Analytical Comment

The school of today has centered its interest about the child, rather than having the child conform to its set and rigid rules.

The school of today has a fertile and vitalized curriculum; it therefore, needs greatly to establish reading habits, reading activities and reading aims that will challenge and stimulate teacher as well as the child, because the responsibility of establishing reading habits and appreciation for worthwhile reading in children rests largely upon the teachers.

" One of the major aims in reading is to provide opportunities for a rich and varied experience (Twenty-fourth year book of the National Society for the Study of Education)"

It is evident that the average student entering college has limited reading experience. The college is likely to attribute this lack of reading to the high school, and if traced back the high school attributes this failure to the elementary school. So may elementary school teachers censure parents for not providing their children with reading materials. Now, who is to be blamed? Fortunately, no one has blamed the child, because that would be unpardonable. " Someone has said: 'The greatest service the elementary school can render to children is to teach them to read.' "To this we add: 'What to read, and to make them life readers.' "To make life readers of children we must surround them with suitable and sufficient material and show them how to use it, that correct reading habits may be established."

Since so many parents neglect providing their children with appropriate reading matter, it is the school's duty to awaken within each child the desire for good reading, and through the desire maintain a permanent interest in reading throughout life.

Too many adults, today, lack the reading habit. Is the school responsible for this? Has reading been a distasteful subject to the child in school? Has there been a serious breach between the teaching of the mechanics of reading and the functioning of reading in the understanding of history, geography, arithmetic, etc. and the enjoyment of a good story? Fortunately the schools are awake and aware of the values to be desired from reading.

Reading instructions should develop desirable attitudes, habits, and skills if it is to function as a tool. Not only is it essential in the functioning of reading as a tool subject but without its accomplishment all other reading aims would prove a failure."

## Chapter 1

### Findings

This study is chiefly concerned with the reading interests and experiences of entering Freshmen at Prairie View State College.

The following findings were noted:

1. Girls, with only a few exceptions read more than boys.
2. Girls have a more accurate remembrance of titles than do the boys.
3. In a great number of cases the errors made in titles were serious.
4. Unusually poor spelling for high school graduates.
5. Classes as prescribed by high schools consisted of the major part of the reading.
6. There is a tendency on the part of the persons studied to spell the titles as they themselves talked--phonetically.
7. So many do not distinguish between fiction and non-fiction.
8. Some persons studied have a poor idea of capitalization.
9. The greater part of outside reading consisted of fiction, particularly that found in magazines.
10. It is quite noticeable that there is little interest shown for poetry.
11. Authors that were favorites years ago remain popular with boys and girls of today.
12. It is obvious, that, on a whole, the pupils from elementary

school life have received very little guidance motivation as regards their reading interest.

13. Taking into consideration that about seventy-five per cent of students entering Prairie View College come from the rural districts, it can readily be seen that insufficient material has affected the "reading intelligence" of the students as to comprehension and appreciation.

"Studies made by Montgomery among 410 adults representing various professions and vocations showed that they engaged in recreational reading for the following purposes: satisfaction of curiosities; relaxation; culture; emotional satisfaction and stimulation; vicarious experiences; vivid description; background or atmosphere; to idle away time. Such findings show that independence of reading is an essential means of enriching personal experiences, of directing and inspiring the present and future life of the reader, and of providing for the wholesome use of leisure time" (1934), as you may readily see, will

**Purpose:**

To present data regarding the reading of those students entering the Freshman Class at Prairie View State College. Data were secured in order to determine the number and types of books reported on or required in their high school course of study; the number and types of books voluntarily in their leisure time; the number and types of magazines read by these students.

**Method:**

Questionnaires were given those students making up the various Freshman English Classes. These questionnaires were answered by them. Those questions particularly related to this study were as follows:

1. List the books (bound volumes) of fiction you read during your high school study; (as many as you can remember)
2. Did you make a written report on the book you read?
3. List titles of books (bound volumes) you read the past summer vacation.
4. List titles of magazines which you read regularly.
5. What kind of magazines and stories do you like?

This second group (1934), as you may readily see, will naturally reveal more information on the reading interests of these students than the questionnaire of 1933 because it has a better form and can, therefore, be more intensely studied. The following tables are significant factors in this study.

