## Results, outcomes, achievements

- Mobilization of collective action to address pressing constraints in the pig sector in Uganda e.g., poor-quality feeds, disease management etc.
- Business linkages between actors in the pig sector have been created /strengthened
- Strengthened private-public sector partnerships. E.g., construction of an abattoir in Masaka - a partnership between the two sector players.

## Lessons and significance

- MSPs provide an entry point for various stakeholder groups to engage with pig value chain players e.g. private-public sector partnerships, funding agencies, civil society, policy makers, development partners etc.
- The MSPs create networks and avenues for learning, knowledge sharing and empowerment of actors in the pig value chain.
- Private sector leadership and involvement is key for sustainability of MSPs at all levels
