Warm Greetings:

Last school year was positive and full of growth. With anticipation, we prepare and look forward to another.

Builders have been busy giving the Learning Resource Center a whole new look. Stage One of the lab is complete, and we are well into Stage Two. The Alumni Association gave scholarships totaling \$40,000, and an additional \$45,000 was given to 44 students from other school-sponsored scholarships. The Class of 1967 awarded their first student scholarship of \$500 after working diligently for 18 months to establish a class endowment. Finally, another faculty member completed the doctoral degree; 52% of our faculty are now doctorally prepared. You've enabled the accomplishment of much.

In all, you donated \$268,800 to the School of Nursing. This milestone is a significant increase over previous years. As you give more of your time and resources each year, I can't help but be amazed and touched by your display of loyalty and support for the students and faculty.


The Alumni Association continues to be a blessing to the School. They recently revised their by-laws which have been included in this issue of *Loma Linda Nurse*. Your alumni board is busy planning Alumni Weekend, so be sure to mark April 3-5 on your calendar! Under the management of Joni Jones, the House of Thrift thrives, bringing significant resources to the students of the School. Even more exciting is the creative way Joni has expanded the thrift store's mission to include community outreach.

A new relationship was recently formed with Loma Linda University Medical Center. The joint contract results in increased professional opportunities for the nursing faculty. This should be positive for the Medical Center as well as the school. Examples are the opportunity to collaborate in clinical research, to participate in staff development, and to serve as consultants.

Fall classes have started, and enrollment is at an all time high with 260 students. This is an increase of 17 students over last year. Esther Valenzuela, director of marketing, has done a commendable job working with prospective students. Also, the graduate program has 65 students enrolled. The reputation of each alumnus is certainly a great asset, as well, to the recruitment process.

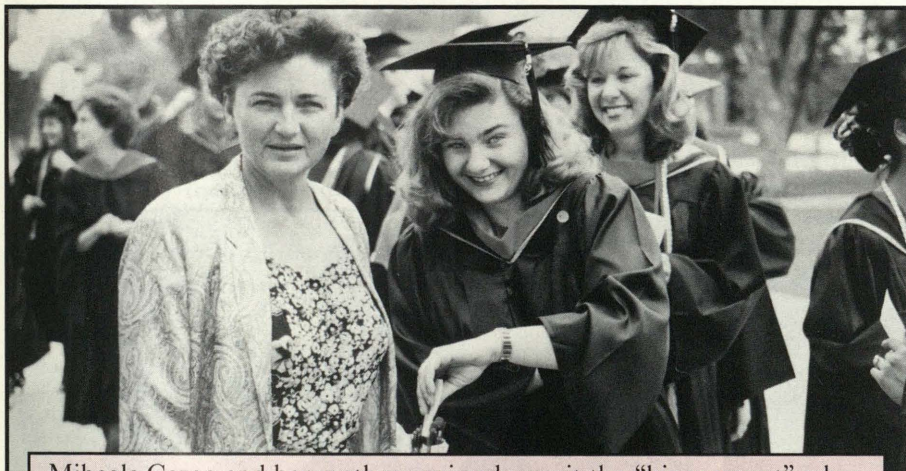

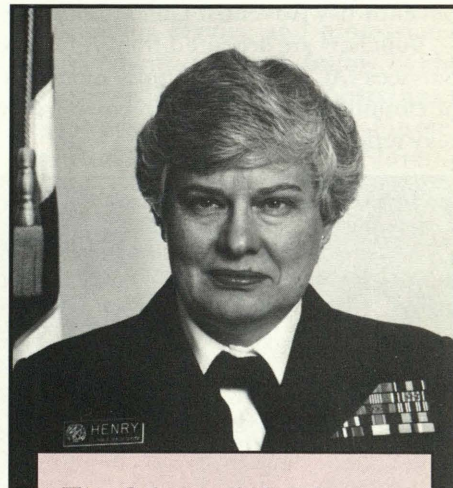

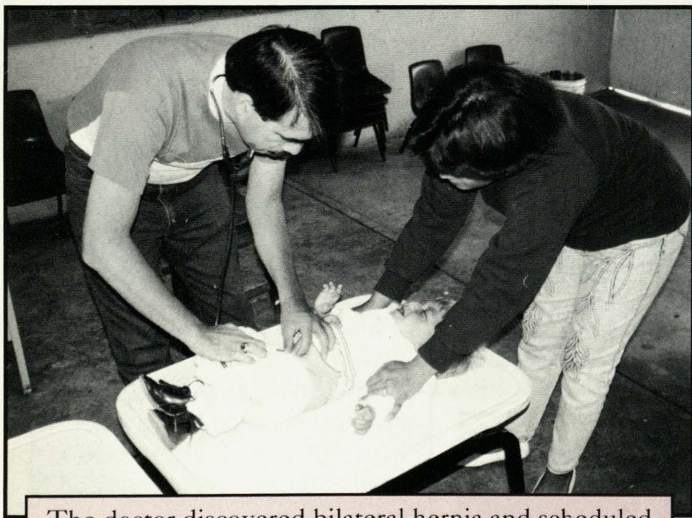
In addition, support is given to various mission projects. The House of Thrift is active in filling needs, and donates goods to the Dorcas Society in Banning, California. Items are also given to the homeless and battered women's homes in San Bernardino, and to Friendship Mission, an organization in Sierra Vista, Arizona, which administers an orphanage and rest home in Mexico. In April, almost \$150,000 worth of goods were given to Friendship Mission from over-

