We are excited to announce Steely Library in collaboration with other NKU campus stakeholders, including the University Connect and Persist (UCAP) program, implemented a campus-wide pilot textbook program beginning fall semester 2020. Fifteen digital textbooks were purchased and integrated into Steely's library catalog.

Priority was given to textbooks that could be:

- Accessed electronically (in light of pandemic and remote learning)
- Multi or unlimited users, when possible
- Added to the library collection (had a university sharing license)
- Most requested titles through UCAP and the university bookstore
- Reached the most students according to real time enrollment counts
- Provided significant financial relief for our students
- Supported a diverse spectrum of students across all of NKU's departments

Purchasing Digital Textbooks: Final Counts

- **Books Purchased: 30**
- **Students Reached: 6,215**
- Money Saved: \$347,824.50

Library Spent: under \$10,000

- These numbers are a snapshot from 2 semesters only
 - Even more impactful because these texts are used for multiple semesters

Obstacles:

- Lack of communication between campus systems
 - lots of manual labor
 - Timing of decisions
- Competing interests between library and campus bookstore
- Digital licensing
 - Searched 500 titles to identify 30 for purchase (6%)

for them," said Smith "We started an initiative to keep a limited number of course textbooks on reserve to meet some of these needs, especially during the first weeks of school when some students are still waiting for textbook vouchers to come in or their books are on backorder. However, this is not a comprehensive solution – it is just a bandaid on the problem, which is that textbooks are too expensive and are a barrier to student success."

Studies have shown that approximately 67 percent of students simply don't purchase their textbooks if they are more than they can afford.

EKU Libraries Launches First Open-Access Textbook in African American Studies



As a school of opportunity, Eastern Kentucky University makes affordability a priority. That's why the <u>African and African</u> <u>American (AFA) studies department</u> and <u>EKU Libraries</u> have partnered to publish "Slavery to Liberation: the African American Experience," the university's first open-access textbook, and the first-ever open-access textbook in the field of African American studies. The Crabbe Library hosted a launch party for the book on Thursday, Feb. 20 in the Grand Reading Room.

EKU Faculty Receive Funding to Develop Zero Textbook Cost Courses



The EKU Faculty Senate Ad Hoc Committee on Open Textbook Resources is awarding \$23,000 in grant funding to three departments and four individual faculty who submitted proposals to develop zero textbook cost courses. This incentive grant program was made possible by an EKU Board of Regents Innovation Grant and will be implemented with ongoing technical and staff support provided by EKU Libraries.



- Provide support and training to Learning Designers on effective online and hybrid instruction, including availability and use of available templates and technology.




Learning Designers

Six Learning Designers will:

- Support faculty in aligning objectives, course content, and student assessments.
- Support faculty with creating assessments and rubrics.
- Support faculty in designing appropriate learning objectives for the course level (100 vs. 300 level courses).
- Support faculty with creating online exams and types of responses.
- Work to ensure faculty content is appropriate for 8-week modules.
- Check-in with faculty to ensure completion of class migration online.



The charge (DRAFT) of the Affordable Learning Steering Committee is to **facilitate efforts** to expand availability and use of **low- and / or no-cost high-quality educational resources** for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, with an initial focus on **undergraduate higher education**.

The steering committee coordinates the work of subgroups focusing on specific aspects of the overall project and makes recommendations to the Council on Postsecondary Education by way of the KYVL Leadership Team.

A member of the steering committee serves as a liaison to each subgroup.

 - Faculty champions


