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THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 1st day of February, 1935, by and between Prince Edward Warehouse Company, Inc., a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Virginia, party of the first part, and Newman Shevrolet Sales Corporation, a corporation, party of the second part:

That for an in consideration of the rental to be WITNESSETH: paid as herein provided by the party of the second part to the party of the first part, the said party of the first part by these presents leases, rents, and demises unto the party of the second part for a period of one year from this date upon the terms hereinafter specified, the following real estate, to-wit: that certain parcel of real estate together with the warehouse located thereon and situated in the Town of Farmville, Virginia, on the north side of Second Street in said town, and fronting 143 feet on Second Street, and extending back for a distance of 146 feet, more or less, to the property belonging to R. W. Mottley, together with the personal property situated in said warehouse building and belonging thereto, consisting of tobacco trucks, and other implements used in connection with the said warehouse; the said real estate being, moreover, the same real estate which was purchased by the party of the first part from H. A. Barrow and Florence H. Barrow, his wife, by deed dated October 19, 1927.

The said party of the second part agrees to use and occupy said premises for a storage house and display room for the sale of automobiles, and the said party of the second part agrees to pay as rental for said premises the following amounts, to-wit: FIFTY DOL-LARS (\$50.00) per month payable monthly during the continuance of this agreement, the first payment being due March 1, 1935.

The said party of the second part further agrees to use the property in a reasonable and careful manner, wear and tear excepted, and the said party of the second part further agrees to pay all

incidental expenses in connection with the use of said property, including water, lights, and sewerage, if needed, and the party of to the second part further agrees not to assign this rental agreement or sub-rent said premises except with the express consent of the party of the first part, provided, however that the party of the second part may rent said building as it may be needed to the Virginia Dark-Fired Tobacco Growers Marketing Association, Inc., during the season for tobacco sales, to be used by them as a warehouse in case such Association needs such property.

The said party of the second part further agrees to remain all damages above and beyond reasonable wear and tear that may be caused by it, its servants, and employees, to said building, fixtures, or implements herein leased; and the said party of the second part further agrees to vacate said premises on the first day of February, 1936, without further notice unless this lease is extended by the parties for a longer period.