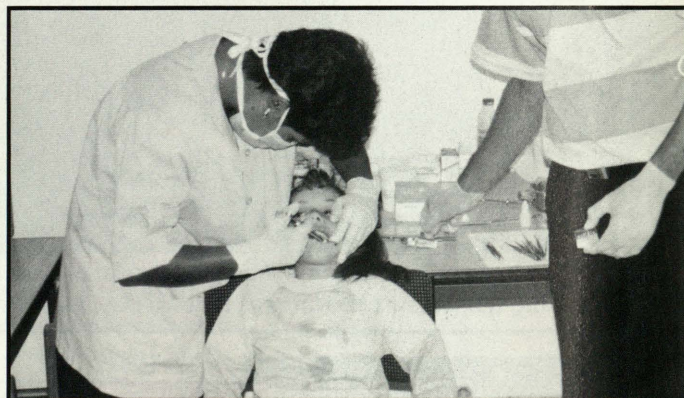

Art was a water resources engineer until he retired, and Anita worked in oral surgery at the LLU Dental School for 15 years.

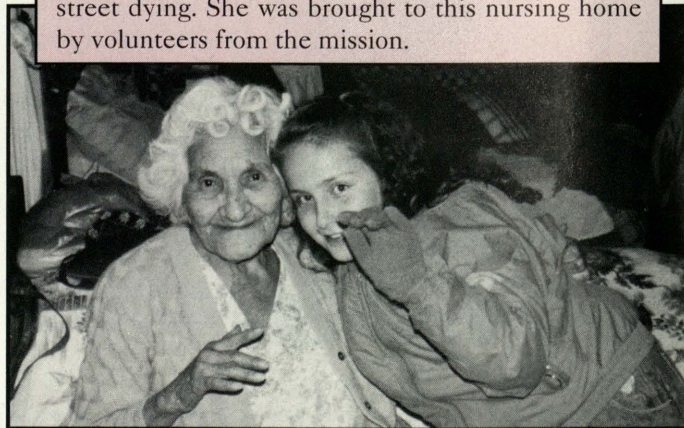
Another willing volunteer, Barb Bozzo, prices all the infant and children's clothing.

A mother of four grown children of her own, Barb also has a realistic knowledge of pricing. She says she is pleased with the quality of the donated items. "Many beautiful outfits look as if they've never been worn."

The House of Thrift provides clothing and supplies for the Friendship Mission, centered in Sierra Vista, Arizona. In turn, the mission distributes the items in Mexico and provides other services, such as medical and dental care, to the needy.

Unfortunately, many people are reluctant to volunteer because they don't know how they could be helpful," explains Joni. "I really try to find a niche for my volunteers...an area where help is need, but where the volunteer can use their unique talents.

Alumna wins Jessie M. Scott award

Nancy Bergstrom, PhD, RN, FAAN, professor, University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) College of Nursing, is the 1992 recipient of the Jessie M. Scott Award, which honors a registered nurse whose accomplishments in a field of practice, education, or research, demonstrate the interdependence of these elements and their significance for the improvement of nursing and health care.

Dr. Bergstrom GS68 is being recognized for her landmark research as the principal investigator in a study of the "nursing assessment of pressure sore risk."

Her three-year study, which concluded in July 1991, followed about 1,200 patients in a variety of health care settings and was funded by a million-dollar federal grant.

It was the first study to investigate and gather evidence to validate the Braden Scale, which looks at "hard" data such as blood pressure, body weight, temperature and nutritional status as factors in the development of pressure sores.

The Braden Scale was originally developed by Barbara Braden, PhD, RN, BSN, MS, Professor at the Creighton University School of Nursing. Besides leading to better patient care, use of the scale is expected to save many times the cost of its development by directing the use of more expensive special mattresses to high risk patients, and reducing the chance of longer hospital stays due to complications from pressure sores. Pressure sores affect six to fifteen percent of all hospitalized patients and up to 35 percent of nursing home residents.

Dr. Bergstrom has been a nurse educator for more than twenty years, currently in the master's program at UNMC, teaching advanced research methods and nursing theory. She also lectures in the doctoral program and is a thesis/project advisor for graduate students, where she is a popular and respected educator. In 1989 she

received the UNMC Outstanding Teacher Award. The nominations are generated by students themselves.

