as follows . The Joan of Ten Million of Sures, borrowed in Holland and Guaranteed in France; on which Interest is paid to the Month

of November 1785.

The Soans in Holland, the Capital of which amounts to Seven Million Florins; on which Interest is haid to the Month of February instant, and the Remains which to that time had become dues.

On the Spanish Loans, and Foreign Debts due to Individuals; no Interest has been paid since these were Contracted, excepting

on the Certificates ifsued for the Pay of the French Officers who served in America during the late War; the Interest of which has been paid to the end of the Year 1784. -2, The two ellillion Loan was completed by the actual receipt of the Money on the 31, October 1784. The five Million Loan, on the 31° May 1786. 3, The arrearages of Pay due to the Troops in Service, amount as nearly as can be ascertained to 50,000 Dollars. These which were raised previous to the act of Congress of the 21. of October last, were supplied last fall with Clothing for a Year :- Those raised fine that period are not provided with that article .- With respect to their Subsistence, we have hitherto been able to effect it, without incurring any great arrearages on that head; but there is at present no prospect that this will long be the case? ____ 4th, The following States have past dets in pursuance of the Requisition of the 27 " September 1785.
