My Dear Sir;--


Your inquiry of the 3rd inst. re. to the will of Judge W.L. Douglass is received and noted.

I would suggest that you address an inquiry to Mr. Geo. W. Kidd, of Beaumont was named as Executor of the will made under date of March 7th 1904, and should he call for this will it will be forthcoming and he can send you a copy. I learned several months ago that Judge Douglass made a subsequent will to this one, consequently I presumed this was null and void. However as Mr. Kidd of Beaumont and J. W. Lea of Houston were names as Executors the will should rightfully be turned over to them should they call on me for it.
