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March 25 - 88-The packet is arrived from Charleston my fond hope is disappointed no letters \_ the Moop Maria bapt." Elliott arrived in a five. days papage on the 13th & I have not a word, what am I to think - fear & apprehension success to joy & gladness - anxious suspense has again veized my soul but yet hope tells me believe the voice of fame - your Susan is well thas a for - my heart suggests a thousand excuses for this seeming in attention and my head will not examine them too nicely leash it may not be vatisfied with the result Patience is my only resource time will curs the evil & I hope a short portion of it \_

Swrote my love I had bought a trach of land in John Rutherfurds name for her & perhaps it may make her unrasy on account of my increasing my debh - but this purchase has not increased my debt much only \$270 & that payable in 1, 2 & 3 years \_ the person whom bought it awed me money & he took a trach of my land in payment \_ I am now in treaty for another trach of land- if I sell it it will make me tolerably rasy as to my debts in Carolina - my Susters estate will then be the only one prefsing upon me and as I have more money due me than Jowe her - what I shall receive with my Grops if it please God to give me good hasons will get me clear of her in a year or two & then I shall have nothing to attend to but my English debt & by that time I hope land

will be in such demand as to enable me to sell a trach or two of about 5000 acres then we shall be fire\_ in the mean time we must be as frugal as we have hitherto been & Iam sure such are my Jusans just ideas of independance that she will join me in all occonomical plans to effect it -I think upon the whole altho the winter has been so severe I am better than when I left you - which is doing wondetfully well - I had a return of spitting of blood about a fortnight ago which was occasioned by my being caught in a sharp North west wind in coming from Hilton Wead but it has now ceased & the weather is now growing milder every day, which makes me hope I shall not grow worse \_ you did not vend me M? Parkers billet\_ how does he bear his being left out of the next delegation to congress -

27th I am jush on the wing for Georgia where I shall be I imagine until the 5th April \_ so if you do not hear from me don't be unsayy as there may he no apportunities -I feel your Fathers kindness very much & beg you to present my kindest & best wis hes to the old gentleman your Mamma \_ Mr & Mrs R the children & ca \_ ett. Give Eliza Sulia as many hipses as you give your own son \_ mind don't you shoil him\_ Ader my love take care of yourself for your affectionate hurband John Kan per he hear this being left, and af this
