

Commencement Speaker Earle C. Traynham Dean of the College of Business Administration

Dr. Traynham is the Dean of the College of Business Administration and Professor of Economics at the University of North Florida. He was appointed dean in May, 1994. He has served on the faculty at UNF since 1973. Prior to becoming dean, Dr. Traynham served as Associate Dean and Director of Graduate Studies, and as Chairman of the Department of Economics and Geography. Dr. Traynham received his education at the University of South Carolina, where he earned a bachelor's degree in business administration, an MBA degree, and his Ph. D. in Economics.

During his tenure as dean, the College of Business Administration faculty planned a new business school building. Along with a \$5.3 million appropriation from the state for construction, approximately \$3 million was raised from the business community to provide technology and furnishing. The project, completed in 1996, was the most technologicallyadvanced business school building in the state of Florida. Since 1994, the College has also made significant strides to internationalize the curriculum and develop the international expertise of faculty and students. During this time, endowments to support faculty and students in the college have grown from less than \$3 million to more than \$12 million.

Dr. Traynham has authored many articles and several books in the areas of human capital analysis and labor relations.

He is a member of Beta Gamma Sigma, national honor society for business administration, and Phi Kappa Phi, national honor society.

He currently serves on the boards of directors of the Southern Business Administration Association, Enterprise North Florida, the Florida-Georgia Blood Alliance, and River Garden Foundation. He is a member of the Jacksonville Community Council, Inc., having chaired one study committee and served on several other study committees for JCCI. From 1983-93, Dr. Traynham served on the Private Industry Council of Jacksonville.

Dr. Traynham and his wife, Ann, have two sons, Britt (UNF, BA, '95), and Miles.

Danielle R. Curry, a Psychology major, understands well the importance of balancing academics and extracurricular activities. She has done it better than most. While maintaining an outstanding 3.72 GPA, Danielle has found time to contribute to a variety of on-campus organizations and deserving Jacksonville charities. She has improved the lives of many, while always serving as an ambassador of the University of North Florida. For this reason, the UNF National Alumni Association is proud to honor Danielle R. Curry as its Senior Service Award recipient for Summer 2000.

Danielle's enthusiasm to help others naturally stemmed from her passion for psychology. She learned that her efforts in the classroom could easily apply to her volunteerism in the community and her leadership on campus. For instance, while Danielle took the honors course "Care of the Soul," she discovered that several students were prejudiced toward other religious views. To open their minds, she organized opportunities for them to attend other religious services. Through an Honors "Service Learning" class, Danielle realized that the personal growth experienced with service is just as important as the benefits to others. She helped the homeless, cleaned cages at the Humane Society, and made friendly visits to nursing homes. Danielle also assisted in the development and implementation of Honors Love Day, a Valentine's Day event that taught at-risk kids the benefits of volunteering and the importance of hard work in school.

Danielle has been a leader in many campus organizations. She revived the UNF Golden Key Honor Society from near extinction with her active recruitment and strong leadership. Similarly, Danielle spearheaded a membership campaign for Psi Chi, the National Honor Society in Psychology. On a larger front, she established an annual social service fair to expose students to service agencies needing volunteers. This past March, Danielle helped implement a hugely successful psychology convention at UNF, designed to teach psychology students about the importance of conducting research and how they can do so on campus.

Outside of UNF, Danielle has likewise been a selfless leader. She volunteered at Hope and Help, an HIV/AIDS Service Organization; helped build homes for the needy through Habijax; assisted with the daily activities of developmentally disabled adolescents and adults; and taught students at the Jacksonville Zoo. When delivering food to AIDS patients who were too sick to leave their homes, Danielle befriended them. She made the effort to get to know the patients, many of whom had been abandoned by their families. Danielle was able to give them comfort when no one else would.

Danielle has found her UNF education to be invaluable. By virtue of UNF's enriching experience, she has grown into an effective leader, a charismatic teacher, a capable listener, and a talented academic. After graduation, Danielle will relocate to Atlanta where she plans on pursuing a career in community psychology.

TRADITIONS OF THE COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

Academic regalia date to European universities of the Middle Ages, when gowns and hoods were required for warmth in unheated buildings. Gowns were furlined adaptations of the priestly toga, and hoods were worn to protect the tonsured heads of the priests. The regalia now serve as a visible reminder of the historic antecedents of intellectual pursuits.

