Dear Sir

Yours of 23rd ult. was duly recd by mail and its contents having been duly considered and submitted to Mr. Nathan. Under his instigation I proceed to reply. - That at no time has any indulgence or request been refused you hitherto, in consideration of the great blight that has befallen the crops the present season, and your exertions to do what is right, and my testimony in your behalf, he will accede to your propositions; and wait another year for you to close your indebtedness; -

and that you now having timely notice must put your shoulder to the wheel, and be prepared to close the business there without fail. - The original promise made you of conveying such of the property as you may be able to retain, in the manner you pointed out shall be carried into effect. - Meantime it is particularly requested that your crop be immediately given to market, forward as prices are about as favorable as we may reasonably anticipate. -
