Evangelist for revival services March 28-April 4 at Dover, E. M. Smith, pastor, will be Rev. Woodrow Harris of Greenville, S. C.

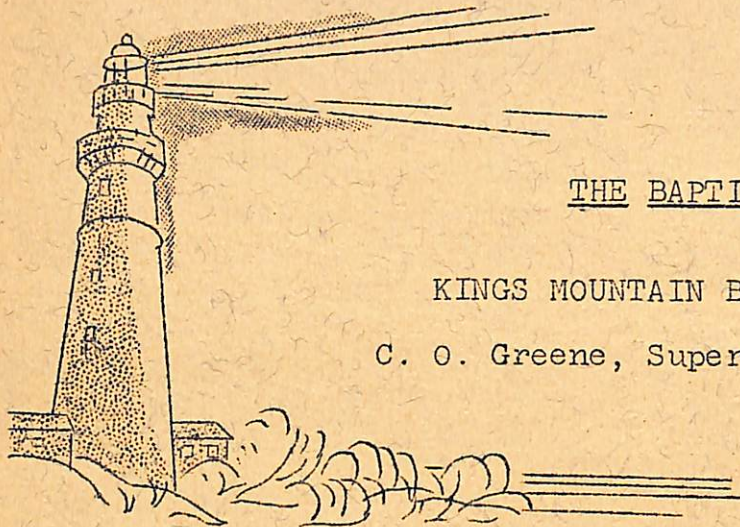
WE WELCOME
