DIRECTOR'S NOTE

What is it that keeps us from finding true contentment? We may present the world with one version of ourselves while, inside, we're living a different story. As I began working on this show, my immediate thought was, "We all have our own prison." It may seem a dramatic viewpoint to have, but then we must ask ourselves how our own prison is represented. At face value, we follow Percy's want to alter her life journey, perhaps find peace, perhaps discover happiness. But I encourage each of the actors to find focus in the journey of their character. As in life, what affects each individual, bringing about what is presented to the world? How does acknowledging our own 'prison' release us from life's constraints?

Oftentimes, finding kindred spirits or simply discovering love through friendship or kindness helps us release that which keeps us from 'letting go.'
