Dear Sir

I received your first letter, but
no opportunity immediately offering, I delay'd
writing, as I intended to visit Georgia, where
I should see Mr Stephens. - upon my arrival
in Georgia I mentioned to Mr Stephens the
receiving your letter & the purport; - I
informed him that I took up from Mr
Lucena my receipt for the papers put
into my hands, & delivered up the Bonds,
that the business between Lucena & myself
was completed just before the evacuation
that it was an act of haste, that if any
papers were remaining I would trans-
mit them to him - that Mr Lucena had
given me an order upon you for a bit of
the amount of some of the fees, that some of

The Charges were left open to be settled with
you - with respect to the Monies received
I cannot possibly say what Mr Lucena may
have received, I do not received any ~~thing~~ ^{sum} unless
it was about £5000 from one Harris
and for which I accounted to Mr Lucena, that
when Judgments were obtained Mr. received
I was not authorized from Mr. to receive
but in his absence, which did not happen.

Your The bearer is in great haste you
will excuse the manner & short amount
I give you, I am in hopes my business
is settled in Georgia by the 15th inst, if so
I shall take the first opportunity to look
over my papers, & will give you a full
account, or rather I will wait upon you
