Same is still spinning. he have nearly first yards spun. The rainy weather has that primition a from getting along with the farow work as well as we should have done he have about twenty acres planted in corn and more that is ready to plant: huber it sains I will plant our field of pear tomarow The grace is cominy up in the words and the calle are doiry well. Our Shup are all tooking well. They have tinter lamber he had fire or six Calus to die and the grown Cattle. Their hides will make is plents of Shows. I think we can get along with what Coin we have if the foramment docent impress it. The officer is now in Brookhaven with the order to impufs Cam + heat. I list for him very day. These has not her quite as much travel for a week or so as there has been. There men staid with us last night. The roads are still very bad. he news from the army since the fight at-Out Sudam.