In American universities of the late 19th century, these medieval costumes were revived to lend color to academic functions. Efforts were made to establish a code that would set standards for academic dress. Gowns of masters and doctors are generally ankle length and closed in front. The master's gown has pointed sleeves that are slit at the elbows. The doctoral gown has wide lapels of velvet, either black or the color of the scholar's specialization. The sleeves are full and bellshaped, with three velvet chevrons, either black or colored like the lapels. Gowns normally are black, although some universities have designed their own in the colors of the institution.

The hood, which drapes over the back of the gown, carries the greatest symbolism of all components of the academic costume. Its length, width and colors denote the wearer's highest academic achievement and institution. The master's hood is pointed; the doctoral hood is bellshaped. The color of the border of the hood indicates the scholar's major field of study; the lining color or colors identifies the institution that conferred the wearer's degree. Hoods were originally trimmed in fur, but now have satin borders for masters' and velvet for doctors' hoods.

The customary head covering is the mortarboard, or Oxford cap, with a tassel on the left side. Persons who possess the doctorate wear a tassel of gold metallic threads. The soft, large beret, modeled after the cap of Cambridge University, also has been adopted by some institutions.

The medieval university was much concerned with rank and privilege, and academic robes made visible the social and academic distinctions of the wearers. These distinctions have largely disappeared, and robes now indicate specialization. The following colors are associated with the degrees frequently represented in academic processions:

THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH FLORIDA

The University of North Florida (UNF), one of ten institutions within the State University System, is a comprehensive urban university that offers degree programs at the bachelor's, master's, and doctorate levels. Established in 1965 as an upper division and professional graduate institution, the University began offering classes in 1972. Freshmen and sophomores were added to the student body in 1984. UNF's scenic campus is now nestled among 1300 acres which includes a nature and wildlife area with lakes and nature trails.

The University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (1866 Southern Lane, Decatur, Georgia 30033-4097: Telephone number 404-679-4501) to award the Baccalaureate, Masters, and Doctor of Education Degrees. Some professional associations offer further accreditation of specific programs. UNF programs in business administration, teacher education, computer science, music, nursing, electrical engineering, nutrition, sports medicine/athletic training, physical therapy and public administration have been accorded national accreditation.

As UNF grows, it is proud of maintaining a reputation for excellence which attracts a diverse group of highly qualified students. The Fall 1999 freshman class had a mean SAT score of 1125 (44% had 1150 or higher) and a grade point average of 3.5. Twenty-one percent of our freshmen have a 4.0 GPA or better. Thirty-four percent were in the top 10 percent of their graduating class. Minority students comprise 19% of the student body. International students make up nearly 5% of the mix: 558 students from 104 countries around the world. 60% of UNF students are women; the average student age is 26.5.

Academic programs are built on a strong foundation in the traditional arts and sciences. The University now has a student body of nearly 12,200 students enrolled in 47 undergraduate degree programs with 90 areas of concentration, 23 master's degree programs with 47 areas of concentration, and one doctoral degree. It has 400 faculty and more than 700 full-time and part-time staff. UNF now grants over 2,300 Bachelor's and Master's degrees each year through its Colleges of Arts and Sciences, Business Administration, Education and Human Services, Health, and Computing Sciences and Engineering.

UNF is dedicated to excellence in teaching, research, and public service. The University's faculty is committed to providing highquality instruction, with particular emphasis on undergraduate education. The faculty's publications and other creative activity demonstrate a determination to remain at the cutting edge of intellectual inquiry and practice in their respective disciplines. The University — through centers and institutes as well as traditional educational offerings and activities — is a major contributor to the community life of northeast Florida and, indeed, to the larger community.

Through the strong support of the University of North Florida Foundation Inc. and the generosity of both corporate leaders and dedicated citizens of Florida's First Coast region, UNF now has four Eminent Scholar Chairs: the Andrew A. Robinson Chair in Educational Policy and Economic Development, the Ira M. Koger Chair in American Music, the Prime F. Osborn Chair in Transportation, and the Paper Plastics Education Research Foundation Endowed Chair for Supply Chain Management. The UNF Foundation, funded by contributions, supports a wide range of UNF's activities on campus and in the community.