"When her teaching assignment was changed last year to the doctoral program, master's students begged to have her return to teaching the master's research courses," writes Mara Baun, DNSc, FAAN, professor and Associate Dean, UNMC College of Nursing.

She has served as a reviewer for various textbooks, and as a peer reviewer for several professional journals. More than 25 of her own articles have been published in journals, and she has contributed chapters to such books as *Principles of Critical Care Medicine*, and *Research Methods for Validating Nursing Diagnoses*.

Together with Dr. Braden, she has produced a video to educate staff in assessing pressure sore risk according to the Braden Scale. She has worked as a consultant to the Joint Commission for the Accreditation of Hospitals (JCAH), and to the National Institutes of Health (NIH) where she has been appointed to the National Center for Nursing Research Priority Expert Panel. She was named chair of the Agency for Health Care Policy and Research (AHCPR) Guideline Development Panel which released its guideline for early treatment of pressure sores earlier this year.

Dr. Bergstrom has also done research on complications of tube feedings, nutrition in the elderly, and the effects of animal companionship on the institutionalized elderly.

Dr. Bergstrom received her BSN from Columbia Union College, Takoma Park, MD in 1965, completed her MSN from Loma Linda University, Loma Linda, CA, in 1968, and earned her PhD in Clinical Nursing Research in 1981 from University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. She has held a variety of teaching positions at UNMC since 1981.

In 1991 the National Pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel awarded Dr. Bergstrom the first Kosiak Award, and she was

honored by the University of Michigan Medical Center Alumni Society for outstanding service and professional achievement. She is a fellow of the American Academy of Nursing, a member of the Nebraska Nurses Association, the Midwest Nursing Research Society, and the Gamma Pi Chapter of Sigma Theta Tau International.

grant on "long-term care and minority aging," administered by The National Institute on Aging and the National Center for Nursing Research. Dr. Jones was identified by the Federal Government as "one of the experts in the area of long-term care and minority aging" in part because of research she is doing in this area. Currently, she has requested funding from the National Center for Nursing Research for a study of Asian American women caring for elderly parents. Dr. Jones also was asked to chair an additional review session by teleconference two weeks later.

Margaret Christenson Fryling '53B has lived in Brazil with her husband, Virgil, for eight years. Recently they moved to a college near Salvador, Brazil, and are beginning to build up the Music Department which has never "gotten off its feet." Although she's teaching music, Margaret says, "I often get called upon for something in the line of nursing as there is only one RN on this large campus. I think fondly of my days at Loma Linda, and want to thank you, as an alumnus, for the great effort you put out to secure funds for such worthy causes. May God continue to bless your work with the alumni."