## Establishing the Habit of Reading

During the age of restlessness and discontent so many teachers complain of meeting difficulty in getting students to read. There are many and varied causes for this failure. It is not the sophisticated mood, as adolescents are so often accused of having, that keeps them from reading the "good books." To them these books are "good" that give them satisfaction, and one can not expect a person's hunger or desire to be any deeper or keener than is his intelligence. Children fail to read good books because they have not been exposed to them. Many homes lack even one shelf of books. A library is a rare thing. In order to instill within these individuals correct and wholesome reading habits, one must set about to train them. Although the home has much to do in helping to establish the desired habits of the child, the greatest responsibility of training rests upon the shoulders of the school. The average school has failed to meet this responsibility, as a result students enter college totally ignorant of the values of good literature; having missed that encouragement, recreation, stimulation, travel and cultural growth afforded through reading.

It is gratifying to realize from this study that the majority of boys

and girls are seizing the opportunity to read the best magazines. This is shown by their preferences.

The intelligence of children shows marked preference in reading material. They do express and discriminate consistent preferences. This difference in intelligence also controls the choice of titles and the accurate remembrance of them. "Children of dull, average, and superior intelligence have distinct and consistent interests in reading which deserve recognition in curriculum making. This is especially important in the education of dull children, whose interests, on a whole, show a striking similarity to those of more intelligent children."

## provision for Individual Differences in Reading

Segregation on the basis of ability is common in the courses analyzed about 1/3 of them offering 2 or 3 track programs, and more than a third providing some form of variation from the care course for pupils of superior or of limited ability.

### The Three-track Program

A typical three-track course in Sacramento's, based on the assumption that 'no child should be asked to do something which is manifestly impossible for him to do. Within his ability he is asked to work conscientiously and thoroughly, sometimes inspirationally, giving proof from time to time, through tests, of actual mastery. The distinction between the X course and the Y course is in degree of attainment; for the Z course the differentiation is also in type.

In the tenth grade the slow group reads "Captain Courageous" and "Lamb Tales" and as many of the following as possible. "The Jungle Book", "The Prince and the Pauper", "The Story of a Bad Boy", "Tom Sawyer", and "The Call of the Wild". Meanwhile, the Y group reads two to four classics; "Travels with a Donkey", "Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde", "Silas Marner", "Les Miserables", and as much supplementary reading as possible from a group of four plays- "A Midsummer Night's Dream", "As You Like It", "The Merchant of Venice", and "The Piper". At the same time the X pupils read three of the four required classics, as many of the supplementary titles, as possible, and certain additional travel books. The teachers of the Z group are warned not to underestimate the ability of the pupils, but to encourage individual projects, to stimulate interest by the use of visual aids, and to have frequent individual conferences. The superior group is to have still more activities-to note literary

effects, to enjoy humor, to study the life and times of the authors, and to do creative writing in connection with the unit. The average group follows the activities of the superior, with the omission of notation of literary effects and the study of the life and times of the author."

Other suggested means of improving reading as is found in the above references are as follows:

1. The core course with variations
2. Multiple-reading programs
3. Electives and remedial courses
4. The modified- content course
5. Seminars for superior pupils
6. Special programs for average pupils
7. Appropriate reading materials for weak pupils

8. Differentiation in Methods of instruction

9. Problems for consideration

1. To what extent are the educational objectives different for pupils of different levels of ability?
2. Is there a set body of material which all should study in common? If so, how is that care to be determined?
3. Is the present English course studied suited to the life needs of any group now in our schools?
4. Granted that the boy has only one year left in school, what are the most important contributions a course in English may make to his future?
5. For weak and bright students, what are the important aims of English instruction in terms of attitudes? Of habits? Of skills? Of knowledge?
6. By what specific content or methods may these aims be achieved?

## DEVICES

## Devices

At an Early age children should be taught the value of independent leisure or recreational reading. "Strong motives for and permanent interest in such reading activities are essential." This type of reading of value, socially. It is here that the school is challenged.

