## ACCESS TO THE LIBRARY

- The [hold request form](#) can be used to request a book from our collection. We will check it out and make it available for pick up or ship to your house if you are not local.
- The [scan request form](#) can be used to request a scan from a book in the collection or course reserves.
- **Interlibrary Loan & Link+** will continue to be available to students, faculty, and staff.
- If there is a book on **course reserve**, you can use the [scan request form](#) to request a portion be scanned.

## MOODLE SUPPORT

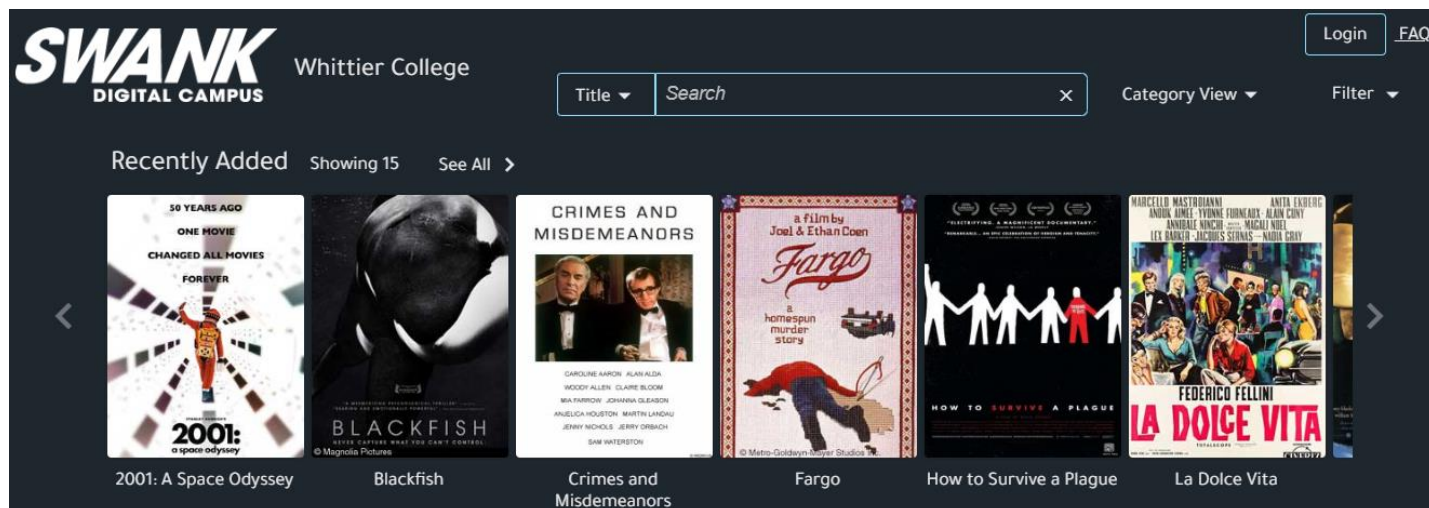

## STREAMING VIDEO



The Library will continue to use Swank and Kanopy to provide streaming access to films to support our courses. Your professors should provide links to these films for you. For films streamed from Swank, we recommend using the Firefox or Chrome browsers. Swank will not work on the Safari browser.

There are some cases where the Library will be unable to provide access to a film due to contractual or license issues. In those cases, renting from Apple/Google/Amazon may be an option.

## USE DUBSEARCH FOR FULL-TEXT ACCESS, INTERLIBRARY LOAN, & ARTICLES ON DEMAND SERVICE

While you can continue to use our [catalog](#) to search for print books and DVDs, we encourage you to use [dubSearch](#) to search for articles, e-books, print books, and newspapers. **dubSearch** will enable you to find full-text access to journal and newspaper articles. It can also locate content that Wardman Library does not have but will offer interlibrary loan (ILL).

With ILL, we can coordinate with another partner library to access a journal article, book chapter, or even a print book. In some cases, you may see the **Articles on Demand** option, this service will provide near immediate access (within minutes) to articles from recently canceled journals.

## POET COMMONS & POET PROFILES

[Poet Commons](#), our institutional repository, has been available since April 2020. Poet Commons seeks to collect and share the historic, academic, and creative culture of the Whittier College community. The constantly-growing digital archive includes student research and scholarship, faculty publications, college history, and unique materials from the Library's Archives and Special Collections. As of December 2020, over 540 items have been deposited, which has resulted in nearly 5,900 downloads from 95 countries. Poet Commons not only provides a way to digitally preserve content but also expand the brand and reputation of Whittier College by sharing the great academic work by our students and faculty. [Poet Profiles](#) is a portfolio platform that compliments Poet Commons. If Poet Commons is about the “work,” Poet Profiles is about the individual. Poet Profiles provides a space to build a profile and highlight your works located in Poet Commons. A student or faculty member can share their experiences, works, and research interests.