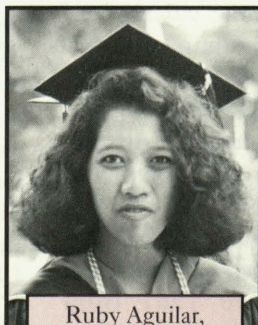
Newest Alumni Begin Endowment

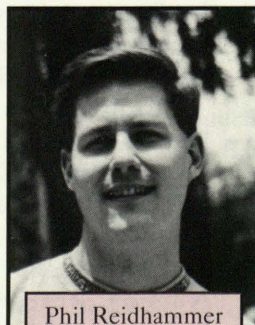
First Endowment Scholarship Awarded

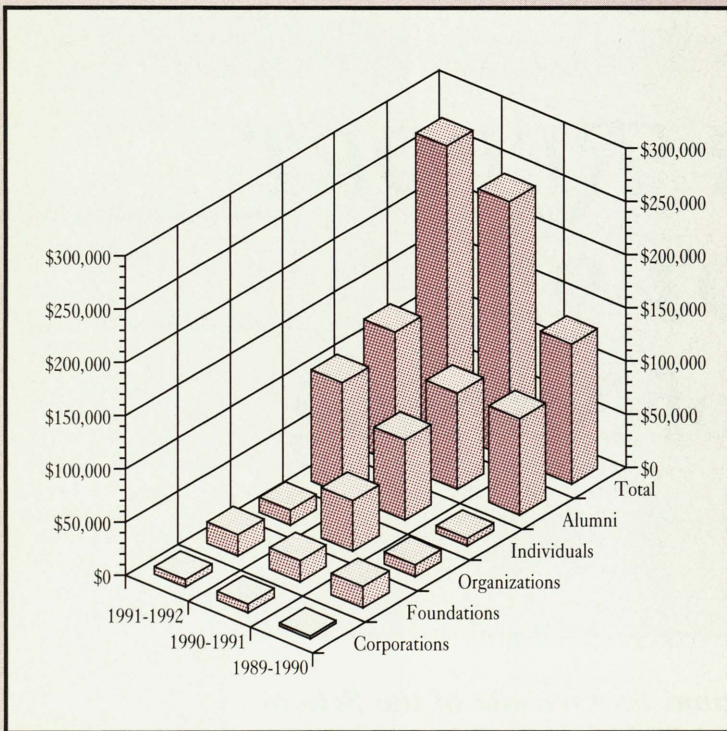

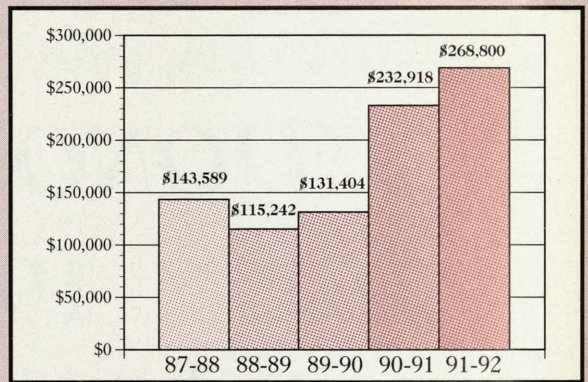

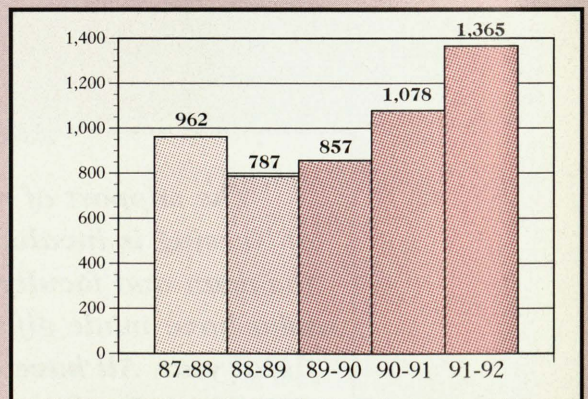

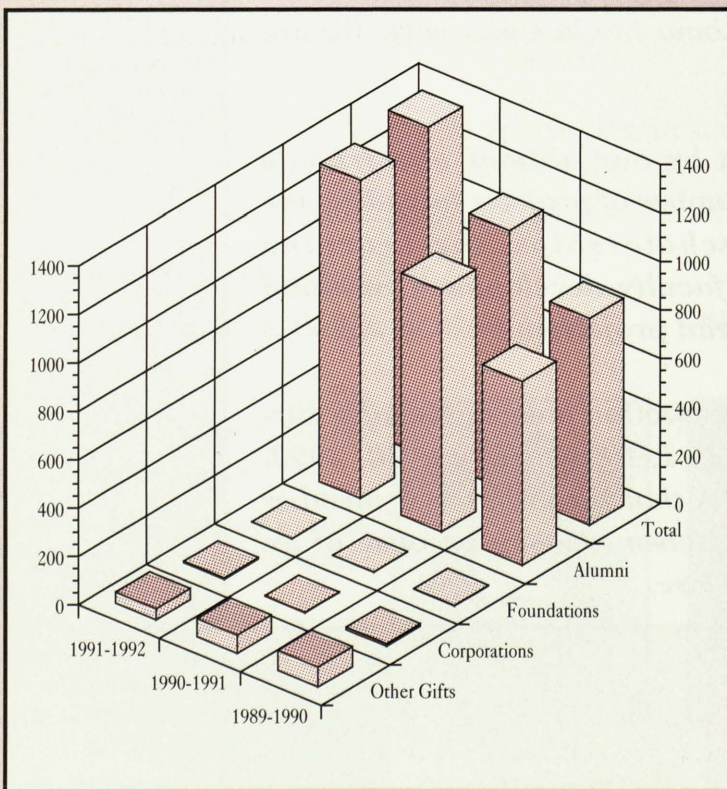
Total Dollars by Source

SUBJECT: BYLAWS REVISION

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this memo is to seek your approval of this revision of the BYLAWS. The last revision was in 1981.

These revisions come to you after much thought and work on the part of the BYLAWS COMMITTEE and the Board of Directors. Counsel has been obtained from the University attorneys and other alumni associations.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES

Essentially our purposes remain the same. Changes include:

1. Every alumnus is eligible to hold office. Dues status is not considered a requirement for membership.
2. The Association will send a mailer annually for contributions for operation needs.
3. A larger Board of Directors will provide for better representation of alumni needs by utilizing alumni from outside the Loma Linda area at an annual Board meeting.
4. Scheduled meetings of the Association include:
 - a. An annual business meeting for the membership during Homecoming at a separate time than the Banquet.
 - b. An annual Board of Directors meeting before the annual membership meeting to carry out the legislative and judicial functions of the Association.
 - c. Executive Committee meets a minimum of eight (8) times a year, to carry out the executive and administrative duties of the Association.
5. Proposes a paid executive director for the Association to assist in the executive and administrative affairs on a day to day basis and to communicate with alumni better.
6. Authorizes a full-time salaried manager position for the House of Thrift and allows the manager to hire staff as needed as approved by the Board of Directors. The House of Thrift, a business dealing in used merchandise, is the major source for funds that support the purposes of the Association.

