declared a BANKRUPT, and be discharged from his debts—and was, on the eighth
day of November _____ 1843, by the Decree of this Court, duly declared a BANKRUPT:

Now, at this day, To wit: On the twentieth day of February
1843, upon reading the said petition, with the Schedule and Inventory thereunto annexed,
together with the said Decree above mentioned, and due proof of the publication of notice of the
final hearing of the said petition; it appearing that the said Aaron Spell _____
has fully complied with the provisions of the act of Congress,
entitled "An Act to establish a uniform system of Bankruptcy throughout the United States,"
approved August 19, 1841—and is entitled to be discharged from his debts:

It is therefore Ordered, Adjudged, and Decreed, That the said
Aaron Spell _____ be, and he hereby is, by virtue
of the act aforesaid, fully and entirely discharged from all his debts.
