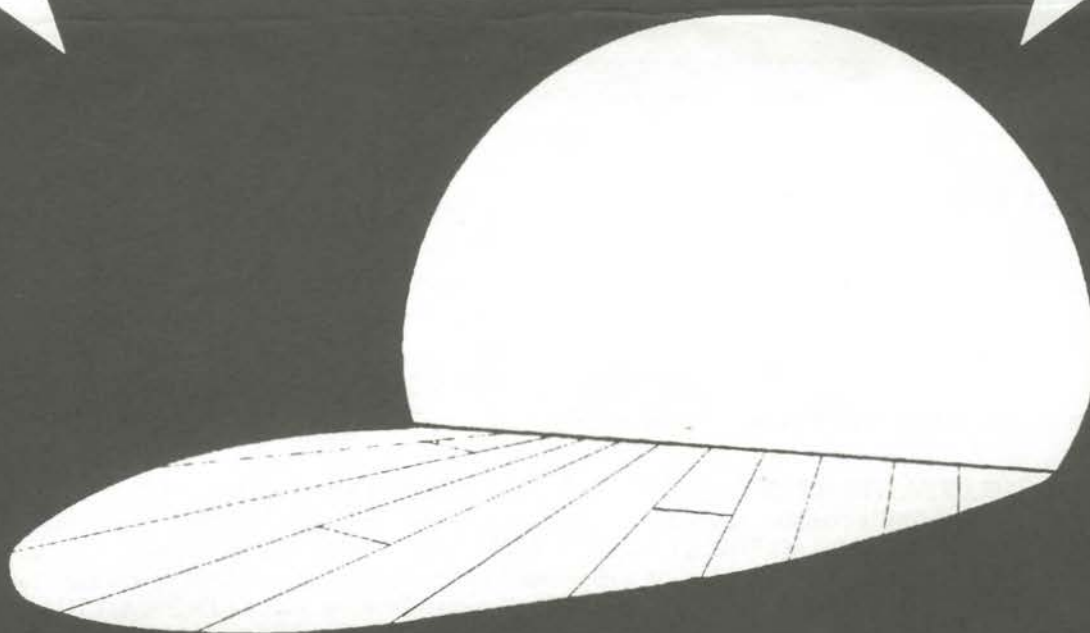

THE CREATIVE ARTS COMPLEX THEATER AND THE 1990-91 SEASON OF PLAYS

The 509-seat CAC Theater is finally complete and the Department of Communication has plans for a busy inaugural season beginning with this summer's production of I OUGHT TO BE IN PICTURES. The fall season will open with Sam Shepard's TRUE WEST, October 11-14 & 18-21. This production will be MSU's entry in the American College Theatre Festival. The Official Grand Opening of the new theater will be Nov. 7-10 & 15-17, when Thornton Wilder's THE MATCHMAKER will grace the boards. A surprise may be in store for early December. Details later. The first spring show will be produced February 21-24. At press time the show has not been decided but it will almost surely be a contemporary comedy. The second spring show will be Henrik Ibsen's THE MASTER BUILDER, playing April 18-21. Once again, two (or more) bills of student-directed one-act plays will close the season April 25-28. An addition to the dramatic arts program will be a new series of lunchtime staged-readings. On Fridays (Sept. 14, Oct. 26, Nov. 30, Jan. 18, Feb. 8, Mar. 8 and Apr. 5), new plays by regional playwrights will be given rehearsed staged-readings for the public in the Union Small Auditorium. Named the Brown Bag Theatre (audience members are encouraged to bring their lunches), this series of readings will allow us to screen exciting new work and (with your input) select one or two shows for full production in the following summer. All performances will begin at 12:15 p.m. and run through 1:30. This will allow time for the performance and for the audience members to comment on the play. Season ticket holders will be admitted free of charge and admission for everyone else will be 50 cents.

For information about season tickets and to receive the 1990-91 season brochure, please leave your name and address at the box office. We expect to have the brochures ready for mailing by August 15. Season tickets prices: If five shows: \$18 for adults, \$12 for senior citizens, \$6 for students. If six shows: \$20 for adults, \$14 for senior citizens, and \$8 for students.
