My Dear Sir

New York Wednesday Long  
30<sup>th</sup> November 1791

I went to my Farm on Saturday &  
am just returned thence - on coming home I found your  
two Letters of the 24<sup>th</sup> & Ins<sup>ts</sup>  
at Noon we had a meeting of the New York Directors  
in Town, except Mr. Watts - the result was that we  
should severally enquire of the Proprietors, of certain  
Houses in Wall Street, Queen Street, & Hanson Square -  
nearst the Coffee House, & know their terms of rent  
& time of giving Possession, & report to each other to day  
we probably may advantage for a House, & desire the  
Landlords to send sealed proposals, by a limited time -

It escaped my memory to ask Watson about the  
Department Plates - I enquired of Bayard respecting the  
other wh: he said he had sent on - & I find you have rec.  
I shall see Watson to day at our meeting, & shall make  
the enquiry, & will let you know <sup>near</sup> ~~to~~ ~~tomorrow~~ Post  
as also the result of what we shall do about the House  
I am very much obliged to you for the information



contained in your letter - I am offered South Sea  
-line unassumable debt at 14/- & the interest at 11/-  
dated in 1783 - Is that price too high, or is there  
any particular species of them, now since the time of  
assumption is most preferable to the other - Beyond I  
hear will only take those dated after the 1<sup>st</sup> Jan<sup>y</sup>. 1790.  
If you have a mind to ~~purchase~~ be concerned, & will  
limit the price, & describe the things, I will buy or joint  
acc<sup>t</sup> to the amount you limit, I have been in  
company this long. its now late - I shall therefore  
say adieu to you - <sup>in</sup> next post I shall be more  
full - Love to Susan -
