I might try to sell some of the cattle at that time. I could sell the hiefers for a real good piece if I had them here. I think everything is awful slow here with the common laborers. People keep coming here looking for jobs milking and the like. I resorers who have only a few dollars to pay have to work it out at one dollar a day. I think the portely houses are next to be built. The formal opening of the womens new quarters was yesterday and I think if it is fair weather for a while we will have some poutty houses before the first of the year. The hatchery and battery brooder building and the residence with lots of love to Seon Gene and nother. I hope the kids are getting along better. Dadbly.