The Nursing Alumni Board of Directors has approved these revisions. Your approval is also needed. Please use the attached card to indicate your wishes in this matter.

BYLAWS
Proposed Revision

ARTICLE I
NAME

The name of this organization shall be the *ALUMNI ASSOCIATION OF LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF NURSING*.

ARTICLE II
PURPOSE

Supporting the missions of the *SCHOOL OF NURSING*, the *UNIVERSITY*, and the *SEVENTH-DAY ADVENTIST CHURCH*, the purposes of this Association shall be to:

1. Promote communication among alumni of the *SCHOOL OF NURSING* and *GRADUATE SCHOOL Nursing Majors*.
2. Foster the advancement of education and science within the programs of the *SCHOOL OF NURSING*.
3. Support alumni nurses' projects in the mission program of the church at home and abroad.
4. Recognize excellence in students of undergraduate and graduate nursing programs and alumni through awards.
5. Provide financial aid to worthy students in *School of Nursing Programs*.
6. Encourage professional growth by providing annually a quality continuing education program.
7. Raise funds for the support of the operation of the Association by contributions and the acceptance of gifts and bequests.
8. Operate the *House of Thrift* for the relief of poverty within the community and to provide a source of funds to carry out the Association's purpose.

ARTICLE III
MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Active members shall be graduates of:

- 1) *Loma Linda University School of Nursing*, or
- 2) *Loma Linda University Graduate School* with a *Nursing Major*.

Active members are eligible to hold office and vote.

Section 2. Associate members are graduates in good standing from other accredited schools of nursing who request membership and have the recommendation of two Association members. Associate members may vote, but may not hold office except by specific vote of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Honorary members are non-nurse individuals, who have given distinguished service to nursing. Individuals are approved by the Board of Directors. Honorary members are not eligible to vote or hold office.

Section 4. Student members are enrolled in a program of *LLUSN* in good standing. Student members may attend meetings of the Association but are not eligible to vote or hold office.

Section 5. Ex-Officio members include the *Dean of LLUSN*, the *Assistant or Associate Deans*, the *University President* and officers. Ex-officio members are not eligible to vote or hold office.

ARTICLE IV ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS

Section 1. Annual Officers Reports and General Meeting

- a. Annual meetings of members shall be at the time of Homecoming set by the Executive Committee.
- b. The purpose of the annual meeting of members is to communicate to members a summary of the activities of the year through officer reports.
- c. Members shall receive notice of annual meetings through publications and/or official invitation.

Section 2. Member Vote: The Bylaws are amended by mail vote or by member vote at the annual meeting of members.

ARTICLE V ELECTIONS

Section 1. Time: Elections shall take place by mail ballot.

Section 2. Positions: Elected positions shall be the Officers and six directors.

Section 3. Vote: A majority vote of those voting shall elect Officers.

Section 4. Terms

- a. The president-elect, president, and past president serve one year terms in succession.
- b. The vice-president for programs, secretary, and treasurer shall serve two year terms with elections in alternate years.
- c. Two directors shall be elected each year who shall each serve three (3) year terms.
- d. The term of office shall begin at the beginning of the fiscal year, July 1.

Section 5. Vacancies of Office

- a. In the event the president is unable to serve, the president-elect shall assume the office of the president.
- b. In the event an officer other than the president is unable to serve, the Executive Committee shall present a name to the Board of Directors for its approval.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS

These officers shall serve without compensation. Their duties and terms of office are set forth in the Bylaws.

Section 1. Titles: The officers of the Association shall be:

- a. President
- b. President-elect
- c. Vice-president for programs
- d. Secretary
- e. Treasurer
- f. Past President

Section 2. Duties: The duties of the Officers shall be as follows:

a. The President shall:

- 1) Preside over all meetings of the Association.
- 2) Serve as chair of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee.
- 3) Perform all other acts and duties of a general nature as may be needed.
- 4) Appoint chairpersons of standing committees from the Board, unless otherwise specified in the Bylaws.
- 5) Present the membership of the standing committees for Board approval at the annual Board meeting.
- 6) Appoint two regular members as directors to the Board of Directors each year.
- 7) Assure representation of Nurses' Alumni within the University community affairs, as appropriate.
- 8) Chair the annual Business Meeting for the membership summarizing the activities of the year.

b. The President-elect shall:

- 1) Serve as a member of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee.

