Of course, the Metropolitan Police were aware of this situation at the time and were very helpful to me indeed. Lieutenant William Glassman, Precinct 8, was particularly helpful and, of course, is very familiar with the facts.

I want to have a full written report about this entire incident including just as much information as is available regarding the identity of this group, numbers involved, names and addresses, description of placards and writing thereon, the time the group arrived and the time the group left, along with any other pertinent information regarding this event.

It will be deeply appreciated if you will forward this written report to me, along with a copy of the report filed by the investigating officers.
