June 25, 1917

Dear Dad,

I received the check
thanks very much. I have
loaned some of it out
but am going to hold
back enough to go to
the races the 4th.

I am glad to hear that
the hotel is still full.
I guess there must be
quite a few people
coming to the town?
Tacoma is sure getting
it big. This army
food work is going
to take care of a

lot of men this summer.

I think I will go down and see the Helbergs to-morrow evening if I have time. I hope they are over here by this time because I don't want to go down for nothing.

I am in charge of the Co to-night. All the officers have their wives over here and are living off the reserve. But one must be in the reserve with the Co at all times. They take turns. Serjt DeBois is here now but came and told me he was going to bed.

The first Lt's wife is over here too and they are living off the reserve.