- 2) Preside in the absence of the president.
- 3) Become the president at the beginning of the fiscal year following the term of President-elect.
- 4) Communicate with the House of Thrift manager.
- 5) Assist the president in such duties as may be requested by the president.
- 6) Present a report of House of Thrift operation to the annual Business Meeting for membership.

c. The Vice-President for Programs shall:

- 1) Serve as a member of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee.
- 2) Chair the Alumni Institute Committee.
- 3) Assist the president as needed.
- 4) Present a report to the annual Business Meeting for membership.

d. The Secretary shall provide minutes of the meetings of the Executive Committee, the Board of Directors, and the Association's annual Business Meeting and banquet.

e. The Treasurer shall:

- 1) Serve as a member of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee.
- 2) Have custody of all funds of the Association.
- 3) Request an assistant, if needed, to be approved by the Board of Directors.
- 4) Submit written financial reports to the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee and the annual Business Meeting for the membership as required.
- 5) Arrange for the annual audit.

f. The Past President shall:

- 1) Serve as a member of the Board of Directors and the LLUSN ALUMNI ASSOCIATION Executive Committee.
- 2) Serve as chair of the Nominating Committee.
- 3) Present report of new officers at annual Business Meeting with membership.

ARTICLE VII BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Membership: Membership of the Board of Directors shall consist of the Executive Committee, Appointed and Elected Directors, Faculty Directors, and Ex-Officio Directors. Not more than two members of any graduating class of Loma Linda University School of Nursing may serve as elected or appointed Directors in any given year.

a. Executive Committee: The following shall be ex-officio directors with power to vote, except where these Bylaws restrict the vote.

- 1) Elected members of the executive Committee.
- 2) The Association's Contributing Editor of the Loma Linda Nurse.
- 3) Chair of the Alumni Institute Committee.
- 4) Chair of the Awards Committee
- 5) Chair of the Banquet Committee.
- 6) Chair of the Membership Committee.
- 7) Chair of the Missions Committee.

b. Elected Directors (6 directors): Two Directors shall be elected annually for a term of three years. These individuals should reside in other areas of the country to provide wider representation of alumni. Elected Directors have power to vote.

c. Appointed Directors (6 directors): The president shall appoint, with the approval of the Board of Directors, two directors annually for a term of three years. These individuals should reside in other areas of the country to provide wide representation of alumni. Appointed Directors have power to vote. These appointments could be made at the annual meeting of members.

d. Faculty Directors (4 directors)

- 1) The Dean of LLUSN shall appoint two faculty members.
- 2) The Associate Dean of LLUSN Undergraduate Program shall appoint one faculty member.
- 3) The Associate Dean of LLUSN Graduate Program shall appoint one faculty member. Faculty directors have power to vote.

e. Ex-officio Directors: The following may attend Board meetings to serve in an advisory and consulting role without the power to vote or meet quorum.

- 1) The Dean of the School of Nursing, LLU.
- 2) The Assistant to Dean for the Undergraduate Program, LLUSN.

- 3) The Assistant to Dean for the Graduate Program, LLUSN.
- 4) The Vice-President for University Advancement, LLU.
- 5) The President of LLU.
- 6) A student from each of the Programs of LLUSN.
- 7) Executive Officer.
- 8) House of Thrift Manager.

Section 2. Responsibilities

- a. Members are vested with the legislative and judicial powers of the Association.
- b. Directors may be appointed by the President to chair Standing Committees unless otherwise designated in the Bylaws.

Section 3. Meetings

- a. The Board of Directors shall hold one annual meeting prior to the annual meeting of members.
- b. Special meetings may be called on initiative of three or more members of the Board of Directors.
- c. The President shall chair the Board of Directors meeting(s).
- d. Elected, appointed and advisory directors of the Board of Directors have the right to cast one vote.
- e. Four elected officers and eight directors with power to vote shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. Terms of Office: The term of office shall be three (3) years with two Directors in each of the appointed and elected categories replacing two Directors in the same categories each year. The ex-officio category appointments may hold one year terms with option for reappointment.

Section 5. Vacancies: Any vacancy or vacancies occurring on the Board of Directors with respect to members who are elected or appointed may be filled by the Executive Committee.

Section 6. Powers: The Board of Directors shall be vested with the following powers in addition to such other powers as may be given in these Bylaws to:

- a) Ratify changes in the Bylaws when approved by the Executive Committee as provided in Article XII. Amendments to Bylaws.
- b) Approve Officers and committee chairpersons.
- c) Act upon Associate and Honorary membership applications to the Association.
- d) Appoint the Executive Committee's recommendation for the positions of:
 1. Executive Officer
 2. House of Thrift Manager
- e) Monitor and evaluate plans designed to implement the established goals and objectives.
- f) Review and approve the proposed annual budget.
- g) Appropriate money to projects recommended by the Executive Board in keeping with the purposes of the Association, including funds for scholarships and projects.
- h) Receive and act upon recommendations and matters referred to it by the Executive Committee or the membership.
- i) Establish and maintain current operating guidelines for the Association.

ARTICLE VIII EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. Membership: The Executive Board shall consist of the Officers of the Association, the Executive Officer, Chairs of standing committees, and advisory members as the President shall appoint. Elected officers have the power to vote.

