CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES,
House of Representatives, July 3, 1866.

Resolved by the House of Representatives, (the Senate concurring.) That the thanks of Congress be, and are hereby, tendered to the workingmen of Lyons, France, who have presented a silken flag prepared at their instance by the weavers' association of that city in memory of the late President Lincoln, and intended to be displayed at the ceremonies of Congress on the thirteenth of February last, and that the flag be deposited with the archives of the government in the State Department.
