Whereas, Implementing a plastic bag ban at UM would reduce the campus' and Missoula's carbon footprint, and emissions, while fostering zero waste initiatives;	
Whereas, By initiating a plastic bag ban, UM will advance its core value of sustainability outlined in its 2020 Strategic Plan and empower students to pursue sustainability at an individual level;	ıl
