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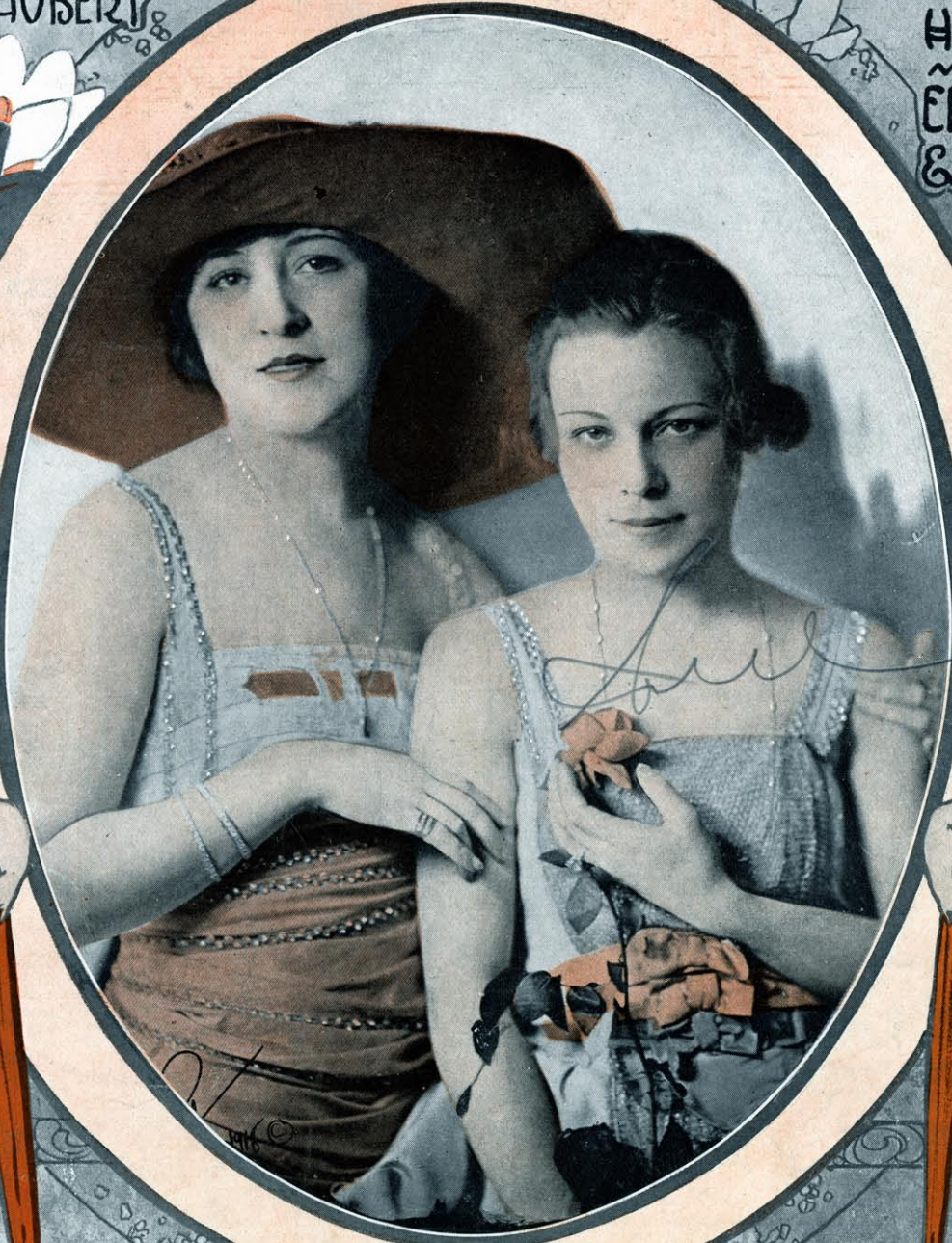

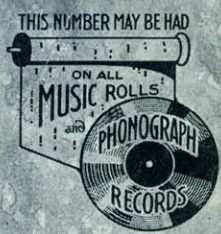

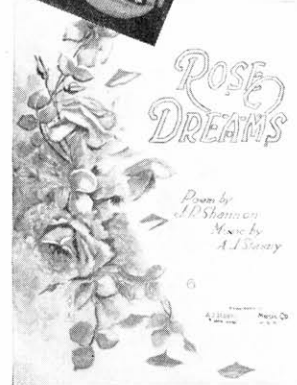

THESSE touching ballads go right to people's hearts. They bring a catch to the throat a smile to the lips. Folks love to sing them.

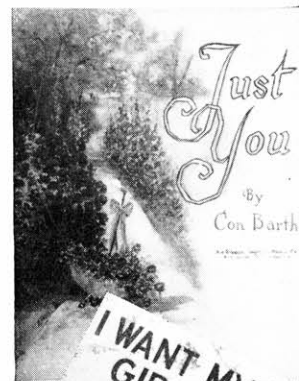
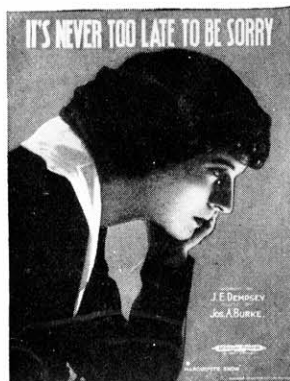
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EVERYBODY WANTS THEM
