My A & Rice Dear mother

This has all in common health except
cathy she has bin complaining several
days tho I think not in any thing danger
Mrs Mara had another fit last
Wednesday I will soon be down my crop
tho I have had about chance as hit has
bin remaining a quite deal of the time since
tho I suppose I will make a fine chance
of shelling corn & will be needed for hit
except providentially hindered I was three
years sitting last Friday was 3 weeks
ago I was going to Atlanta ga to see
my son that was capt in Johnsons
army he was wounded 15th of May &
written to me to come & see him I got there
on Saturday morning & he died Friday
following I had another one sick in the
hospital at Montgomery Ala I stopt
to see him & then had to send him to

To Selma Ala I came back that
was or I should have come back by
Mobile & stoped one day so as to see
you they are all well as com mon at
the lower place the thread com to hand
& I told you to send the amount due
Mr. Olet New we will send hit home
this morning the cart is gone after the
lotter at this time I do not think I
have least much wheat or wood have
hit send all good chances when necessary
& capt well I can not say how much
there will be the hit is compell to be
a good deal I have the cows fed with
hail I find we are giving a fine chance
of milky the yanks are still trying to
make a road from Jackson there but we
drison back & the same way from
Memphes the Furrist is there necessary
for them & call for more help there is
a good minnow going to start from Astoria

This morning to his assistance I hope he
will be able to drive them as he has been
before & of wood be glad how many he
could drive to their long horn game wishes
you to send some copious & sum of the
extract of logwood so that she can be using
of hit we send you several things in
the vegetable line I can be able after
this time to send you all the rest of your
you wish as those will be plentifully filled
in awake my crop of corn looks well
I send you a bushel of butter
I give the hands 4 of best Saturday
the time will soon come when I can
spare time I much better than now
as the crop will be of on hand whittled
while
