchool student group presentations to new students at the start of each semester, SAASC collaborated with the SJSU REFORMA chapter to present two events in the Fall.

Each semester started with a formal SAASC member update meeting and ended with an informal virtual happy hour, giving members a chance to blow off steam, ask about courses, and hear about the e-portfolio experience.


#### **WEBSITE REDESIGN**

During the Summer of 2020, the SAASC website was completely redesigned and migrated from a Weebly server to the SJSU iSchool Wordpress server. In addition to the overall improvement to the visual look and feel, the new website improvements include:

- Increased homepage functionality


#### SOCIAL MEDIA PRESENCE

In 2020-2021, the social media team ramped up activity on SAASC social channels. To promote virtual events, the team posted related trivia in the week leading up to the event. Post-event, the team promoted the event recording available on the chapter's YouTube channel. With our virtual-only events in 2020-2021, our YouTube channel subscribers have increased by 36%.

The social media team also established a routine presence on Facebook and Twitter. Secretary/Social Media Manager, Sabrina Holecko, and Social Media Coordinator, Angela Brooks, highlighted archival topics and events as well as national celebrations such as Native American Heritage Month and Women's History Month. As a result, both Facebook and Twitter increased their number of subscribers. Based on the increased virtual interactions with our members, the chapter launched a new LinkedIn profile and group in March to connect with current students and alumni. In less than three months, the group has 25 members and continues



to grow.



#### CHAPTER LOGO REDESIGN

The SAASC logo redesign project was initiated at the beginning of February 2021. The aim of the project was to develop a memorable logo that would help increase club recognition and make a positive impression on future members.
