are you still in the notion  
of going off, or to stay at  
home, I think home  
is the place for me, I  
believe I can make more

else, when we get the Store  
in good head way so  
I can justify you. I will  
save a Clerkship for you  
there, we dont know yet  
where we will trade  
it or where but as soon  
as it is moved you  
shall have the first place  
I am preparing my self,  
to keep books of which I  
am making a good



Start, who are you  
jumping to now. Have  
you found a dory down  
there yet. but I believe the  
Girls all are about plaged  
out down about & by God  
you must write to me  
& tell me all the news  
& tell me how my  
girl is getting along.  
there is some daisy girls  
up here, & among one of

it, tell Pa & Ma to write  
to me, tell Eugy & Sonia  
to answer my letter quick.
