10	Whereas, The Associated Students of the University of Montana (ASUM) is bound by its Fiscal
11	Policy;
12	
13	Whereas, ASUM Fiscal Policy delineates all fiscal matters of the ASUM office and student
14	groups;
15	With D i it C2020 a matrix a completely revise the ASUM
16	Whereas, During the summer of 2020, a working group met to completely revise the ASUM
17	Fiscal Policy;
18	Whereas, ASUM is having difficulties with in how it oversees and funds Co-Curricular member
19 20	organizations;
20	organizations,
22	Whereas, Co-Curricular member organizations are different from other member organization as
23	they are associated with an academic and/or administrative unit on campus;
24	
25	Whereas, The Statement of Scope states that ASUM funds cannot be used for direct academic
26	support ¹ ;
27	
28	Whereas, That portion of the Statement of Scope is the only governance laid out for funding
29	groups that are directly associated with an academic and/or administrative unit;
30	
31	Whereas, Co-Curricular member organizations have created a gray area with this statement as
32	their funds are at times tied with academic departments but not in direct violation of the
33	Statement of Scope;
34	
35	Whereas, Article V, Section 4 of the ASUM bylaws states:
36	D. A Student group that requires enrollment within an academic course for membership
37	is ineligible for recognition by the Board on Member organizations.;
38	
39	Whereas, This portion of the bylaws governs member organizations for recognition and does not
40	lay out rules for funding;

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	42	Whereas, In prior years, funding Co-Curricular member organizations has been difficult due to
ł	43	their close relationship with departments at the University of Montana;

	45	Whereas, Aspects of Co-Curricular member organizations that could be viewed as subsidizing
	46	academics include but are not limited to: trips that a class takes, events put on by the department,
	47	and fundraising;
	48	The ASUM Senate has had
	49	Whereas, During the final budgeting session for Fiscal Year 2021, the ASUM Senate has had
	50	difficulty navigating these aspects of Co-Curricular member organizations;
	51	Whereas, This leads to a decrease or elimination of funding for student groups that were viewed
	52 53	or had aspects of being a Co-Curricular member organization;

	55	Whereas, This process resulted in inconsistent funding and was not effective at creating an equal
	56	standard;

	58	Whereas, ASUM values member organizations that are student lead, organized, and funded and
	59	wants to ensure that funds are supporting student lead initiatives;
	60	Whereas, Creating a Co-Curricular section governing these organizations will be beneficial in
	61 62	creating a fair and equitable process for funding all member organizations;

	74	would be a mechanism to ensure they become compliant with ASUM policy before receiving

	77	Therefore, Let It Be Resolved, That a new Section be added to Fiscal Policy numbered and titled
	78	Section 27.0 Co-Curricular Member Organizations;
	79	Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That subsection 27.1 be added to Fiscal Policy to read:
l	80 81	27.1 For the purposes of this section, a Co-Curricular member organization shall be
1 1	81. 82	defined as: a member organization that is associated with, receives support, or supports
:	83	an academic and/or administrative unit at the University of Montana;

Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That subsection 27.2 be added to Fiscal Policy to read: 85 27.2 ASUM funds shall not be used for the purpose of funding activities assigned by a 86 87 professor for a grade or that take place during designated class time. ASUM funds shall not be used for the purpose of materials, labor, supplies or any other expense that is the 88 89 result of planning or work assigned during designated class time or in exchange for a 90 grade. ASUM funds may be used for activities that result in extra credit outside of designated class time if the professor provides written or digital confirmation to the 91 office manager that the student/student group's grade does not in any way depend on the 92 ASUM funded activity.; 93

95 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That subsection 27.3 be added to Fiscal Policy to read:
96 27.3 All advisors of a Co-Curricular Member Organizations must adhere to Section
97 10.3 of Fiscal Policy. A Member Organization's advisor shall not use a pro-card to fund
98 student group activities in exchange for an ASUM refund without prior consultation with
99 the Business Manager and approval of the Student Group President.;

101 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That subsection 27.4 be added to Fiscal Policy to read: 27.4 Co-Curricular Member Organizations may receive monetary and non-monetary 102 donations from academic or administrative units If an academic or administrative unit 103 wishes to donate to a Co-Curricular Member Organization, they must receive approval 104 105 from both the student group and Business Manager. This approval must be in the form 106 of a written agreement prior to the transaction that discloses the purpose of the 107 donation. Monetary donations will be deposited into the ASUM Co-Curricular Member 108 Organization's account.;

110 Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That subsection 27.5 be added to Fiscal Policy to read: 111 27.5 No ASUM funds allocated to a Co-Curricular Member Organization may be deposited or transferred into a non-ASUM account. If this account happens to be outside 112 113 the University, the organization must seek prior approval from the Vice President of Operations and Finance before doing so. If a Co-Curricular Member Organization 114 115 wishes to make a purchase using both academic or administrative funding and ASUM 116 funds, the purchase must be made by the ASUM account and confirmation of the 117 commitment of additional funds must be communicated to the ASUM Office Manager or 118 the funds transferred to into the Co-Curricular member organization's ASUM Account 119 prior to the purchase.; 120

121Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That subsection 27.6 be added to Fiscal Policy to read:12227.6 If a member organization is found to have a requirement of an academic course123after they have been recognized, that organization may not be denied funding due to this124issue alone. The organization will not be reimbursed or allowed to use ASUM funds until125there is no class requirement to join the organization. The Board on Member126Organizations will approve the member organization's status to receive the127previously allocated funds.;
