

#### Dear Alumni and Friends:

With each new and returning student filling classrooms and hallways, the excitement of the new school year hangs heavy and electric in the air. I reflect upon the activities of the summer and look forward to the challenges that lie ahead.

The month of July was busy as I had the privilege of representing Loma Linda University School of Nursing at three meetings. The first was the Association of Seventh-day Adventist Nurses (ASDAN). The association held its annual retreat in Welches, Oregon, where I reported on my meeting with Ira Magaziner and the White Taskforce on Health. I also presented research completed by School of Nursing faculty.

Next, I attended the second Congress of Minority Nurse Leaders held in Washington, D.C., July 21 to 23. The first congress examined issues in nursing practice and nursing education, as well as policy and legislation. The major outcome of the first congress was the development of an action agenda for minority nurses and individual plans. The second congress built on the stepping stones of the first, with the theme "Caring for the Emerging Majority: Creating a New Diversity in Nurse Leadership."

I was encouraged and motivated as school representatives shared the progress they are seeing in their own schools, and I was pleased to share what we are doing. I told them about several programs, including a weekend retreat for faculty on "Appreciating Cultural Diversity" with speaker Dr. David Augsburger. Also, there is a standing committee on diversity which functions to increase cultural sensitivity and improve cross-cultural relationships. Other areas discussed at the congress included monitoring retention and attrition records, as well as attempts to increase diversity by recruiting minority faculty for teaching and leadership positions.

At the end of July, I returned to the West Coast for the AHCPR Western Regional Invitational Conference in San Francisco, held July 30 and 31. This conference was designed to let nurse leaders know about a federal initiative for developing standards of care, including issues such as pain management after surgery, and prevention and care of pressure sores and urinary incontinence.

The School of Nursing is in the process of developing a new community-based family nurse practitioner program that will meet the needs of primary health-care programs as our country goes into health-care reform. I will keep you updated on our progress.

With so many possibilities for nurses, I am delighted to encourage students in their pursuit of this fine field, and I hope that you also have found genuine satisfaction in your chosen profession.

# Graduate Program "Loses" Long-time Friend

Maybe Lois Van Cleve, RN, PhD, said it best when she wrote to the graduate alumni, "It seems inconceivable that Clarice Woodward is retiring, and we can't imagine the tremendous void she will leave behind."

Dr. Van Cleve continued, "However, she seems insistent, and, after 30 years of outstanding service, I suppose this change is inevitable."

Ms. Woodward made her transition to retirement on June 30, 1993. An esteemed member of the School of Nursing faculty since 1962, she has served in a number of faculty and administrative roles, fulfilling each role with distinction.

She moved up the professional ladder and, since 1975, has had the rank of professor with tenure. She has served as faculty in the undergraduate program, as well as contin-

uing education director, graduate program advisor, associate chair, and coordinator of clinical agencies for the School of Nursing.

She has had a key role on all of the important committees of the school and has coordinated new options within the graduate program.

Ms. Woodward has been the recipient of a number of awards including: Nurse of the Year (ASDAN, 1972); University Alumnus (LLU, 1985); in 1988, the Gamma Alpha Chapter of the Sigma Theta Tau nursing honor society established the "Clarice Woodward Award for Excellence in Writing," an award given annually; The Distinguished Service Award (LLU School of Nursing, 1992); Alumnus of the Year (LLU School of Nursing, 1993); and Emeritus

A tireless leader and role model, Ms. Woodward's experience, wisdom, and grace have benefitted students and faculty.

At a special luncheon on June 11, 1993, attendees had the opportunity to recognize Ms. Woodward with words and gifts. Her daughters, Gwen Taylor and Cathy Kolin, as well as Dr. Van Cleve, gave tributes. Patty Pothier presented her with a scrapbook of memories, and Marilyn Herrmann, PhD, presented her with a gift from the School of Nursing faculty and staff.

Helen King, RN, PhD, dean of the school, ended with a special tribute and presented the newly established "Clarice Woodward Graduate Endowment Fund." Graduate alumni, faculty, friends, and family of Ms. Woodward gave \$10,000 in a few weeks' time to establish this endowment.

The fund was not restricted when presented so that Ms. Woodward could decide what she wanted to restrict the endowment funds for.

Later in the summer, an alumnus passed away, leaving a \$5,000 unrestricted gift to the School of Nursing which was added to the endowment fund. With just over \$15,000 total, this is the first endowment fund to be designated for the graduate program.

Ms. Woodward is dearly missed in the School of Nursing, but reports that she is enjoying the extra time she has for reading, gardening, and family activities. She says, "I'm just taking life a little slower."

