Greenburgh 10th August 1801.

Dear Sister,

Mess^{rs} Le Roy Bayard, & M^r Evers, informed me by Letter last week, that they had received my interest & dividends for the last Quarter I suppose they have received yours also. Your funded debt I transferred to them some time before I left Town, for which I suppose they have given you some acknowledgement. I also executed a power of attorney to them to transfer your Shares in the United States Bank ^{to their names} which they declined to receive, & they still remain in my name but as they hold a power of attorney from me to receive the Interest of my funded debt & dividends on my U. S. Bank Shares, they will receive your ^{dividends on your} Bank Shares with mine, & account with you for the same. We have been here upwards of six weeks, & I have dilligently employed my time in taking exercise in the open air, twice a day, & find my health very much improved from it, but I cannot as yet make any use of my feet, not even to stand upon them, however I am not without hopes of using them, before we return to Town in the autumn, at least so as be able to walk upon my Crutches. Will you & M^r Neimewitz pay us a visit.

visit here as soon as it may be convenient to you. I have given
up the Idea of going to the Ball's Town. or Lebanon Springs, at
least for the present. I shall be happy to see you & Mr. Neime-
witz here. It is an easy days journey to come thro' Newark
& Hackensack to Dobbs's ferry & cross the North River oppo-
site to my house, provided you set out early in the morning
I have written to Ricketts to come with Mr. R. which I think
they will do, cannot you so arrange it as to come together?
Ricketts knows the Road.

Our family are all well. Mr. L. joins me in res-

pects to Mr. N. & Love to you to Peter.

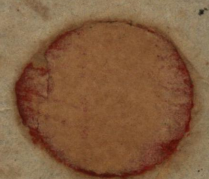
