





Dual Credit Enrollment




Web Enrollment

Student Services

The WKU-Glasgow Campus accounted for 53% of regional campus enrollments with 6,322 course enrollments in the Fall of 2012.

The WKU-Glasgow service area includes Adair, Allen, Barren, Clinton, Cumberland, Edmonson, Green, Metcalfe, Monroe, and Russell counties.

Academic Advising

Academic advisement is available onsite, daily and during most evenings. Appointments are recommended.

Bookstore

All textbooks and supplies for courses offered at WKU-Glasgow are available at the WKU Store. The WKU Store offers a variety of WKU memorabilia.

Career Services

WKU Career Services staff visit the WKU-Glasgow Campus monthly to assist with resumé building, interviewing, and other skills.

Counseling & Testing

WKU's Counseling and Testing Center staff make regular visits to the WKU-Glasgow Campus to provide individual counseling and class presentations.

A Financial Aid Outreach Counselor is available at the WKU-Glasgow Campus on Mondays and Thursdays each week.

Library

The WKU-Glasgow Campus Library offers reference books and leisure reading. Students have access to materials placed on reserve, as well as full access to electronic databases and journals. 