Her life continues to focus on helping others. She volunteers at the new Loma Linda University Children's Hospital and plans to volunteer to help with an adult literacy program.

# New Associate Dean Appointed

On July 1, 1993, Lois Van Cleve, RN, PhD, was appointed associate dean and director of the graduate program in the School of Nursing.

A member of the faculty since 1976, Dr. Van Cleve has held various positions. She began working in the undergraduate program as an assistant professor and lead teacher in parent/child nursing.

In 1982, she received the rank of associate professor. Three years later, in 1985, she began teaching in the graduate program for "The Growing Family" major and was named chair of the department of parent/child nursing. In 1988, she received the rank of professor.

Dr. Van Cleve received her bachelor of science degree in nursing in 1961 from Columbia Union College in Takoma Park, Maryland, and her master of science degree in nursing from Loma Linda University in 1964. In 1985, she received her PhD in education from Claremont Graduate School.

Her areas of focus include: life cycle development, particularly for adolescent and adult women; family structure and dynamics; and economics of higher education.

From 1990 to 1992, she did post-doctoral studies at the University of California, San Francisco, School of Nursing, focusing on pain in children.

Active in research since 1985, Dr. Van Cleve's primary research focus has been in pain assessment and management in infants and children.

Most recent studies in which she was principle investigator have included: pain responses in hospitalized children, ages one month to twelve years, to IV starts and venipuncture; the responses of hospitalized neonates to IV starts and venipuncture; and "Pain Location: Validity and Reliability of Body Outline Markings by Hospitalized Four- to Seven-year-old Children."

A collaborative longitudinal study with the San Bernardino Health Department is examining teen-parenting competence, self esteem, and social support when an infant is one month, six months, 12 months, and 18 months.

The recipient of a host of honors and awards, Dr. Van Cleve is active in many professional association and community activities. She has presented numerous papers and posters, and articles from her research have been published in peer-reviewed journals.

The School of Nursing is pleased have someone as competent as Dr. Van Cleve to oversee the graduate nursing program.



# The House of Thrift: An Update

Creative problem solving is nothing new for Joni Jones, manager of the House of Thrift (HOT), owned and operated by the Nurses Alumni Association.

HOT's main purpose is to accept donated items and sell them. Results are two fold: individuals can buy quality goods inexpensively, and the Nurses Alumni Association receives income to help the School of Nursing. The Association then awards student scholarships and helps to finance special projects.

By utilizing both volunteers and paid employees, HOT endeavors to maximize profits. However, finding volunteers can be a challenge.

Leave it to Ms. Jones to find a solution. She has begun using volunteers who are required by the State of California to do community service as punishment for non-violent crimes or to pay off fines. One lady had received a speeding ticket that she couldn't pay. As punishment, she was sent to HOT. She enjoyed the work so much and did such an excellent job that Ms. Jones ultimately hired her on as a full-time employee.

Unfortunately, Ms. Jones cannot pay everyone. She needs volunteers to make HOT financially feasible. Says Ms. Jones, "On the surface, working here isn't glamorous, but once you get into it, it is very

rewarding."

If you are interested in volunteer work, or know of someone else who might be interested, please call Ms. Jones at 796-2812.

HOT is always looking for donated items. "Many people only donate clothing, and while we appreciate clothing, we want people to know that our scope is much wider," Ms. Jones says.

HOT needs working electrical appliances (i.e. televisions, microwaves, and kitchen appliances), baby toys and furniture, books, dishes, lamps, paintings, and furniture (but no mattresses).

For the HOT boutique, Ms. Jones can always use old china, jewelry, and any antiques. She works closely with antique dealers in the Loma Linda area to find the best possible prices for valuable items.

Ms. Jones points out that it is sometimes more advantageous for people to donate their items to HOT rather than have a garage sale. When an item is donated, the donor can take 20 percent of the item's retail price as a tax deduction.

It really doesn't take very many items to have a sizable deduction. If, on the other hand, the individual holds a garage sale, he or she is required by law to claim any money made as income and could possibly pay taxes on it.

# Twenty Nursing Students Receive Scholarships

The Loma Linda University School of Nursing hosted its annual Awards Celebration in June of 1993, awarding \$33,500 in scholarships to 20 nursing students.

The Class of '67 was pleased to award two \$500 scholarships, based largely on merit. Since the scholarship endowment is only three years old, this serves as a fine beginning.