Section 2. Administration: The executive and administrative powers of the Association shall be vested in the Executive Committee. The executive and administrative functions are to:

- a. Transact necessary business between meetings of the Board of Directors to carry out the mission of the Association.
- b. Fill vacancy(ies) in the Board of Directors or Executive Committee.
- c. Revise and amend the Bylaws as provided in Article XII, Amendments to Bylaws.
- d. Operate within the approved budget through monitoring expenditures.
- e. Elect an auditor.
- f. Investigate and recommend to the Board of Directors any matter pertaining to the welfare of the Association.
- g. Recommend applicants to the Board of Directors for Associate and Honorary membership.
- h. Interview and select individuals for the positions of 1) Executive Officer and 2) House of Thrift Manager, as needed, whose terms and conditions of employment shall be specified by the Executive Committee and approved by the Board of Directors.

- i. Make and enforce rules and regulations for its own actions.

Section 3. Meetings: The Executive Committee shall meet at least eight (8) times annually and on the request of the president or the request of any two members of the Executive Committee. Four members shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE IX COMMITTEES

Section 1. Standing Committees

- a. The standing committees shall be: Bylaws Committee, Finance Committee, Banquet Committee, Alumni Institute Committee, Membership Committee, Missions Committee, Awards Committee, Nominating Committee.
- b. The President and the Executive Officer are ex-officio members of all committees except Nominating Committee.
- c. Each standing committee shall present an annual written report at the annual Business Meeting.

Section 2. Bylaws

- a. Mission—The Bylaws Committee shall submit in accordance with Article XII Amendments to Bylaws.
- b. Membership—The Bylaws Committee shall be chaired by the President or a designee appointed by the president and a minimum of two members chosen by the chair with approval of the Executive Committee.
- c. Responsibilities—This committee shall review the bylaws as designated in the Bylaws and consider, edit and/or correlate such amendments as it may originate and/or is referred to it. Present revisions to Board of Directors and the membership.

Section 3. Finance Committee

- a. Mission—The Finance Committee shall be responsible for the annual budget.
- b. Membership—The Finance Committee shall be chaired by the Treasurer and shall be comprised of the Assistant Treasurer and one other member.
- c. Responsibilities—This committee shall prepare an annual budget to be presented to the Board of Directors at its first meeting of the fiscal year; the Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and Executive Officer shall have authorization to sign financial documents; make recommendations for the amount of funds available for disbursement for scholarships and projects in carrying out the mission of the Association.

Section 4. Alumni Institute Committee

- a. Mission—The Alumni Institute Committee shall be responsible for the planning and/or overseeing of the annual educational program incorporating the Mary Monteith Lecture for the Homecoming weekend.
- b. Membership—The Alumni Institute Committee shall be chaired by the Vice-President for Programs and at least two other members selected by the Chair.
- c. Responsibilities—The Chair of the Alumni Institute Committee is responsible to seek approval of topics and presenter(s) and submit a proposed budget for the Institute to the Executive Committee before final contractual agreements are made.

Section 5. Banquet Committee

- a. Mission—The Banquet Committee shall plan and implement all the activities for the annual banquet.
- b. Membership—The Banquet Committee chair is appointed by the President from the members of the Board of Directors and a minimum of two other members.
- c. Responsibilities—The Chair of the Banquet Committee is responsible to submit a proposed budget for the banquet and seek approval by the Executive Committee before final contractual agreements are made for the location of the banquet.

Section 6. Mission Committee

- a. Mission—The Mission Committee shall communicate with alumni in mission service at home and abroad seeking information about their witness related needs and make recommendations to the Finance Committee for the amount and disbursement of funds to assist in meeting these needs.
- b. Membership—The Mission Committee chair shall be appointed by the President (preferably a member who has served overseas) and shall consist of a minimum of two other members.
- c. Responsibilities—Prioritize and divide the sum allocated to Missions; facilitate the distribution of funds and other resources; seek approval from the Board of Directors

Section 7. Membership Committee

- a. Mission—The Membership Committee shall plan and implement procedures for securing active membership of all School of Nursing and Graduate School nursing majors; plan and implement procedures for securing associate membership; make provisions for the education and orientation of students for membership and support of the Association.

- b. Membership—The Membership Committee chair shall be a Director from the Board of Directors, appointed by the President, and shall include the Executive Officer and a minimum of two other members.
- c. Responsibilities—Submit a plan with a budget for its implementation. Actively recruit SN faculty who are not alumni as well as Associate and Honorary members. Invite senior students as guests to the Homecoming Banquet.

Section 8. Nominating Committee

- a. Mission—The Nominating Committee shall present names for elected officers and directors for the ballot.
- b. Membership—The Nominating Committee is chaired by the Past President; a minimum of two additional members shall be chosen by the chair.
- c. Responsibilities—Submit names for ballot to Executive Committee by the January meeting. Facilitate preparation of the ballot for mailing.

