Sunday night

He said he hoped to get back by Thanksgiving and wants me to go back with him for a couple of weeks. I don't know how on earth I'm going to do it but if there's any possible way I'm going to try to

Roy Beckett loaned Bernice a radio to use till the T.V. comes. She had to buy some batteries. We're enjoying it a lot. It helps at night when we get so lonesome.

Victor is here he came in just as I started this and I put it down. He hasn't gone yet and it's really bed time - almost ten o'clock.

Wylie & Minnie Lee have bought out Aren Langham. They are going to move up there & keep house the first of the year. Wylie works at the Bruce Mill. Lais is still with her folks. She has been working at the creamery.

Christine is proud of my little picture. I think it's about the just best one you've ever had made.

Did Chick tell you about our telephone conversation? I couldn't hear him so very well. Mr. Reid came over after me when the call came. Chick was real nice.

Mrs. Byars has been a lot worse. I don't think she will ever be any better. Pauline B. is doing fine since her operation.

We went with Chester & Celina to the circus at Bruce yesterday of course Sonny Boy enjoyed it but he was sick and so was I. It was about like all small circuses' are and you've never seen such a mob of folks. Did your sweaters get Martha? I thought they would never come. I had to get it like Christmas because I couldn't find any navy ones any where except Sears.
