Great Education, Guaranteed

Today, people want a guarantee. They want to know that they are getting their money's worth and that they will succeed in any endeavor they attempt. Lindenwood's Education Department can make such a guarantee. Through the Teacher Preparation Guarantee, Lindenwood stands by all our education majors and graduating teachers, ensuring them that they will be able to succeed as a teacher.

The first guarantee goes to all current students. Every education student at Lindenwood University must pass the PRAXIS, a nationally recognized test for teachers covering content area, before they can be placed for student teaching. Lindenwood University will guarantee that the students will pass the test, the first time, or we will offer them the opportunity to take up to 18 credit hours of refresher coursework free.

Lindenwood's second guarantee is for all first-year teachers. Following their first year at a school, the education department will send a questionnaire to the principals of all the Lindenwood graduates. This questionnaire asks the principals to evaluate the teachers based on their performance. Any first-year teacher who receives a low rating or a teacher who asks for more help will be allowed to take up to one semester of appropriate coursework.

"This guarantee adds a whole new dimension to our department. We feel our students are top-notched and that they will be successful. It creates a benefit for both the student, as well as the school districts themselves," explains Dr. Richard Boyle, Dean of the Education Department. "What we are saying is that you may have graduated from Lindenwood University, but we are still there for you and will be throughout your career."

Putting Your Education to Work

Graduation can be a scary time for students. They are suddenly thrust out into the "real world" without a job and many times, with no prospects of one. Lindenwood University is working to change that for our graduates. Our Career Development Office assists students and alumni in setting up their resume, participating in mock interviews and searching for job opportunities. During the 2001-2002 academic year, the Career Development Office listed approximately 2,000 jobs,

assisted in creating over 550 resumes, provided testing services for approximately 375 students and offered individual counseling to about 200 students and alumni. More than fifty companies participated in last year's Career Fair. The next LU Career Fair will be on Wednesday April 16, 2003.

As the Career Development Office continues to grow, more and more students and alumni are seeking assistance. We need your help. Would you like to be a mentor for students? Boone Campus Expands

Lindenwood's Boone Campus, site of the Daniel Boone Home and Boonesfield Village, has taken possession of the Price-Loyles Collection, a one-of-a-kind assemblage of Boone family artifacts. The collection contains literally thousands of items that belonged to six generations of Boones in Missouri, starting with Daniel's son, Jesse Boone, and concluding with Ms. Forestyne

Loyles, a great-great-great-great-granddaughter of the famous American frontiersman.

Portions of the collection will be permanently housed in the Stake House, a restored 1850's home in Boonesfield Village; the remainder will be archived and preserved for use by students, scholars and visiting historians. A special interim exhibit of some of the objects will be on display at the Sappington-Dressel House in Boonesfield Village this fall, beginning on Pioneer Days, September 28 and 29.

James Gladwin, director of the Boone Campus, said, "Acquiring this collection is giant step toward meeting our goals at the

Boone campus. These objects will provide us with many tools to expand our mission to honor the Boone family's contribution to the development of Missouri, and to preserving and interpreting the lifestyles and cultures of the American frontier. We are really pleased that Lindenwood and the Boone Campus has been entrusted with these important historic objects."

ROTC: Not just another college course

On Tuesday, July 30, 2002, 2nd Lt. Eric Minor, a 1999 Lindenwood graduate in Criminal Justice, presented an American Flag to the Gateway Battalion of the Army ROTC, in a moving cere-


mony held at Lindenwood University. This flag was flown on the Fourth of July while Lt. Minor was stationed in Kandahar, Afghanistan during Operation Enduring Freedom.

"I just wanted to say thanks to the program and all it has given me," said Lt. Minor.

The Army ROTC program, which started in 1999 with a few cadets and a partnership with Washington University, has grown to 40 cadets in Lindenwood's program alone.

"The program gave me great leadership opportunities which helped me develop values, integrity and character," stated Lt. Minor.

After his graduation from Lindenwood, Lt. Minor attended Airborne school in Fort Benning, GA. He later graduated from military police school at Fort Leonard Wood and left for Afghanistan on April 1, 2002.

Pork: The other Tuition Payment

"I might not have been able to afford school without this idea," said Gina Kientzy, a 2002 graduate of Lindenwood University.

The idea Gina is talking about is bartering hogs in exchange for tuition to give farm family's the opportunity for a higher education. This unique idea was developed by Lindenwood President Dennis Spellmann as a way to help cash-strapped farm families still get the quality education they need to succeed in life.

"We want to make sure people have the chance to get an education in Missouri," said President Spellmann.

This story has garnered national attention, and the news has spread across the world. President Spellmann has done interviews with the Associated Press, local television, radio and newspapers, national radio stations, and was even broadcast across London on the BBC. This story was also recently featured on ABC Nightly News with Peter Jennings.

In his interviews, President Spellmann has stated that this idea for bartering goods in exchange for Tuition won't stop at hogs. He wants to expand the concept to other farm products, such as corn, soybeans, cattle or even wheat.

"We are feeding people in our cafeteria with these hogs," stated President Spellmann. "And it's not just hogs we are talking about. We'll barter cattle or soybeans, too."

Perhaps half a dozen students have gone through Lindenwood during the last couple of years by bartering hogs for tuition. The school is prepared to make arrangements for up to 50 students each school year to attend classes in exchange for pork.




