STUDENT AID IS COMPOSED OF THE TWO FOLLOWING ACCOUNTS: (1) STUDENT TRANSPORTATION FAME REFUNDS, A SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF EQUALIZING STUDENT TRAVEL COSTS FROM HOME TO THE RESPECTIVE UNITS OF THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM AND (2) SCHOLARSHIPS AND PRIZES. TOTAL INCOME FOR THE TWO ACCOUNTS WAS \$10,156.99 AND EXPENDITURES AMOUNTED TO \$8,620.11.

C. AUXILIARY ENTERPRISES

INCLUDES LODGING AND FOOD SERVICE UNDER THREE DIVISIONS: (1) RESIDENCE HALLS AND LAW AND CO-OP HOUSES, (2) FAMILY HOUSING AND (3) BIOLOGICAL STATION. OPERATING INCOME WAS \$761,209.01, AND EXPENDITURES \$730,362.81 WITH A GAIN OF \$30,846.20. IN ADDITION TO OPERATING EXPENDITURES, BOND SERVICE AMOUNTED TO \$63,133.30. THE RESULT HAS BEEN A DECREASE IN NET CURRENT RESOURCES OF \$32,287.10.
