New York 21st Novemb^r 1796

Dear Sir,

I Received your favor of the 17th
Inst on Friday last - since which there has been
no Post untill this day. In answer to the propo-
sition contained in your Letter, respecting the
Bond you mention - I can only say, that I shall most
readily consent to have it given in my name -
and to act as a Trustee for my Sister & her Son -
lest any accident should happen to you, and to
do any thing in my power to serve them both -
that can be done with propriety - you may there-
fore make your arrangements on this head
accordingly. At two O'clock on Sunday, the
day after I left you, I arrived at Mr. Picketts,
in time to partake of a fine Saddle of Venison -
Mr. & Mrs. Jacob Pickett Mr. Johnson & Mr. Brispett
of

of Jamaica, had come over from hence by appoint-
-ment to sign & seal, their different agreements -
-respecting their Jamaica Estate, I do not undu-
-stand the particulars of the Bargain, but Jackson
James Richeth, & my Father, think it a good one for
James - My Mother's Dower I hear is to have the
preference, in payments from the Produce of the
Estate by Installments - The old Gentleman
& Lady, Richeth, & Sally were in great spirits -
James was here on Friday - & tells me that Mr
R. will pay us a visit, this week - & will not
come to you, until she hears that Mr H. is
settled in her new House - I find you have not
yet got possession of the upper part of the Bark -
I shall be obliged to you, when you can form any
good opinion, of the time, when you will begin
to discount, to acquaint me of it - & whether
you

you will discount, for good men residents here -
without an Indorser resident in Philadelphia -

M^{rs} L. is in perfect good health - and begs to join
with me in our Love to you & M^{rs} H. & Peter -

Remember me to M^r Barnwell - & rest assured -

that I am with the greatest regards -

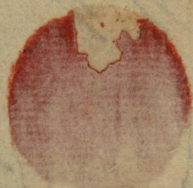
