Biographical information

Kenneth Lawrence Beaudoin was an American anthropologist and poet. Born in Elmiro, Michigan, on December 12, 1913, he graduated from West Tennessee State Teachers College in 1935, attended Louisiana State University from 1936 to 1937, Loyola (La.) in 1940, and the New School for Social Research from 1944 to 1946. His specialties were American anthropology and archeology, with special interest in the folk literature of American Indians and primitive literature, and he published several monographs including 4 Sioux myths and 2 Blackfoot legends, The Papago genesis and two other legends of origin, and The Warren mounds: A preliminary survey.

In the 20th century American mid-south, Beaudoin the poet was considered a father figure and mentor to a small Memphis literary community. His salons, held at his home near the Mississippi River, served as informal workshops for scores of under-appreciated local and regional poets. He and his mother Ruth, known by everyone as Bid, provided dinner, conversation and encouragement to many writers. His annual Gemstone Awards, open to poets of all abilities, attracted entries from established poets, school children, incarcerated prisoners and even enlisted soldiers. These awards combined two of Beaudoin's life-long passions—rock collecting and poetry. Though the annual prizes were tokens, correspondence from winners found in this collection reflects the recipients' excitement over these concrete "stamps" of approval for their efforts.

During his life, Beaudoin held a variety of jobs, including running an art gallery in New York City and working in a laundry, but his most rewarding work was as Chief Clerk in the criminal division of the Memphis Police Department. Though his long tenure with the police covers a period of some of the city's most turbulent history, his correspondence rarely reflects it. Beaudoin and his fellow poets and critics appear to exist in the protective bubble of a literary bliss. Their personal demons and struggles take center stage. In a 1995 interview in the Memphis newspaper, *The Commercial Appeal*, Beaudoin does acknowledge the value of his police work, "My police job kept me close to human beings in tense situations" and provided him with insight into human psychology that his work as a poet might not have. Beaudoin retired from his police job in 1980 due to blindness and he died in Memphis on March 19, 1995.

Beaudoin's poems were published in a variety of literary forms including books of collected poems, literary magazines, self-published tracts and mimeographed broadsides. Over 6000 of his poems were collected and published by Archangel Press in 1947 including hundreds of his experimental eye poems. Beaudoin lays claim to inventing the form in the 1940s. In 1949, Beaudoin also self published a history of his family, *The Family of Napoleon Beaudoin I of Cadillac Michigan; with a brief account of the Beaudoin family on the American Continent.*

The collection is housed in 12 boxes and includes Beaudoin's life-long correspondence and examples of his literary work and the works of others. Items not related to his poetry include copies of a Memphis Police Department report on the 1968 sanitation workers strike, the correspondence of Phil Stone of Duck Hill, Mississippi, and copies of a land deed search from Crittenden County, Arkansas.