The first scholarships was awarded to Susan McCoy because of her commitment to nursing excellence, concern for health promotion, and volunteerism. Faculty in the School of Nursing characterized Ms. McCoy as an outstanding student in both the clinical and theoretical components of nursing with an outstanding grade point average. She is involved in the community through volunteer work with the American Cancer Society.

The second recipient of a \$500 scholarship from the Class of '67 was Deborah Smoter. She was selected because the faculty viewed her as demonstrating leadership potential. She took seriously her position on the Undergraduate Faculty Council. A consistently high grade point average and a dedication to the nursing profession made Deborah a good candidate for this award.





Vivien Dee '66, PhD, director of nursing and associate hospital administrator at the UCLA Neuropsychiatric Institute and Hospital, received the 1992 Excellence in Psychiatric Nursing Award presented by the American Psychiatric Nurses Association.

Anita Pearson Schultz '65, RN, MS, believes that the public often underestimates the responsibilities of school nurses. Anita should know. She works at Fontana High School in Southern California where she makes sure the nurses office isn't just a "band-aid station."

However, Anita surpassed even the most optimistic expectations of a school nurse when she recently wrote and received a \$400,000 grant on behalf of the school from the State of California.

When the State of California made grant monies available to fund Healthy Start Programs, Anita decided to apply. The objective of Healthy Start is to make public services more easily accessible to multi-need families, and to have all services located in one place.

Fontana High School already has many components in place. For instance, a physician volunteers one day a week to diagnose and prescribe medications to students who are ill. There is a community center on campus where students and families can receive clothing. Furthermore, Anita had worked with the surrounding business community to work out special "deals." One example is Thrifty Drug, which has agreed to fill prescriptions for \$4 over cost, thus making health care more affordable for the students.

Fontana's application was one of 755 applications received from throughout the state. Fontana High School received one of the twenty-five operational grants that were given. Other grants were given for program planning. The \$400,000 grant will be paid over a three-year period.

The funds will enable the school to contract public services on campus to further help impoverished families. Included will be a full-time Community Liaison and a full-time Family Councilor. A family nurse practitioner will come two days a week. Also, an individual from child

protective services, as well as the department social services, will be available two days a week. Parenting and other classes will be offered. The plan is to serve 75 families the first year and 100 each year following. Anita will coordinate the program.

She credits much of the program's success to administration. She says, "I am fortunate to work with a very supportive administration. If they weren't so progressive, this wouldn't be happening."


After graduating from Loma Linda University, Anita took 36 hours above her Bachelor of Science to become credentialed as a school nurse. This is a requirement for nurses working in California schools. In 1968, Anita received her masters in counseling and guidance from Andrews University. Next she received her masters in nursing administration from California State, Dominguz Hills. Anita has served the public school system for twelve years.

Anita is married to Mark Shultz. They have a 21 year old son, Monty, who is an engineering major at Walla Walla College. Their 18-year-old daughter, Angie, is studying at Bogenhofen, Austria, this year.

#### Research

Research: In each issue of Loma Linda Nurse, we will highlight the research abstract of a faculty member from the School of Nursing. This issue will focus on the research of Elizabeth Bossert, DNS, RN, associate professor and chair of the parent-child nursing department in the school's graduate and undergraduate programs.

Studies of the effectiveness of dilute heparin versus normal saline as a flush solution for maintaining patency in IV locks (heparin locks) in adults (prompted by concerns pertaining to heparin induced thrombocytopenia and drug incompatibilities) have demonstrated little difference in the effectiveness of the two solutions. However, this information cannot be assumed to be directly applicable to the care of hospitalized children, primarily due to the smaller catheter sizes needed by children. Currently, only four small studies have examined the use of dilute heparin versus normal saline in hospitalized children, with conflicting results.

Therefore, a multi-site study to compare saline to heparinized saline (10 units/ml) as a flush solution for maintaining patency of IV locks (heparin locks) in children has been developed. A nonprobability, consecutive sample of 1,250 children will be obtained from five hospitals in Southern California (Loma Linda University Medical Center, Children's Hospital of Orange County, Children's Hospital Los Angeles, Kaiser Permanente Los Angeles, and Queen of Angels-Hollywood Presbyterian). Eligible subjects will be 38 weeks gestation through 12 years of age inclusive, inpatients with an order for an IV lock, and will not be receiving investigational drug(s) or heparin for a medical diagnosis.

It is expected that the findings from this study will benefit sick children in the hospital by identifying which method of IV-lock care is more safe and effective. If normal saline is equally or more effective than heparinized saline, then the risk of exposing children to the side effects of heparin may be eliminated.

and became the first resident at Cherry Blossom Cottage. She had a very good memory until the very last and remembered many of the doctors and medical students she had worked with over the years.

