7	Whereas, At the November 5 th , 2020 ASUM meeting, the Associated Students of the University
8 9	of Montana (ASUM) Senate addressed concerns raised about anti-Black and homophobic stickers placed on UDash bus stops around campus;
10	
11	Whereas, In this same meeting, ASUM determined that this behavior was also occurring within
12 13	the residence halls and has been an area of concern for Residence Life employees;
14	Whereas, The Student Political Action Committee's Legislative Priority Survey rendered
15	alarming results, including commentary from students that was abrasively anti-Semitic;

17	Whereas, Waterworks Hill, a popular Missoula landmark, was recently vandalized with white
18	supremacist, Nazi symbolism ¹ ;
19	Whenever As of 2020, the Southam Derivity Levis Contar identified and two-lead six generate hote
20 21	Whereas, As of 2020, the Southern Poverty Law Center identified and tracked six separate hate groups within the state of Montana, including several state-wide movements, with higher hate
22	groups per capita compared to surrounding states ² ;
23	
24	Whereas, White supremacist behavior and actions negatively impact the entire campus
25	community and further suppress and oppress minority communities;
26	
27	Whereas, ASUM's core values include inclusion, diversity, and advocacy;
28	
29	Therefore, Let It Be Resolved, That the ASUM Senate formally condemns white supremacy,
30	bigotry, and racism both on campus and in the greater Missoula community and calls upon
31	campus leaders to do the same;
32	
33	Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That ASUM urges that those who incite violence be held
34	accountable and fully brought to justice under proper means, as well as urges that the University
35	further investigate covert on-campus actors and/or groups that may be perpetuating this issue;

37 38	Therefore, Let It Be Further Resolved, That ASUM vows to work further with student groups and leaders promoting diversity, equity, and inclusion to further the cause of unity on campus;