"As children pass thru the elementary grades an increasingly large percentage of them, as a rule, engage in recreational reading, if they have the opportunity to do so. During the junior-high-school period two distinct trends develop. In schools where adequate attention is given to the problem, interest in reading increased notably as shown by records of the number of books read independently and the amount of time devoted to recreational reading. In other schools interest in reading often decreases rapidly. This has been attributed largely to failure on the part of teachers to provide adequate stimulation and guidance with respect to recreational reading.

Conditions under which desirable reading interests and habits may be cultivated are as follows:

1. The home must present a wholesome reading atmosphere.
2. Parents should encourage and take interest in the reading material of children. Guidance and careful selection is necessary.
3. "As pupils advance through the grades and high school

Adolescents are the receptive stage of their development and are susceptible to reading influences, therefore, their reading should be rich and full enough to satisfy their curiosity and interest in future careers. Adolescents live in an adventurous and romantic world and respond to every suggestion. How is one to judge what is suitable for these individuals? Although children are similar in some respects they are diverse in personality, tastes and temperament.

In the Wilson Bulletin for March 1935 there appears an article by Beatrice Young which is a Bibliography for what ails the College Student which she calls

"Meeting the College Mood"

In this article is found recommended readings to meet the many moods which are characteristic of college students. Excerpts are as follows:

"The college student is one of the moodiest of peoples. If he is overworked or discouraged; if he is disappointed or blue, he feels these experiences are just as valuable, just as much to be encouraged and talked about as the realization that life is a bed of roses; or that it is a joy to be alive. Sadness and joy are thrills! He has not yet become convinced of the fact that is noble to force gaiety and attempt to sunshine even tho he has failed in an examination or his true love has proved false. He despises a pollyanna! The mood's the thing! Act your Mood might be his slogan.

This may be done by: inspiring teachers of broad reading interests; an abundance of appropriate reading materials; types of teaching that awaken interests leading to independent reading; the organization of teaching in terms of problems that appeal to children as significant and worthwhile; regular periods in the daily schedule for recreational reading; and guidance that cultivates appreciation of and develops preferences for desirable types of literature."

4. The organization of a Book Club is effective.
5. Proper exposure and advertizement of books. Curiosity must be aroused, interest follows.
6. "One of the chief duties of the junior high school is to develop right reading habits and discriminating taste in adolescent boys and girls. The junior high school should:
  - (a) continue the instruction in how to read, begun so efficiently in the elementary school, (b) provide pupils with attractive and interesting reading materials of all kinds, and (c) present the reading materials in such a way as to improve the pupils' taste".

Many a time I have had students stop at my desk and say, Oh, I am bored to death with life. People are all the same. You always know just what they are going to say before they say it, and just how they will react to whatever might happen. I want to forget them all. Haven't you a book that will carry me away from such a hum-drum existence?

Or again comes the appeal, well everything is coming my way now. I just got an 'A' in my examination, and in education, too. Think of it! Whee! it's great to be alive, isn't it? I want to read something about people who have achieved! I feel as tho I could move the world and I'd like to learn the technique of my predecessors.

Because of experiences we have had in meeting these college moods, I have made bibliographies of books which time after time have not only satisfied the student but have made them consistent users of the library. As a result of our efforts to supply each student with the right book for every occasion our circulation for recreational reading has gone up many hundred percent in the last few years, and the students are developing a reading taste which we hope and expect will carry over into their post-college days.

CONCLUSION

On a whole the resources for Supplementary Reading are limited; especially is this true concerning the Negro school child. The Negro child faces two great disadvantages which hinder him greatly in the field of literature. Namely: The lack of a rich home-reading influence, and the poor library facilities found in Negro schools.

Teachers are so often handicapped in their efforts to put over an effective program due to the above causes. It is difficult to say what should be the first approach in the solving of this problem but what ever the remedy is suggested, without a doubt, the home and the school must cooperate in attacking it.

The child is the object upon which all efforts should be focused, in order that his inner interests may be aroused. There are many and varied methods by which this may be done, but the child, the community, and the advantages will determine the selection and application of the method.

Rural communities face the greatest difficulties and should be provided for. Circulation libraries are splendid mediums through which the reading problem may be met.