Olive M. Peckover Foxeley, '33WM, was born April 25, 1909, and died on July 11, 1993.

Lydia Steinert, '34WM, died August 14, 1993, at the age of 88.

Esther L. Healzer, '37LL, was born January 9, 1912, in LaCrosse, Kansas, to John George and Lizzie Healzer. The 7th of 10 children, she attended country school in LaCrosse and later graduated from Broadview Academy in Illinois.

In 1934, Esther came from the midwest to enter nurse's training at Loma Linda University. There were 16 students in her class. They were the first class that was required to have a year of college before admittance. Single students were required to live in the dormitory. Chaperons on dates and long hair were part of the curriculum. Students wore the traditional uniform of stripes with a starched white apron. They worked eight hours and took three hours of class each day. Still they found time to have fun.

Some of her instructors were: Mrs.Bowers, Miss Voltz, Mrs. Graf, and Miss Freda Lutz, operating room supervisor, who showed a special interest and to this day is invited to class reunions.

After she graduated in 1937, Esther stayed in Loma Linda working as head nurse and clinical instructor. Her first salary was \$80 a month.

In January of 1944, she moved to Los Angeles taking a position as supervisor and clinical instructor at White Memorial Medical Center caring for patients on the EENT, Urology and Orthopedic Services. She was an excellent role model for the students and provided an environment where good nursing care was given. Esther was highly respected by the Medical Staff for her excellence in care. Dr. Clyde

Nash, an orthopedic surgeon, stated that Esther always wanted the best for her patients and was very skillful in the operation of orthopedic equipment. Esther's contribution to orthopedic medicine came through her device called "The Healzer Sling" which was used for supporting an arm during surgery.

Her employees appreciated her support and interest. They placed confidence in her and saw that everyone did their part to make it easier for each one. Often she prepared treats for them at holiday time and many other occasions.

Grace Schaefler, Director of Nurses, said of Esther: "She was a super nurse and the patient's advocate. Esther was always immaculate in uniform and required the same of her staff. She was a very private person, not demonstrative, yet tenderhearted about others' misfortunes. A good giver but not a good receiver, Esther fought for others when necessary."

In 1950, Esther was given a leave of absence to obtain a bachelor of science degree in nursing at Pacific Union College. Finishing that in 1951, she returned to the White Memorial Medical Center. She was a long-time member and supporter of the White Memorial Church. She also became a member of the prestigious Kathryn Jensen Nelson Society.

In 1976, Esther retired in Loma Linda to be near her sister, Ruth. In her retirement years, she enjoyed many travelling experiences in and out of the United States. These were overshadowed only by applying for and receiving her first driver's license in 1991 at the age of 79, a long way from operating a tractor on the farm in Kansas.

We remember Esther as a fun-loving girl who liked to ice skate and had a reputation for "cutting a mean blade." She was an excellent cook—known for her German Chocolate Cake, Chocolate Chip Cookies, and "Lemon Lush" which she fixed for birthdays and special family occasions. Her sport was baseball. She later became a Dodger Fan. Many a story is

told of her disappearance at a game and reappearance with a signed ball. She took an avid interest in current events and would discuss them in depth. Esther was loyal to the things she believed in.

May 31, 1993, we said "goodbye" to Esther. She will be remembered and missed by her family, classmates,

and relatives.

Esther Marie Smith (Roush) Nicodemus, '37WM, passed away February 13, 1992, the last surviver of five siblings (two brothers and two sisters). From a full Swedish family, Esther was born in Escondido, California, where her family had a 300-acre farm. The farm was where a large shopping center now sits. Later the family moved to Turlock, California, where they bought a new farm roughly the same size.

Esther attended Loma Linda University. After graduating, she served in the Armed Forces in World War II in the South Pacific in such places as New Guinea and Australia. During this time she contracted Dengue Fever and almost died. Interestingly her hair, which had always been dark, turned blond as a result of this strange disease. While in the military, she married and had children. Esther moved to Salinas in Sprekles where her sister, Florence Thomas, SN'11, and her husband, Hearley Homer Thomas, '29SM, lived.

Esther married Albert Nicodemus after the death of her first husband. She continued to work as a nurse for many years through the Monterey County system hospital in Salinas. Together they also managed apartments. The Nicodemus' often made trips to the Hoopa Indian Reservation near Medford, Oregon. They would

distribute loads of clothing, and Albert loved to fish the Yreka River near the reservation.
