BACK TO THE FARM TO HELP HIS FATHER AND HAS BEEN THERE EVER SINCE. HE AND HIS CHARMING WIFE WERE MARRIED THAT SAME FALL. LATIMORE FORTENBERRY PARMED WITH HIS FATHER OFF AND ON FOR TEN YEARS.