Section 9. Awards Committee

- a. Mission—The Awards Committee shall (1) annually select two alumni for recognition by the Association. Two Alumnus of the Year Awards are given to two alumni deserving recognition at the annual Homecoming Banquet from the following three (3) categories: overseas experience, special contributions either in nursing service, or nursing education; (2) annually submit to the dean of LLUSN within submission deadlines an alumnus for the University Alumnus recognition at University Commencement Services.
- b. Membership—The Awards Committee chair shall be appointed from the members of the Board of Directors and a minimum of two members from nursing service, two members from nursing education and at least one who is not connected with the University.
- c. Responsibilities—Present nominees to the Board of Directors for final selection; prepare resumé or wording for engraving on plaque; ordering plaque; presentation of plaque at Homecoming Banquet.

Section 10. Special Committees: Special committees may be appointed by the Executive Committee for some special work or purpose. The special committee expires with the completion of the charge from the Executive Committee and the presentation of the report.

ARTICLE X ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE

Section 1. Fiscal Year: The fiscal year shall be July 1 through June 30.

Section 2. Contributions

- a. Contributions will be solicited from the members for Alumni Association operation.
- b. Members may make contributions in the following ways: (1) Annual contribution as determined by the Board of Directors based on the recommendations of the Finance Committee; (2) A one time contribution (life) determined by the Board of Directors based on the recommendations of the Finance Committee; (3) One-half the annual contribution upon retirement or while serving overseas.

Section 3. Administrative Staff

- a. The Board of Directors shall provide for a paid staff, which may include an Executive Officer, and such additional clerical employees as are sufficient to carry on the affairs of the Association, salaries to be determined by the Board of Directors.
- b. Responsibilities of the Executive Officer shall be to:
 - 1) Administer and manage the business of the Association as determined by the Board of Directors.
 - 2) Assist the officers in carrying out their duties.
 - 3) Employ, supervise and terminate the employment of members of the staff as necessary to carry on the work of the Association and fix their compensation within approved budget.

Section 4. House of Thrift

- a. Mission—The mission of the House of Thrift is to relieve poverty within the community and to provide a source of income to finance the objectives of the Association.
- b. A salaried Manager, whose terms and conditions of employment shall be specified by the Board of Directors, shall be responsible for managing the HOUSE OF THRIFT as prescribed by the Board of Directors and shall be responsible to the Board of Directors. The Manager shall employ and terminate staff as necessary to carry on the work of the House of Thrift and fix their compensation within approved salary schedules and budget.
- c. All expenses for running the business must be deducted before disbursement of earnings are made for the purposes of the Association.

Section 5. Gifts, Bequests: Gifts and bequests are accepted for the purposes of the Association.

Section 6. Expenses: Authorized expenses of standing and special committees as well as the House of Thrift shall be reimbursed to individuals who have used their own resources by the Association Treasury.

Section 7. Annual Financial Report: At the end of the fiscal year, there shall be a financial compilation of the books of the Association, made by an independent and duly qualified certified public accountant, whose report shall be presented to the annual Board of Directors meeting. The annual financial report shall include: (1) a balance sheet; (2) the principal changes in assets and liabilities; (3) an income and expense report. An annual audit will be done.

ARTICLE XI PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the Alumni Association of the Loma Linda University School of Nursing in all cases in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws.

ARTICLE XII AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS

The Bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members who are present at any regularly called meeting of the Association, provided that the substance of the proposed amendment has been submitted with one of the notices for the meeting; or by mail vote following information by mail. The Bylaws must be reviewed at least every five years.

ARTICLE XIII DISSOLUTION

The property of the Association is irrevocably dedicated to religious, charitable, scientific and educational purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this organization shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member thereof or to the benefit of any private persons. On dissolution of this Association, its assets remaining after payment of, or provisions for payment of all debts and liabilities of this Association, shall be distributed to Loma Linda University, a California nonprofit organization, to be used in aid of the School of Nursing as its Board of Trustees may direct. If Loma Linda University is not an organization which qualifies under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code at the time of such dissolution, such assets shall be distributed 1) to one or more alternative organizations selected at such time which qualify under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or 2) in any manner as may be directed by decree of the superior court of the county in which the Association has its principal office, upon petition therefore by the Attorney General or by any person concerned in the liquidation, in a proceeding to which the Attorney General is a party.

Verna V. Goddard Wright '29 died on April 11, 1992, at age 85 in Jackson, Michigan, after a seven month bout with lymphoma.

Verna was born in Wallingford, Iowa and attended Maplewood Academy and La Sierra University before attending and graduating from LLU.

On May 23, 1929, she married G. Byron Wright '34SM. During their 47 year marriage, she assisted him in operating his medical practices, first in New Mexico from 1934 to 1937 and then in Montana from 1937 to 1969.

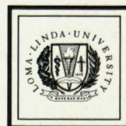
